

Former city manager's allegations not backed up with investigations

In her farewell speech to a state-appointed financial advisory board, former City Manager Katrina Powell made a serious allegation. According to Powell there is rampant election fraud and drug dealing happening in the city. Those allegations were made during her farewell speech at the June Receivership Transition Advisory Board meeting. Powell's employment contract was not renewed by the city council, and she left the city leaving some harsh remarks. She said: "The election fraud and drug dealing are real in this town." Powell did not accuse any specific person or elected official but went on to claim that there are those who are "providing

meals, buying TVs, paying someone \$5 in cash to fill out an absentee ballot..." She also accused, without naming any elected officials specifically, of "taking bribes from votes

on contracts and services is illegal and should not be tolerated by this community." Powell's assertion of election fraud is not without foundation.

There have been incidents in the past several years, before Powell arrived, of people illegally handling absentee ballots. They were prosecuted and

Election could be historical

Hamtramck voters will head to the polls this coming Tuesday, Aug. 8. This election could prove to be a game-changer for local offices. Mayor Karen Majewski is seeking a fourth term, but is facing three challengers: Mohammed Hassan, Asm "Kamal" Rahman and Cathie Gordon. Hassan is currently a city councilmember, and Gordon is a former councilmember. The top two finishers in the election will square off in the November General Election. In the city council race, two incumbents are seeking re-election: Andrea Karpinski and Ian Perrotta. There is a third seat open since Councilmember Hassan has opted to seek the mayor's job instead of asking voters for another term on council. There are eight challengers in the city council race. The top six finishers will also move on to the November election. The challengers include: Saiida Miah, Gias Talukder, Mohammed Al-Somirir, Akil Al-Halemi, Nayeem Choudhury, Fadel Almar-soumi, Monzurul Karim and Showkat Choudhury. Showkat Chowdhury is currently a member of the Hamtramck School Board. Saiida Miah is the




City of Hamtramck Notice of Ordinance Amendment

Public Hearings were held at the Regular City Council Meetings on May 23 and June 13, 2017 at 7 p.m. in the Second Floor City Council Chambers for the purpose of hearing public comments on changes to the following Ordinance. The changes were adopted by unanimous vote on June 13, 2017. Summary is as follows. Full text of the Ordinance is available at the City Clerk's Office at Hamtramck City Hall, 3401 Evaline Street, Hamtramck, MI 48212.

Ordinance 2017-04 Amending the Plan Commission Ordinance

An Ordinance to amend the Hamtramck Zoning Ordinance 497, Article III, Sections 4.01 through 4.07, to establish the City Plan Commission, their duties and responsibilities, and the administration of the Zoning Ordinance by controlling the design, location, use, or occupancy of all buildings and structures within the City of Hamtramck through regulated and orderly development of land and land uses and to promote economic stability and aesthetic design in as much as it safeguards the public health, safety, and welfare.

convicted.

To this day there is a belief among some city and elected officials that there is ongoing illegal handling of absentee ballots.

Powell's allegations begged the question of whether she ordered any current investigation into election fraud and drug dealing. Powell did not elaborate on her charge of drug dealing.

City officials told The Review they were unaware of any investigation.

"To my knowledge there has been no specific investigation into alleged drug dealing per the former city manager's comments," said Acting City Manager Kathy Angerer.

"As always the Hamtramck Police Department takes appropriate action on crimes within our city, including drug dealing.

"The city clerk is responsible for the conduct of the annual election, including processing ballots and all aspects of the election. At any time he would suspect an issue of election fraud, it would be his responsibility to contact the appropriate authorities and work with them."

While Angerer said she was unaware of an investigation, she said if one was underway the Police Department "would likely not make comment on the investigation, so as not to hinder the progress of that

investigation. When it is appropriate to do so, we would provide comment."

Powell said the only way corruption will end is when residents speak out.

"It all ends when the community stops sitting on its couches, posting on Facebook, and actually gets involved in their local government," she said.

"I encourage you to reach out to your Bengali, Yemeni, and other immigrant neighbors, as they too are sick of the corruption and voter fraud. They visit my office regularly to report things to me because they feel safe, but are afraid to speak up in their communities because of the bullies and thugs.

"They may not feel comfortable enough to come to a council meeting alone if they've not been to one, so please offer to attend one with them.

"Also, many are unaware of the laws that protect them, but we need to teach them that they don't have to be bullied or intimidated. There are laws in place to protect them. They have a pulse on the community; tap into it."

The RTAB, which was appointed by the state to oversee all financial decisions of the city, did not respond to Powell's comments.

City Councilmember Anam Miah, who was an

outspoken critic of Powell, said the accusations were more about spite over her not being kept on as city manager.

"She's a completely vindictive individual," Miah said.

Miah and others on the city council complained

that Powell kept the council out of the decision-making process. He said there was nothing "personal" about his decision to reject an extension of her employment contract.

"I wish her the best, but she just wasn't a good fit here," Miah said.

We urge voters to do their homework on who's running. While the Primary Election is not the final vote on who will lead the city, it is a critical one because it will reduce the number of candidates for the General Election.

unfamiliar companies when the city should be overseeing these repairs.

daughter of current Councilmember Anam Miah

This election could conceivably see all of the incumbents tossed out of office.

Majewski, Karpinski and Gordon are the last vestige of the Polish-American majority that dominated Hamtramck politics for nearly 100 years.

The challengers are mostly Bengali- and Yemeni-Americans who now make up the majority

population of the city.

The only issue on the Aug. 8 ballot will be the Hamtramck election. If past elections are a guide, that will likely mean a light voter turnout.

Some of the candidates have been getting voters to vote by absentee ballot. There are about 1,200 absentee ballots that have been sent out, and out of those so far over 600 have been returned.

It is legal for candidates

and others to hand out applications for absentee ballots, but it is illegal for anyone but the voter to fill out a ballot. Also, only voters and their family members can handle their ballot and return them to the City Clerk's Office, which also includes taking ballots to a mailbox.

In the past few years there have been several incidents where people have been convicted of illegally handling absentee ballots.

It's batter up time to submit bids on baseball stadium project

The first step toward renovating Hamtramck's historic baseball stadium is underway.

The city is now seeking bids from people and companies that specialize in historic preservation.

More specifically, the city is seeking:

"... proposals from an experienced and qualified historic preservation planning and design team to provide pre-development planning and design services for Hamtramck Stadium, located in Veterans Memorial Park. The pre-development planning will focus on assessing the condition and integrity of the historic Stadium and develop a plan for its reuse.

"The scope of work will consist of a Historic Structures Report (HSR) for the Stadium and grounds, a cost estimate for completing the work outlined in the HSR, and a complete set of architectural drawings and specifications for the rehabilitation of the Stadium and grounds."

There is more information available on the city's website.

Bids must be submitted no later than Aug. 18.

Funding for the study comes from a \$50,000 grant from the National Park Service.

The stadium was built in the 1930s and was home to the Detroit Stars, which was part of the Negro Baseball League.

That was back in the day when African-Ameri-

cans were barred from playing in Major League teams.

Legendary players such as Satchel Paige and Turkey Stearnes played here. Ty Cobb of the Tigers even threw out a pitch at the stadium. There is a photo of this at the Hamtramck Historical Museum.

The stadium was used by high school teams until about the 1980s when it was abandoned. Its historical significance was not known until recently.

According to a press release from the city:

"The stadium is a significant heritage site associated with segregated sporting and African American Civil Rights in the twentieth century. It is one of very few remaining Negro League era baseball stadiums in the country.

"Hamtramck Stadium was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on July 31, 2012 and a Michigan Historic Marker was installed in 2014."

There is now a volunteer group of preservationists, Friends of Historic Hamtramck Stadium, working to raise money to renovate the stadium and its grounds.

The plan is to not only bring back baseball, but also turn the site into a multi-purpose facility. That includes having public events hosted there and other sport activities, such as cricket and soccer.

School's out, but not entirely for these students

While many high school students are relaxing their way through summer vacation, a handful of them are getting their first taste of the work world.

This is the fifth year General Motors has partnered with the city and public school district to offer a 10-week paid internship program to a lucky 10 students. Some 68 students applied.

comfort zone."

Namely, the students have to find ways to work together. The effort pays off in many ways.

"Now, I'm more comfortable with others and speaking in front of others," said Dezrae Davis, who is also going into

12th grade. "We're getting more leadership skills and taking more risks."

Overseeing the students are GM retirees. Amber Patterson is one of the retirees who also happens to know Hamtramck well. She graduated from HHS in 1966.

In a way, she has returned full circle. The experience of being with the students and mentoring them, she said, is heartwarming in many ways.

"It's like the old adage of giving back, but also being home," she said.

But Hamtramck's student population has changed greatly since Patterson attended school here. Back in her day, the city was mostly Polish-American. Today, it's much more diverse.

"I'm learning so much," Patterson said.

a car to get here.

One big takeaway from this weekend experience on two perfect July evenings was how welcoming Hamtramck has become. Hospitality is the city's greatest asset, and in aggregate, its largest employer.

Food, drink, football; art, music, theater; multiculturalism and diversity; affordability, walkability and street life: all are magnets for people seeking urban adventure, day and night. It's all part of the new Hamtramck economy, and it's humming,

understated and modest, on multiple fronts. If you have a good idea you can convert it to action and make it work here.

It's no surprise that Detroit City Football is a smash hit in Hamtramck. The city was built for public life, for strangers to meet and become friends; or, more probably, enjoy each other's company for a night and never see each other again. Chance meetings and accidental discoveries are the law of the land within these two square miles of city life.

Detroit City won both nights and earned a spot in this weekend's national championship semifinal, also at Keyworth. There will be thousands of fans on the streets this Saturday night. People get ready.

Another takeaway from the weekend: walking to Keyworth each evening, as the sun streamed light above the rooftops as I gazed up toward the western horizon, I began to meander with my camera through some alleys on either side of Holbrook.

These are portals to my

own past, through which I would walk, run or ride my bike. I retrace many of those steps every day as part of my journey of self discovery, which I have turned into a documentary art practice of sorts.

What struck me this time was the sight of massive, healthy trees that I had previously overlooked. Trees that have been in back and front yards my entire lifetime, many planted well before I was born. These are the green giants of the city, throwing shade on houses, streets, alleys and yards.

I recommend walking east from Gallagher between Doremus and Com-

stock. There are some beautiful trees visible from the alley, all on private property. On the corner of Comstock and Gallagher are two of the largest trees in all of Hamtramck, looming over the sidewalk, but in the ground behind fences or in front yards.

There has been discussion of loss of green cover in the city for years, in particular the often careless and mindless practice cutting of trees that were planted on that strip of public land just off the curb. Yes, they were probably the wrong trees for urban plantings; and yes, their roots have wrecked a number of sidewalks all over the city.

But more talk between

people who live here now and city government needs to take place to come up with sensible strategies for cutting and growing some of our most beautiful and life-affirming assets.

At the same time, ponder this existential thought, homeowners: plant one in your backyard or in front of your house. Consider what will be in 100 years, and what you did to make city life better for all who come after we are gone.
