

## City is in line to get major grant

A large chunk of the city's financial woes could be solved, thanks to a potential federal grant.

The city appears to be in the running for a federal grant that will cover the salary costs of the Fire Department for the next two years.

We're talking to the tune of \$800,000 to \$1.2 million.

William Diamond, the president of the Hamtramck firefighters' union, told city officials that there is a very good chance the city will qualify for the grant, which is being handed out by FEMA.

The grant, called SAFER (which stands for: Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response), is set up to help financially distressed cities offset their public safety costs.

Like those of a fire department.

The city council agreed to hire two consultants for \$7,000 to write the grant. The consultants have a proven track record. They wrote and won a SAFER grant awarded to Detroit.

"There's a 75-80 percent chance of getting this," Diamond told the city council at Tuesday's council meeting. "It's absolutely something that could save the city a ton of money for the next two years."

So, what's the catch? Not much other than the city has to promise not to layoff any firefighters for the next two years if it wins the grant.

## City vows to clean up southend blight

The city's not messing around.

This time the hired guns are coming out.

After years of threats and complaints, the city is sending out contractors to mow overgrown lawns and pick up debris.

And yes, probably the number one offender is the city itself, considering it owns many of the vacant lots in town.

Acting City Manager Nevrus Nazarko told the city council at Tuesday's council meeting that after he took a tour of

the southend, which is where most of the city's blight can be found, he decided to send out work crews to cut down the overgrowth.

Nazarko told The Review that "one way or another, hook or by crook" he is starting a clean-up program.

And guess who has to pay for it?

Property owners, which also includes the city for city-owned lots.

Nazarko said a number of property owners have already been issued violations and letters. Those properties, he

After four and a half years of operation – a fact that's hard to believe in itself – the family Pronko are shuttering Maria's Comida (at least, the physical restaurant) after the close of business on Saturday, Aug. 18, in favor of concentrating on the manufacture of their

salsas and other items.

Probably the Detroit area's only restaurant to successfully fuse Asian and Mexican cuisine, the multi-cultural Pronko family will keep the space open, daughter and part-owner Marie Pronko said, with the notion of also doing some catering, or hosting some private functions, if time permits.

The city is seeking a federal grant to offset the salary costs of firefighters for the next two years.

The grant will go a long way in reducing a projected \$3.5 million budget deficit that will come by this time next year if budgets savings and new revenue sources aren't found.

In the meantime, the firefighters' union is being asked to accept contract concessions to help bridge the deficit gap. Acting City Manager Nevrus Nazarko said he can't go into details about what the city is asking the firefighters to agree to, but he said generally it has to do with contributing more to their health insurance coverage.

Diamond said that firefighters are open to talking about concessions,

"I'm willing to make concessions because I want a job," he said.

## Controversial mural is defaced with splattering of paint

To some it is art, and to others it is an insult.

And now Hamtramck's most controversial mural is seriously trashed.

At some point on Monday, someone flung paint on part of a mural that is on a city-owned building at Jos. Campau and Goodson. The mural has been the center of debate for several weeks now, with some residents calling for its removal and others saying the city should keep it.

The mural depicts six cartoon characters carrying a coffin, which is apparently a statement on the death of street art. The mural was part of a larger city-wide art project that invited internationally-known street artists to create murals throughout town.

Only the Goodson street



on the grounds that its image of death is an insult to the city.

At Tuesday's city council meeting, he said that he knows of a tagger/tattoo artist who could "do something" with the mural.

"Something that resembles Hamtramck," he said.

Jason Friedmann, the city's Director of Community & Economic Development and the point person for the city in the mural project, said the defacement is a crime against city property.

"If anything, it made the building look worse," he said.

Friedmann said he and others are looking into whether the mural can be saved.

The person or people who sprayed paint on the mural also wrote an obscenity on the building wall, and what appears to be a name of a person. A trail of paint from the building led to an area under a stop sign at Goodson. At the foot of the sign was a plastic water bottle filled with paint that matched the paint splattered on the mural.

The paint also matched the color of the brick of the building.



said, will get attention beginning next week.

If owners don't clean up their act, literally, by next week, they will get billed for the work and all the time it took for inspectors to issue warning letters. That cost will be placed on their property taxes.

It's not going to be a \$20 or \$30 lawn cutting bill.

"It's going to be hefty," Nazarko said.

Try something like \$100 just to have your lawn cut.

However, as much of a tough guy as Nazarko may sound like, he said that if property owners call by next week to claim a financial hardship, things will be worked out.

And if you happen to have a bunch of large trash items on your property, Nazarko has a sweet deal for you. He is setting up a dumpster on Denton St., where residents can unload up to two yards worth of trash for free.

Anything over that will cost you \$25 – which is still a deal.

So why the rush?

"I want to clean the city up before the festival," he said, referring to the annual Labor Day Festival (which is indeed on for this year).

So, time is ticking.

City Councilmember Cathie Gordon also complained that the city-owned Veterans Memorial Park is overrun with weeds and in general is looking shabby.

We ran into Vennie Valentine at the park on Wednesday. She was at the "playground" next to the old ice skating rink with her three

grandsons, swinging on one of two swing sets.

The playground is filled with weeds, and wildflowers, at about two or three feet high.

ders for their product, currently marketed under the name Maria's House-Made Salsa.

Asked whether the presence of a number of other salsas already on the market is intimidating, including local Ferndale-based juggernaut Garden Fresh, Pronko seems more inspired than perturbed by the competition.

"We look at them as more of a role model than a competitor," Pronko said. "We have a different product, anyway. Theirs is fresh-refrigerated, ours is more of a specialty. We use fresh-peeled mango, corn cut right off the cob. That's why ours costs \$5.99 a jar. They've been around for 17 years, and that's great for them."

So, what products are out there right now, and what new ones might we be seeing soon?

"Well," Pronko said, "we currently have five salsas out at the moment: Mild, Roasted Habanero, Roasted Habanero with Mayo, Black Bean with Roasted Corn, and Smoked with Ghost Pepper. We've also got our Asian-inspired barbecue sauce.

"Within a year, we also hope to be producing our Honey-Lime Salad Dressing, as well as some soups, maybe. My dad (Executive Chef Alan Pronko) has all these recipes in his head. We'll experiment with more flavors for the salsas, too," she said.

"The closing of the restaurant will give us more time for research and development, that's for sure," she added.

As it stands now, they've only had Sundays and Mon-

days, when the restaurant is closed, for the production of their goods. They sell the salsas out of Eastern Market mainly, as well as a few other places (including Srodek's in Hamtramck), so they assuredly look to expand their availability in the future, as well.

And, they'll be revamping their labels, with the help of local graphic artist Ross Kurtis, Pronko said.

Another interesting potential use for the space is as an "incubator kitchen," wherein other would-be chefs and food makers can experiment with their own culinary ideas. Family friend Chef Tom, for example, can bottle his sauces there, Pronko noted.

So, for Marie, Chef Al, brother Fred, mom Angela, and their couple of other employees (who should be able to stay on, if they choose), there is indeed a change on the wind. But change is inevitable, and they sound more than ready for it.

For the rest of us, we'll miss the Mongolian Beef Tortilla Wraps, the Asian Flank Steak, the Garlic Chicken Noodles – and the fast, friendly delivery.

There was nothing else like it in town. Best wishes, folks.

# Labor Day Festival organizers scramble for financial backing

The Labor Day Festival party is on, but it's going to be smaller.

But in this case smaller just might, fingers crossed, mean better.

Festival organizers received tentative financial support from the city council at Tuesday's council meeting. The city is halfway committed to covering police patrol costs, which comprise the bulk of expenses. Last year the city spent \$24,000 on police service for the three-day festival.

Even that will likely change, with a combination of free help from the state police, Wayne County Sheriffs and a slight downsizing on the number of Hamtramck officers assigned to overtime duty.

Festival organizers Konrad Maziarz and Shannon Lowell said the physical length of the festival will be reduced to Caniff to Casmere, instead of having it extend several blocks longer north to Carpenter St.

That reduction in size will mean less patrol area for officers.

Another change will be reducing the size of the two

stages into something that will make the music experience more intimate, although still far bigger than a coffeehouse stage.

And there might be some creative financing from the city. Acting City Manager Nevrus Nazarko said the public library has a bit of a budget surplus, and if the stars align right, there could be some help there.

Maziarz said costs have already been cut by \$40,000. He said that it will take about \$25,000 to cover costs.

But if the weather misbehaves, Lowell said they need a "guardian angel, or a net."

So ... what does all this amount to?

There are five weeks before the Labor Day weekend. And the council is officially asking for one thing: A definitive bottom-line cost for police service and a concrete what-if plan if the festival falls short.

Privately, Maziarz and Lowell said they want to make this festival a city celebration of culture, good local music, eats, beer and fun.

Now, that sounds like Hamtramck.



## City Hall Insider ...

What is our City Council up to these days? We have the scoop and the highlights – as well as the lowlights – of the latest council meeting.

The city council met on July 24, and all councilmembers, except for Councilmember Mohammed Hassan, were present. The meeting ran for about an hour and a half.

Police Chief Max Garbarino presented the Police Officer of the Year award to two officers, one for the year 2010 and another 2011. The department had lapsed in giving out the award amid the absence of a permanent chief of police during the period.

Officer Brian Misiak was named Officer of the Year for 2010, and officer Richard Seely is Officer of the Year for 2011.

Konrad Maziarz and Shannon Lowell, who are organizing the upcoming Hamtramck Labor Day Festival, were invited to speak on the status of the event.

They said that this year's

festival will be smaller, and its budget has been slashed by \$40,000.

But, they said they need financial backing from the city for police service, and to cover potential losses in case of bad weather.

The council said they would look into finances, and asked the pair to come back at the next council meeting. In the meantime, the festival is scheduled to go on.

With no discussion, the council unanimously agreed to a new contract for city hall employees, who are members of ASCME Local 666 (yes, you read that right, 666. Make up your own joke.).

After the meeting, Acting City Manager Nazarko said a key concession agreed on is that new-hires will be paid \$1,400 less in their starting salary. New-hires will now come on board earning

\$32,000 a year. Nazarko said that the salary increase over the years will not amount to much more – about \$35,000 a year.

After a lengthy discussion, the council (with the exception of Councilmembers Abdul Algazali and Tom Jankowski) agreed to create a new position in the Police Department.

The new job entails having an officer enforce commercial vehicle codes, such as weight limits for trucks.

Police Chief Max Garbarino said the fines from the enforcement will at the very least pay for the position.

Acting City Manager Nazarko estimated that fines will amount to more than just the officer's salary. He said fines will bring in about \$250,000 a year.

Garbarino also said the position is more than about

money. He said that the new position will mean one more extra officer who is available in cases of an emergency.

"All we're doing is beefing up the department," Garbarino said.

The officer in this position, Garbarino said, will be stationed mostly along the Hamtramck portion of I-75.

After a short discussion, the council OK'd a site plan for an Islamic center at the former DTE Energy building on Jos. Campau at Holmes.

Councilmember Robert Zwolak cast the only vote in opposition. He said he's concerned there are a growing number of tax-exempt buildings on Jos. Campau.

"I see a diminishing tax base," he said.

## Re-elect Wojtowicz and support the Detroit Institute of Arts

In the Aug. 7 Primary Election, it should be noted that Hamtramck's own Raymond Wojtowicz is once again seeking re-election as Wayne County Treasurer.

It's probably a given that Wojtowicz needs no local endorsement since residents have overwhelmingly voted for him in the past. But it should be noted that Wojtowicz has won the support of voters for a reason: He works hard at his job.

He has also gone out of his way in recent years to make sure homeowners take all the necessary steps available to them to avoid a tax foreclosure.

Wojtowicz has compassion for people, and has offered help to make sure homeowners remain in their houses.

That's no easy task these days, with so many people facing economic hardship. These are truly historic times in this region, as well as in this country, and Wojtowicz has risen to the challenge.

We urge voters to support this cultural jewel and vote YES on the Wayne County Art Institute Authority Millage.

Another tax proposal is from the county, asking for a renewal of a jail tax for another 10 years.

The county is asking for a little less than \$1 per \$1,000 of a property's taxable value to help maintain jail facilities and build a training center for juvenile offenders.

This tax proposal might be coming at a bad time, considering the recent news reports of various county government scandals.

We are also concerned that the county is going to abandon the Hamtramck jail even though it's less than 20 years old. What kind of management is that?

We're going to bow out of an endorsement on this one, and let the chips fall where they may.

# Science Corner

## Women in science ...

Recently, Sally Ride – the first American woman in space – died after a long illness.

She flew aboard the space shuttle Challenger in 1983, and then took a second trip aboard the same shuttle a year later. She was curious, intelligent and involved in teaching young people the joy of science, math and technology, and she inspired young

women to consider a career in the sciences.

Besides Sally Ride, the American space agency has had many other notable female astronauts. Astronaut Barbara Morgan flew on the Space Shuttle Endeavour in 2007, for example. Civilian Christa McAuliffe, who was killed when the Space Shuttle Challenger blew up on January 1986, is also well known.

Historically, women have

had to struggle to succeed in the sciences. Over 100 years ago, there were few examples of women in science. Being a scientist was traditionally a role for men.

In some cultures, few girls even went to school at all. Even today, some girls are forbidden from attending school.

Also, professions such as medicine were open only to men. There were exceptions. Women in ancient Egypt worked as doctors, and the most famous woman scientist of ancient times was the Greek mathematician Hypatia.

In the Arabic stories called the Arabian Nights, we meet a slave girl named Tawaddud, who was able to outwit all the cleverest male doctors with her knowledge of medicine. Her story suggests that, in the East, too, women were skilled in medicine.

Few women worked in science before the 20th century. Those who did were usually from rich families. They could pay for an education. Marie-Anne Paulze (1750s) helped her husband, French chemist Antoine Lavoisier. Together they made the discovery of oxygen gas. Astronomer Caroline Herschel (1800s) worked alongside her brother William. Between 1786 and 1848, she discovered eight new comets.

Women scientists drew inspiration from pioneers such as Polish physicist Marie Curie. She discovered two new elements, later named

polonium and radium. These substances are radioactive. Little was known of the dangers of radiation at that time. She suffered painful burns

and died from her exposure to the harmful rays. As a result of her work, she became the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, in 1903.

There are many more women in science today, following the example of those such as Marie Curie.

Elizabeth Blackwell (1821-1910) was an example for all women scientists to follow. She was turned down by male-only American medical schools. Medicine was considered inappropriate for women, but she kept trying.

Male students finally voted her into Geneva College, New York, partly as a joke. In 1849, she graduated as a physician, and so became the first woman doctor in the United States. She later became a professor at the London School of Medicine for Women.

Virginia Apgar followed in her footsteps and also became a top physician. She

developed the Apgar test, which gives newborn babies a health check. This has saved many young lives.

These are a few of the many women who have made contributions in the field of science. With better education and equal job opportunities, more women in rich and poor countries are working in science. No matter what career you can think of, there are women of different cultures and religious points of view, succeeding in making people's lives better.

The idea that a science career is for men only is no

longer the view in the 21st century. A case in point is a TV advertisement by a popular computer company. The gist of the ad is that a fifth grade young girl wants to be an astronaut. She has to face various obstructions but, because of her persistence, she succeeds in learning to fly.

I'm sure that the point of this commercial is for you to buy their product. I look at this commercial and think: "Don't give up on your dreams."

• A man living in the 11600 block of Lumpkin reported that a woman named Rosette changed the address on his PNC card after he had lost it.

• A woman reported that, while on Caniff at Sobieski, a black male stole the gold chain off her neck.

• A woman living in the 2400 block of Whalen reported that someone broke into her home, stealing unspecified property while there.

In addition, police made the following other arrests during this time period: One for felony assault, two (sisters) for attempting to cash bad checks, one for (two) outstanding warrants, and two for possession of narcotics paraphernalia (one, a juvenile), as well as holding two juveniles for curfew violations; also, the following arrests during traffic stops: two for driving on suspended licenses (one, including also presenting fraudulent insurance), one for possession of heroin, and one where a woman was arrested for possession of narcotics paraphernalia, while a man who had been in the car with her successfully ran away from officers.

Officers investigated four car accidents, including a rollover that occurred in the alley east of Jos. Campau at Trowbridge; as well as investigating a suspicious vehicle; they were notified by Wayne County of an arrest made by them on a Hamtramck warrant, as well as by Eastpointe Police for same.

They took the following reports: the theft of a cell phone, the return of several bad checks written to a party store/check cashing place, a person who tried to

cash a bad check who fled, someone who gave another man his ID, who was then arrested; a case of fraudulent activity on a personal savings account, the receipt

of a bad check from another known party, an assault by a boyfriend, a home invasion by an ex-boyfriend, and by an estranged husband; five cases of harassing phone calls: two by known parties, one by an unknown party, and two unspecified, as well as a case of harassment by letter; and three

runaway minors, two who were a couple that were banned from dating, and who later both came home.

Finally, they notified the head of the DPW about a water main break on Sobieski, and a problem with ants in one of the jail cells, and they took safe possession of a found bicycle.
