## After years of non-use, Jos. Campau flagpoles come to life

The social fabric of Hamtramck is woven with threads of rich hues and colorful strands, braided together to create a vibrant heritage — more pronounced than in any other community in Michigan.

Last Saturday (June 15) local folks and visitors commemorated Hamtramck's kaleidoscopic heritage. Some 18 colorful flags were raised along Jos. Campau, from Caniff to Carpenter.

## Councilmember raises questions in handling voter applications

Did Councilmember Mohammed Hassan bend election law?

That's been the talk among political circles over the past week in an otherwise lackluster campaign season.

Here's the deal:

Last week Hassan submitted a stack of applications — 31 to be exact — for absentee

ballots filled out by him and signed off by would-be voters.

While it is OK for a candidate to help fill out the applications, it's considered suspicious, at least by the folks in the Secretary of State Election Bureau, if a candidate submits several absentee ballot applications at once.

According to a spokesman

from the Michigan Secretary of State Office, it could be a case of "soliciting" for votes, and it's also considered a felony if true.

The Review tried to reach Hassan several times but all calls went to his message service, which was not accepting any more messages because it was full.

According to the Secretary

of State spokesman, it is recommended that when local city clerks encounter such a situation, it's best to turn the matter over to the county prosecutor.

City Clerk Marie Kendziarski said she sent Hassan a letter telling him not to repeat this action. Acting City Manager Kyle Tertzag said the city at-

## City waits for Snyder's decision on EM

And now we wait.

A week ago, the city council unanimously agreed not to dispute Gov. Rick Snyder's reconfirmation that the city is in a financial crisis.

The council also remained consistent in requesting the governor appoint an emergency financial manager.

Now all that's needed for state intervention is for Snyder to agree to having an emergency manager take over.

He could, theoretically, reject that request and insist city officials take one of three other options. However, it is expected Snyder will go along with appointing an emergency manager.

The only thing city officials are waiting for now is when Snyder will make the appointment.

"The ball's in the state's court," is all Acting City Manager Kyle Tertzag could say at this point.

Snyder is under no deadline to reply to the city. And as it stands, the city is actually in no immediate financial crisis. It apparently has enough money coming in to pay bills for the next few months.

The only thing hanging over the city's head is a \$3.4 million budget deficit. For the past few months city officials were warning of imminent payless paydays for city employees but unexpected revenue streams helped stave off that crisis.

torney is looking into the matter.

According to Kendzierski, Hassan signed off on saying he assisted voters in filling out the applications. There is no wrongdoing in that part, according to the Secretary of State.

Hassan is seeking a second term on city council.

Kendzierski said that out of the 31 applications submitted by Hassan, five were disqualified: three because the applicants were non-residents, one because the would-be voter would not be of voting age by the time of the election and the other because the voter had moved but had not updated his new address with the city.

All of the other applications

will be accepted, Kendzierski said.

"You can't fault the voter," Kendzierski said of the possible wrongdoing on Hassan's part.

In other developments, did you know the Aug. 6 Primary Election is just seven weeks away?

Sheesh, time is flying by, considering that today (Friday, June 21) is the first day of summer.

Any unregistered voters out there must register to vote 30 days before the election, which would be no later than July 8.

Qualified voters must be US citizens, of course, and be a Hamtramck resident and be at least 18 years old by the time the election is held.

Also note that anyone who registers to vote will automatically be referred to the city's Income Tax Department to make sure he or she has been paying income taxes.

And yes, Hamtramck has an income tax for residents as well as non-residents. Residents must pay a 1 percent income tax while those who work here but don't live here are required to pay 1/2 of a percent of their total wages.

Signs, signs, signs. It never

stops. Every election year candidates complain that their lawn signs have been stolen. Let it be known that the first victim of this crime – yes, it is a theft crime – is none other than the president of The Review newspaper, John Ulaj, who is running for mayor.

Ulaj said that recently several signs were taken from a one-block stretch on Gallagher between Casmere and Commor.

However, the threat of pay-less paydays could rear back up if city officials refuse to take a loan based on anticipated property tax payments coming this summer.

At the last council meeting, the council decided to hold off on accepting what's called a TAN (tax anticipation note) loan because of some unexpected details imposed by state officials.

What's at heart of their concern is some costs of the loan and other conditions.

City officials still have time to sort that out, but if the loan is turned down, the possibility of city employees going without a paycheck

once again becomes more real.

If an emergency manager is appointed soon, the loan decision will no longer be in the hands of city officials because their authority on such matters will be suspended.

In the meantime, the beat goes on in city hall. At next Tuesday's regular council meeting the new fiscal year's budget will be up for a final vote. The budget boasts of an \$18,000 surplus.

Hamtramck's fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30.

## Library's Garden Club could use some extra 'green thumbs'

The ever-growing local gardening scene is very active this time of year: planting, weeding, watering and harvesting are all in full swing at many of the adopt-a-lot and community gardens.

If you are keen to heed the call of nature, but haven't yet found a garden to call home, the Hamtramck Library has just the raised bed for you.

The library currently has 10 active raised garden beds, constructed and filled five years ago by local gardener extraordinaire Tom Koch.

Thriving in the raised beds are swiss chard, lettuce, car-

rots, radish, asparagus, beets, a variety of herbs, strawberries and other edible plants.

There are additional raised beds that are not yet planted, and it's these plots that could use some local green thumbs (or toes) to step in and help.

Library IT employee Konrad Maziarz tends to the garden in his spare time, and has big plans that include restoring a water retention system that would feed an irrigation drip system, creating a composting site and filling those empty beds.

These goals are being made possible by the dona-

tion of materials and labor from community gardeners.

Maziarz also has the ingenious and original plan of starting a hops crop in the garden, as an outreach effort to local micro and craft beer brewers. How's that for motivation to get you in the garden?



## Sidewalk repairs means some trees will have to come down

Jan Gratkowski has lived on the corner of Casmere and

trees have to come down because they have lifted up dozens of sidewalks slabs,

many times that its insurance deductible is so high, it's to the point where the city has practically no insurance coverage at all.

Tertzag said past city planners didn't think things through and allowed trees that grew too big to be planted in the space between the curb and the sidewalk. That has resulted in slabs being lifted up by tree roots, and that is an accident waiting to happen for anyone walking or biking down sidewalks.

Moran for over 20 years, under the shade of a huge tree.

It survived the tornado of 1997 that swept through town and toppled about 500 trees.

But this 100-something-year-old tree won't survive this summer's sidewalk repair program.

It has a red "X" on it — meaning it's marked to be cut down. In fact, at the time this paper went to print, it might have already been removed.

"I think it's a shame they have to cut down all our trees," Gratkowski said.

The "they" Gratkowski referenced is the city, as in the city administration.

Acting City Attorney Kyle Tertzag said about 35 to 40 tall



which in turn have caused dozens and dozens of trip and fall lawsuits filed against the city.

So, the trees have to come down.

"It's a shame we have to do this," Tertzag said. "I'm very cognizant of the environmental impact of losing a decent amount of trees."

But his hands are tied. The city has been sued so

percent (down from an all time high of 92 percent in 1920).

Welcoming America/Welcoming Michigan promotes the creed: "I reach out my hand to welcome immigrants. I believe that immigrants bring new energy, new ideas, and a new commitment to a better life that benefits us all."

Among the donors for the flags and pole refurbishing were: The Franklin Electric Corporation, the Bosnian American Community, the Bosnian America Islamic Center, the Polish Art Center, the Armenian Community, the Bangladeshi Community, FRD Pharmacy, HS Investment LLC, Maine Street Restaurant, Marek Dudzinski, Falcon Foundry, Mostek Paint and Glass, Family Health Center Rehab — as well as a very generous anonymous donor.

Each major donor will have a plaque mounted at the base of the flagpole in recognition for their generosity. The HRC is still accepting donations for future maintenance of the poles.

Hello Hamtramck!

Let's start with some good news. General Motors is sponsoring a high school intern program this summer and the project they have chosen to work on is Veterans Park.

These youngsters will be cleaning up at the park, repairing the fence at the tennis court, moving and improving the playscape, removing unsightly graffiti and general clean-up of the area.

GM is going to be investing over \$7,000 plus the time and manpower to get this job done. I know everyone joins me in thanking GM for working with us on this very worthy project. Let's all show our Hamtramck Pride by keeping our parks clean!

We continue to get ready for the sidewalk replacement pro-

gram. This includes marking sidewalks that need to be replaced as well as trees that have caused sidewalks to heave up and create a safety hazard.

Tree removal has begun North of Caniff and the project is proceeding. We are also looking at finding suitable trees to fill in some of these spaces. We want to plant trees that will not cause sidewalks to break in the future so they will be more size appropriate for the location on the easement. Our goal is to plant at least one new tree for every tree that has to be removed.

We are also going to be soliciting bids for some road repairs. Our Act 51 funds (which come to us from the state gas tax) can only be used for roads, sidewalks, and other non-motorized pathways, so it does us no good sitting in the

bank when we have sidewalks and roads that are in desperate need of repair.

DPW Director Shaya is prioritizing the roads that need repair. This is a project that will likely take place in the later summer/early fall timeframe.

Finally, as a result of the trees that are being cut down, we are in possession of a large amount of wood chips. The stockpile is at Hamtown Farms. They are free for the taking by our residents only. If you need some wood chips for your landscaping, feel free to stop by and grab what you need.

Naturally, the City makes no guarantee about the quality or type of wood chips these are. They are available on a first come first served basis.

I'm Acting City Manager Kyle Tertzag and that's my two cents!
