# Happy Easter

**In time of trouble, Easter reminds us of the power of faith**

As I write this article the youngest of my six children is missing. Last night my 15-year-old daughter decided to leave home with a young man and we have no way of communicating with her.

Our family has been in anguish and tears crying out to God to bring her home. Our hearts are broken.

As a pastor and one who weekly preaches the Word of God it is time for me to practice what I preach, cling to His promises, and trust that His way is best ... always.

Trust can be difficult. Trust does not come easily. Trusting God requires us to put

our confidence and our hope in Someone we cannot see. Trusting God requires us wait for God to work, and then believe that His outcome is the best outcome.

As Christians our faith rises and falls on the Word of God. If God's Word, the Bible, is not true, then our faith is worthless. So, as our family struggles to cope with a missing child, we are praying for God to strengthen our faith in the promises of His Word.

One such promise is this: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Ro-

## Easter still is a powerful presence

Jesus Christ, it's the Easter Bunny.

Strange how something so sacred shares the season with something so silly. Yet they coexist peacefully and have for about as long as anyone can remember.

These days, Hamtramck is much more diverse than it used to be and Easter isn't quite the citywide special day it once was. But it still is a powerful presence, whether we're talking about the resurrection of Christ or chocolate eggs.

Pick a random year from the past – say 1949. Easter then was even a curious mix of holiness and hoey. The Citizen newspaper, Hamtramck's longtime weekly newspaper predating The Review, kicked off the Easter season with a clever Egg Coloring Contest.

This featured nine drawings spread across two pages of the paper, each drawing sponsored by a local store, such as Jeanette's Book shop, and Jo-Anne's Flowers. Kids were invited to color the drawings – all based on fairy tale characters – and deposit them at the sponsoring stores.

The winner of the contest received a \$25 U.S. Savings Bond. (Dolores Kolakowski, 13, of Jacob Street got the prize for her rendition of Little Bo Peep. Her picture was placed on the front page of the next edition of The Citizen, right next to an article entitled "Tre-Ore Hush to be Observed by City Friday.")

Tre-Ore was the flip side

of Easter, as every Christian would — or should — know. Tre-Ore is the three-hour span from noon to 3 p.m. on Good Friday commemorating the time Christ spent on the cross before he died.

And it was a big deal across Hamtramck, which had a large Catholic population and virtually shut down during those three hours.

“Mayor Stephen S. Skrzycki requested that all merchants and businessmen of our city to ob-

serve the regular custom of closing their offices and places of business between twelve o'clock noon and three o'clock in the afternoon, in order to give their employees the opportunity to observe in a fitting manner the day designated by the Church calendar as Good Friday,” The Citizen reported.

Seemingly everyone complied, and there was no mention at that time about a separation of church and state. It just seemed like the natural

thing to do.

Easter was a big time for stores as well. Florian Greenhouse proclaimed in an ad “We deliver Easter Sunday.” Shapiro Brothers shoes stated in their ad, “Easter greetings and a true hope that this most glorious day will be one of joy and renewed faith in the future — for you and yours.”

And, naturally, the Kowalski Sausage Company promoted its Easter hams and kielbasa on sale at a variety of stores across the metro area.

Lendzon's, one of the popular dime stores, had everything from Easter bonnets for the kids (\$1 to \$1.95) to Easter egg dye (10 cents). The dye was put to good use. Usually on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter, the kids would gather in the kitchen to dip boiled eggs into bowls of water tinted with the dye. The results could be psychedelic.

Of course dja-dja (grandpa) would prefer to dip the eggs into the more traditional boiled onion peels which colored them a golden brown.

They would be placed in a basket, along with a butter lamb, kielbasa, horseradish, bread and whatever else that could fit in and taken to church

for the traditional blessing.

In a way that was the first sign of spring. Holy Saturday always seemed to be a bright and sunny day that might be cool but would nevertheless seem fresh and new. That would be reinforced the next day — Easter Sunday — when you made the trip to church again.

Christmas — which by the way had its own seasonal bunny, aka, Santa Claus — is special for celebrating the birth of Christ. But Easter is even more meaningful. It is a symbol of rebirth and feels fresh and new.

Indeed Easter is the most sacred Christian holiday as it represents renewal, the triumph of life over death.

It is meant as a day of joy.



### Historic baseball stadium is on its way for a new era

The future of Hamtramck's historic baseball stadium seems to be shaping up well.

The city has taken extra steps to reach out to the community in order to make sure the site will serve all community interests. And by teaming up with the public school district, it looks like Hamtramck has a good chance of winning a sizable grant to bring the stadium and its grounds back to life.

This is no ordinary baseball stadium. It was built for the Detroit Stars in the 1930s, a team that was part of the Negro National Baseball League. This was shameful period when African-Americans were barred from playing with their white counter-

parts in Major League Baseball.

That color barrier has long been lifted, but the scars of that era can still be felt.

City and school officials are to be commended for forming this historic partnership, and hopefully it will be a union that continues to work on many other projects and challenges.

The city and school district hosted an open house last December to find out what folks want to see offered at the stadium site. It looks like there will be plenty of space for all interests, which will include not only baseball but cricket and soccer fields as well.

It is also hoped that concerts and other live

entertainment activities will be hosted here there.

The grant everyone is hoping for would come from the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation. What we're talking about is possibly millions of dollars coming our way.

If this development goes through – and we truly believe it will – Hamtramck is going to be transformed.

The site will become a cultural treasure that will attract thousands of visitors to the city. Considering that the Detroit City Football Club already does that at nearby Keyworth Stadium, Hamtramck is about to take a giant leap forward in development.

With this being Easter week, that's a blessing we can all appreciate.

mans 8:28).

A couple of points here: 1) God is concerned about "all things," and 2) God is "working for the good of those who love Him," meaning He is producing the very best outcome possible during any circumstance.

Let me explain why I can completely trust my daughter's life to God's care, and why I am confident He is working for her good and the good of my family.

First, God can be trusted because He is sovereign. He controls all things. God did not create the world like a clock, wind it up, and step back to watch it unwind.

To the contrary, God is intimately involved in all of creation and in the life of my daughter. Ephesians 1:11 reminds us of God's complete control over all of creation, "[God] works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will." God, however, is not just looking at the big picture; He controls every aspect of His creation.

Consider Jesus' loving statement to His followers, "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care" (Matthew 10:29).

This last passage amazes me, because there are many sparrows flying around my house. They are everywhere, yet not one of them will pass away apart from God's will. If this is the case, then certainly our daughter's life is being guided by our loving Father and nothing will happen to her apart

from His will. God is in control. God is to be trusted.

I believe without question that God is in control. What I struggle with is the why? Why are you allowing this to happen to our family? Why wouldn't you stop my daughter from making such a disastrous decision? Why?

When the question of why arises, I remind myself that God is all-wise, that He has a plan which He is orchestrating flawlessly, and it is the best plan. God is infinitely wise, because He always selects the best possible outcome, and He chooses the best possible means to accomplish that outcome.

I have to remind myself that my finite mind cannot comprehend the all-encompassing wisdom of God and I am forced to cry out, like the apostle Paul, "Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out" (Romans 11:33). Though I cannot understand why, I must trust the wisdom of God.

The fact that God is sovereign and all-wise brings me great comfort and builds my faith; however, left at that God seems somewhat like a puppet-master orchestrating His performance.

But God is not simply sovereign and all-wise, He is also a God of love. He loves my daughter, he loves our family, and He loves you with a complete and perfect love, a love that guides his control and His wisdom toward the

best possible outcome for His children.

The love of God that drives me to trust Him completely is central to the Easter story. Good Friday is a celebration of the love of God. John, one of Christ's disciples wrote, "This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

The Father loved us with such an intensely passionate love that He willingly sent His Son to die in our place. His death paid the penalty for the sins of wayward and lost people like me, you, and my daughter.

If God loved us enough to send His Son to die in our place on the cross, then He loves me enough, and He loves my daughter enough to do what is best for her. I choose to place my trust in that kind of love.

The Easter story doesn't end on Good Friday. On the third day, Easter Sunday, the Father raised His Son, Jesus Christ, from the dead. In doing so, Jesus gives all those who place their trust in Him the hope of eternal life in heaven with our Father and our family.

This Easter, our family is trusting in God's sovereign, all-wise and loving care for our daughter. Where, or in Whom do you place your trust this Easter?
