Even if the days are short to enjoy it all.



Only in Hamtramck might you begin your Saturday with a classic car show, march in a parade devoted to the birthday of Lord Krishna and end the night bumping on a dance floor to maximum rock 'n' roll bands Human Eye and the Demolition Doll Rods.

This is a destination city, as we have discussed in this column over the past few years, a place of participation and experience.

It is reality theater (some may say "surreal"): the players are you, me and everyone else who would care to join. Come as you are. All are welcome.

Many come from outside the city's borders to enjoy the full range of Hamtramck's cultural amenities. Some of us are privileged to live here and walk to staging areas for activities and events, celebrations and ceremonies.

Or just to our favorite spot for shawarma or cappuccino. It is a city where choices, of quirk and quality, abound.

Some are so unique – like a parade of colorfully attired Bangladeshi Hin-

cus and a benefit concert for an ailing member of the original New York Dolls – you are unlikely to find them anywhere else in Michigan. Or anywhere in middle America.

Surely not within blocks of each other in the span of a few hours.

A car show in a Detroit metro community is hardly unique. But in Hamtramck, nestled between Kelly's Bar and Cafe 1923 on a two-block stretch of Dubois St., it feels like no other.

Why? The vehicles, if that's your thing, are very cool.

But even if not, the people watching at the "Hamtramck Hustle" is pretty high level, made for prime time viewing.

It's the people who participate that makes the event work.

Now in its 13th year, the number of cars, trucks and motorcycles seemed greater than in previous years. The entire length of Dubois was full of them, with others parked on Holbrook and Florian and more coming when I left in mid-afternoon.

Three hours later, I joined a crowd of around

Attention local artists: Highland Park has a project for you

Are you a Hamtramck or area muralist looking for a public space to fill?

If so, look no further that right outside Hamtramck's border, at the Highland Park water reservoir on Dequindre, just north of the Davison.

Highland Park has teamed up with Detroit officials to battle area blight through art.

The reservoir's outside walls were painted white to serve as a fresh canvass, if you will, for local artists to fill.

The only guideline is that the murals have to be about Detroit or Highland Park – such as famous folks, local landmarks, or any other local cultural reference.

The spaces are about 10-feet wide, and already there are several works in progress.

Artists have to bring

their own supplies.

One panel that stands out is a tribute to Motown's Stevie Wonder. He is depicted in his 1970s fashion glory – with a background featuring twinkling stars.

"He sings to the universe," said muralist Wal-


ter Bailey.

Highland Park once had its own water service and treatment plant, but switched over to Detroit for service in 2012. The water reservoir is no longer in use.

Its future is uncertain at this point.

But in the meantime, officials figure, it may as well look good while it still stands.



Yemeni mural on southend is one of the city's treasures

We are crossing our fingers that things can be worked out to save the Yemeni mural in the southend.

A developer wants to construct a two-story building in a lot that is right next to the mural.

If that plan goes through, the mural, at Jos. Campau and Goodson, will be obstructed from view.

Residents and city officials are attempting to put together a land swap deal to entice the developer to build in lots behind the current proposed development site.

It's a complicated plan, and one that requires purchasing the lot next to the mural for \$80,000, although that price comes down in the swap/sale deal to \$45,000.

That's still a hefty sum of money, one that we seriously question whether the good folks trying to save the mural can come up with.

A meeting was scheduled for this past Thursday, the day The Review went to press, and it was unknown at press time whether something was worked out.

If not, Hamtramck is

going to lose a cultural landmark. The city has become a magnet for muralists, but this mural is by far the best one in town. Graphically, it's very compelling.

There is a thought that the mural could be replicated on another building, but it's been pointed out that it just won't be the same.

We agree – you just can't recreate something like this.

The developer has every right to build on this site. We just hope he has patience to let a deal be worked out – which may take time.

Congressional law could be the answer to save Yemeni mural

Throughout Hamtramck there is a decent amount of street art. Some of it is pretty OK.

Some of it is pretty good. However, there is one work that stands out as really significant to the City of Hamtramck.

The Yemeni mural on Mohammed Alsomiri's building is not just excellent, it is undoubtedly a work of "recognized stature" among the Hamtramck community.

Back in 2016, muralist Katherine Craig's artwork on Grand Boulevard (the Rainbow Waterfall mural) was also subject to destruction. She sued the developers who had planned to remove the

work as part of a new development.

It appears the lawsuit did the intended job, because the mural is being preserved as the re-development of that building takes hold. How is this possible?

Back in the 1990s, Congress passed a groovy little law called the "Visual Artists Rights Act."

It grants some of the same legal rights to muralists that a lot of other artists and musicians have. Looking over the statute, I read something I felt one could use to help argue in favor of the piece on Hamtramck's southend.

Let's take a look:

(3) subject to the limitations set forth in section 113(d), shall have the right—

• to prevent any intentional distortion, mutilation, or other modification of that work which would be prejudicial to his or her honor or reputation, and any intentional distortion, mutilation, or modification of that right, and to prevent any destruction of a work of recognized stature.

I'm no lawyer, but this tactic seems plausible. Let's fight.

Skeeters alert... Watch out for the bitey ones.

No, not zombies, although well, maybe...

No, we're referring to a press release from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services from Aug. 26, warning people to take precautions against mosquito bites, as there have now been one confirmed human case (and three others suspected) of mosquito-borne EEE, or Eastern Equine Encephalitis, along with six confirmed cases in horses.

The disease proved fatal to all six horses affected in the area of St. Joseph, Kalamazoo and Barry counties on the state's southwest side. Worse yet, humans can be infected as well.

Closer to home, a single human case of California encephalitis was confirmed in Genesee County.

Encephalitis is a dis-

ease marked by brain swelling, which can prove deadly, so this is no time to be lax.

Avoid or disrupt areas of standing water, favorite breeding grounds for the troublesome skeeters. Wear long, preferably dark clothes, especially at dusk, and use a repellent. Check that your window screens don't have any holes.

There is a vaccine for horses, but curiously, none for humans. Mortality rates are about 33 percent for people, and 90 percent for unvaccinated horses.

West Nile Virus, another mosquito-borne one, has also been spotted in some local birds recently.

Once temperatures fall consistently below freezing, this year's danger should be over.

Tacos for a cause... Detroit Friendship House is going to be extra friendly next month.


The cost for the all-you-can-eat event is \$7 per person, and all proceeds go toward helping the DFH feed other hungry families in turn.

There will be a vegan option, they promise, and also there will be ongoing drink specials for the entire duration.

Detroit Friendship House is a faith-based non-profit organization that bills itself as "the only public food pantry in Hamtramck."

On their website (detroitfriendshiphouse.org), they claim to provide, on average, about 60,000 pounds of food per month to hundreds of cash-strapped families in the area.

Where else but Hamtramck can you catch a rat rod car show, a Krishna celebration and a rock 'n' roll benefit all on one Saturday?

100 Hindu pilgrims assembled in the parking lot of the Ali Baba restaurant, currently closed and undergoing renovations.

The group walked en masse, chanting and drumming, to Jos. Campau then south to Belmont – where a large number of the city's Hindu families have settled – to Conant and back to the Caniff start location.

I have attended these

processions before. This one also seemed larger than in prior years, with what appeared to be an equal distribution of men, women, children and infants.

From there my friend Jen and I went back to my patio to rest and refresh ourselves before walking back up to Caniff to Royal Kabob, where we each had a falafel sandwich and hummus.

Then it was another short walk east to Conant and into Small's, which was hosting a fundraising concert for New York Dolls guitarist Sylvain Sylvain, who is undergoing treatment for cancer.

We walked in just as Timmy Vulgar, a longtime Hamtramck resident, was cranking up his guitar. His band, Human Eye, rocked out in a style that might best be described as "noise punk blues."

The Amy Gore Band rocked hard and fast before the ageless Demolition Doll Rods took the stage.

The band looks much the same as in the 1990s, when it was part of a competitive Detroit garage scene along with the White Stripes, Detroit Cobras, Dirtbombs and others.

Sure, Danny and Mar-

garet Doll Rod wore more clothes than they did 20 years ago (when they performed only in feathers and bikini briefs) and new drummer Shelby Murphy probably added an even bigger bass punch to the swampy stomping sound the trio is known for.

But blink once, or twice, and it might have been the mid-90s at Lollapalooza or on the set of Brazilian TV show all over again.

Looking for a real estate bargain? It's county tax sale time

Here is your chance to get in on the Hamtramck real estate rush on the cheap.

There are seven local properties listed in the annual Wayne County property tax forfeiture sale this year. All but one of the properties are lots.

The property on Council St. is actually an active business, Fred's Bump Shop.

Online bidding starts on Sept. 4 and runs through Sept. 18.

The properties include:

- **2390 Goodson St.** – This is a single lot between two, two-family houses, both of which are a bit rundown looking.

- **11775 Dequindre St.** – This is one lot that is connected with several others. The street is also informally known as the I-75 service drive. If you want to build here, you will have to keep in mind the noise from the freeway. Also, the neighborhood has no market or any type of business.

- **11470 Dyar St.** – A single lot that is located across from newly constructed homes. But again, it's in that area west of I-75 that is cut off from the rest of the city.

- **3010 Goodson St.** – This lot is east of Jos. Campau and is between two houses. The downside is that both adjoining property owners appear to have incorporated the lot into their property. Good luck trying to untangle that mess.

- **2951 Council St.** – That's the bump shop.

- **3204 Carpenter St.** – This lot is connected to other empty lots.

- **5184 Yemans St.** – This lot also appears to have been incorporated into the neighbor's yard. This area of Hamtramck is also known as “Ducktown.” Why? Because it used to be

a marshy area, good for only ducks and mosquitoes.

To bid on one single property requires a \$35 registration fee and a \$2,500 deposit.

To bid on more than one property, a \$10,000 deposit is required, and some prop-

erties listed as “premium properties” require a \$25,000 deposit.

You must register by Sept. 6.
