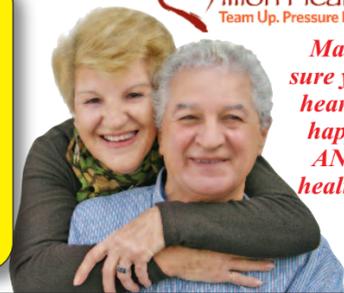



Hamtramck's empty spaces continue to attract development projects

Hamtramck's comeback is on a roll. Several weeks ago a developer announced a major project that will transform empty lots on Caniff into a combination of offices and lofts. And now, Dr. Sami Bilani is rolling out his plan to build five townhouses on a parking lot attached to his dental office on Brombach near Florian. He recently presented his project to the Zoning Board of Appeals, which was asked to waive several building requirements. At the meeting, Bilani, who is a native of Lebanon who graduated from New York University as a dentist, gave a background on why he wants to build in Hamtramck. You can thank his two sons. Bilani, who has been practicing in Hamtramck

for 25 years, told the ZBA that his sons convinced him to move from Birmingham to Hamtramck, where he now lives, because of the Detroit revival. "They said no one wants to live in the suburbs," Bilani said. So, he converted the upstairs of the building that houses his dental office, a former funeral home, and renovated it into his new living quarters and moved in. Next to the building is a parking lot that was once needed when the funeral home was in operation but now sits unused. It's an odd pie-shaped configuration, which was one of the reasons he needed the ZBA to allow this non-conforming space to be converted into townhouses. While the ZBA signed off on most of the re-

Hamtramck's Historical Museum highlights a number of improvements

No one is sure when the lights were last switched on. But it might have been 30 years ago. But they were on again last Thursday at the building that now houses the Hamtramck Historical Museum. Until the building was donated to be used as the city's museum, it sat empty and unused for decades. The occasion on Thursday was a reception held at the museum. More than 30 people attended the event, which had multiple goals. One was to show donors who have contributed to the museum how their donations were being put to use. Another was to thank those who contributed or volunteered to help make the museum a reality. But the main goal was to show that real progress is being made as the building is renovated and converted into a true museum. The lights were

On the election trail

As usual, every election has its moments and interesting tidbits. Last Tuesday's General Election was no exception. Let's start off with Mayor Karen Majewski's whopping win with 61 percent of the vote total. It begged the question: When was the last time a Hamtramck mayor won by such a large margin? Majewski has been squeaking by, relatively speaking, since running. She isn't alone in this category. We can go back to her predecessor, Tom Jankowski, who beat the then-incumbent, Gary Zych, by a small margin. Majewski, in turn, beat Jankowski at a later date by a small margin. Zych kept winning, when terms for the mayor were only two years, by the tiniest of tiny margins – sometime by a mere handful of votes. Those contentious elections usually ended up in recounts, which never changed the results in any significant way. We would have to go back to the days of Mayor Robert Kozaren – who for many years rarely faced a serious challenger – to see such a significant victory. In his prime, he would slaughter his rival by a vote margin of at least 90 percent if not more. Kozaren is still the longest serving mayor in the city's history, serving for 18 years. But near the end of his political

Metro news ...

It's said that whatever happens to Detroit, so goes Hamtramck. Our friends over at modeld-media.com have been reporting on fascinating development projects for the past several years.

With their permission, here is an edited version of this week's story:

Former Hamtramck Economic Development Director and City Manager Erik Tungate has been making a name for himself since leaving here and becoming city manager for Oak Park.

Under his management, the city has erased a \$2 million deficit and has seen economic revitalization. Read on to see how he

did it.

Significant changes in the city began in 2011 when Marian McClellan was elected as the city's first new mayor in 22 years. City manager Erik Tungate, whose background at that point consisted primarily of working for economic development organizations including the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, was appointed to eliminate the \$2 million budget deficit the city was facing at the time.

Tungate immediately set about encouraging all departments to cut wasteful spending. He offers examples of cuts ranging from saving

\$10,000 a year by getting rid of a dysfunctional postage machine to saving "a couple million" by switching from a fully funded employee health-care system to a pay-as-you-go self-funded system. The city is also about to enter into an agreement with Ferndale, Royal Oak, and Madison Heights to create a public doctor's office for their employees.

Today, Oak Park's financial outlook is healthy.

The new administration brought other pivotal staffing developments with it. Public safety director Steve Cooper, hired in 2012, last year



was named Police Administrator of the Year by the Police Officer Association of Michigan. In 2014 the city also hired its first community and economic development director, Kimberly Marone.

"I really think we've got one of the most dynamic management teams of any local unit of government in the state, and I'm not just saying that," Tungate says. "We've got a wonderful group of people that guide this city and point it in the right direction."

New policies

Beyond orchestrating Oak Park's financial turnaround, the city's new administration has implemented a variety of game-changing policies. Some are simple but innovative takes on public outreach, such as the public safety department's ice cream truck, from which police officers serve free ice cream to city kids during the summer.

The city has also worked hard to attract new development. In 2015 it approved a \$30

million development project, the largest in the city's history, for a 300,000-square-foot shipping facility on Greenfield Road north of Eight Mile Road. The facility is now occupied by FedEx.

The city also has two affordable, "missing middle"-style housing developments in the pipeline, with Jefferson Oaks currently under construction and Coolidge Place set to begin construction next year.

Some policy changes have attracted controversy, like the debate over Oak Park's decades-long ban on alcohol sales in restaurants. City officials legalized beer and wine sales in restaurants in 2013, and McClellan and Tungate both campaigned for a successful ballot measure allowing liquor sales in 2015.

The city has since issued three Class C liquor licenses, most recently to Union Joints, the restaurant group that operates metro Detroit hotspots including Vinsetta Garage and the Clarkston Union.

Union Joints is currently in the process of renovating the Albert Kahn-designed former WWJ transmitter building, on Eight Mile Road east of Coolidge Road, as a new restaurant. Union Joints co-owner Curt Catallo says he was attracted by the building's "awesome presence" and Oak Park's convenient location between Detroit and numerous suburbs, as well as by the support he felt for this project.

"We think Oak Park is on the right track with or without us," he says. "We're just glad to play a part. That stretch of Eight Mile is so unique. It's in the heart of everything and yet there's plenty of breathing room. It's just rare to find somewhere like that, let alone in the center of a bustling metropolis."

highly symbolic. When the Friends of Historical Hamtramck acquired the museum building in 2013 the upper floor of the building had nearly no heat, no electricity, no lighting fixtures or electrical outlets and the roof leaked badly.

In recent months volunteers from the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers have been volunteering their time and considerable skills installing new wiring and electrical fixtures to the upstairs. Twenty-seven LED lighting units were donated by Caniff Electric and all are now functioning in place.

It was a historic moment when the switches were flipped on and the huge upper floor was bathed in light. For decades that had been little more than a vast dark cave. Now, with the lights and a new furnace the space is a functioning archival area.

And that’s only part of the story. New furnaces also have been installed on the main floor and in the basement. Track lights, pendant lights, and ceiling fans are now working and progress is being made on the 147-foot mural painting “Coming to Hamtramck” by artist Dennis Orłowski, which focuses on the immigrants who built Hamtramck.

Mayor Karen Majewski spoke at the event. A professional historian, she noted how important it is to preserve Hamtramck’s rich history. Members of the city council and Hamtramck School Board also attended so all would get an understanding of the progress made on the museum and what has been planned for the future.

A PowerPoint presentation on the renovations was also shown.

It was an evening to shine, literally, as all the lights, inside and out, were on. You can see for


