## HPS District reacts to racial incident but provides no details

An apparent racial flare-up among students in the Hamtramck Public School District prompted an immediate response.

However, a letter released by Interim Superintendent Nabil Nagi on the district's Facebook page raised more questions than answers.

The letter did not specify what had happened, but rather, addressed the subject in generalities.

"HPS Staff and community strive to work cohesively and provide a welcoming, inclusive and safe environment for all members regardless of individual differences," Nagi said.

"My colleagues and I realize the negative im-

## The days of Zoom appear over

There's one thing that many folks liked about the Covid pandemic.

It opened city council meetings up to those quarantining at home, which was basically all of us.

For those interested in city government, you could watch a city council meeting at home and participate in it via Zoom.

That was also true for other public bodies' meetings besides local council meetings.

In Hamtramck that all went away when the state mandated that local governments – and school boards – must go back to meeting in-person.

So, gone were the days when one could watch those meetings, and then be able to speak during public comment, all from the comfort of your home.

Both Hamtramck's city council and school board dropped that option as soon as in-person meetings resumed, although you can still catch those meetings on links to YouTube.

While you can still yell at your screen during the meetings, if so inclined, your voice won't be heard.

City Councilmember Adam Albarmaki wants to change that for city council meetings.

He wants the public to have the option to talk during public comment, from their home or wherever.

His fellow councilmembers, though, are not in

Lounge, which kicks off the day at 7 a.m. with live bands, Polish food, drink specials and the irreplaceable presence of owner Cathy Gordon.

If you're lucky, you catch her in action walking on top of the bar and pouring strong drinks down the throats of thirsty customers.

But wait, New Dodge is not alone in starting off the day early. One of our favorite neighborhood bars – and one of only a couple left in the city – the Polish Sea League (located at Edwin and Brom-

bach) is also celebrating starting at 7 a.m.

Look for the Srodek food truck parked outside. Word to the wise: Jezy (officially called "Jezynowka," a Polish blackberry brandy) shots are strong here.

Oh wait, who are we kidding? Jezy is poured strong and plentifully everywhere in Hamtramck. For those unfamiliar with the drink, it could be the last thing you remember that day.

Whiskey in the Jar (on Yemans St., just west of Jos. Campau Ave.) is also another Paczki Day fan favorite. Word is, though, the bar won't have its huge tent installed out in the alley, so good luck trying to squeeze inside.

Over at Small's (located at Caniff and Conant) where area rockers hang out, their own drink specialty is being served up. This is the home of Paczki Bombs.

For the uninitiated, Paczki Bombs are paczkis filled with booze, booze and a little more booze. Live bands will also be playing throughout the day and evening.

Need a warm Polish meal for a timeout on Tuesday (and to let the booze soak in)? If so, head on over to Polonia restaurant (on Yemans, just east of Jos. Campau) for a hearty home-cooked meal.

Weather-wise, it looks

like we'll have temperatures hovering around 32 degrees, which is tolerable. With the right amount of Jezy, you won't feel a thing anyway.

## Mayor: Increasing number of Covid deaths is 'scary'

While the number of new Covid cases continues to dwindle in Hamtramck, there is a more disturbing trend lately:

The number of Covid-related deaths are going up.

For the second week in a row, according to Wayne County health officials, there were more deaths from the disease recorded this past week. Last week, there were two Covid deaths.

The week before that, there were three deaths recorded.

In his weekly update on Covid and city issues, Mayor Amer Ghalib said that increase in deaths "is really scary."

He said there is a common denominator among many of those who died, some of whom he knew.

"Most of these people did not get vaccinated," Ghalib said.

According to county health statistics, there has now been a total of 4,609 Covid cases reported in Hamtramck since the pandemic started about two

years ago. The number of deaths for this period is 69.

In other news, Ghalib said he attended an event in Warren, that was sponsored by the Ukrainian community, to show solidarity against Russian aggression happening in the Ukraine.

Hamtramck is still home to a Ukrainian community here (near Immaculate Conception Church), although it is much smaller in number than in previous decades.

Ghalib said he shares their "concerns and worries of their country. ... We pray for peace in the region. War will have severe consequences."

The mayor also attended the observance of "International Mother Language Day," held shortly before midnight last Sunday in Zussman Park.

The event celebrates the anniversary of when Bangladeshi students fought to preserve their native language.

Coming up in city council, Ghalib said, are reports

due back from two council sub-committees. One committee is studying the city's new parking meter system and its impact on the Jos. Campau business district.

That committee is expected to present recommendations on the city's policy regarding meters.

Another committee

looked at the rules and procedures for council meetings. That report was presented at Tuesday's regular council meeting.

Ghalib said that there are bound to be some who object to the recommendations, and he encouraged the public to voice their opinions and concerns.

agreement, except for Councilmember Nayeem Choudhury.

Choudhury said that with Covid still spreading, "Folks are not ready to come out."

Councilmember Albar-maki said that the council is here "to represent the residents." He also said it's about "transparency."

But there was some pushback. Both Councilmembers Amanda Jaczkowski and Mohammad Hassan are concerned that bringing back Zoom's ability to allow the public to speak from remote places will result in late-running council meetings, which did indeed sometimes go until 1 a.m.

That was something that did occasionally happen when there were hot-button issues, which sometimes encouraged people from outside the city to comment.

Often, speakers would end up repeating what others had previously said.

Jaczkowski proposed postponing a vote on the proposal to allow a council sub-committee to review it, along with other council rules and procedures likewise being reviewed.

That sub-committee, of which Jaczkowski is a part, presented its report at Tuesday's regular council meeting.

But guess what?

The recommendations presented did not mention anything about reinstating Zoom meetings.

According to sources, the ability for the public to address the council from remote places has been solved, by allowing email comments to be submitted on the day of the meetings (as long as they arrive by no later than 4 p.m.) and then read into the record during the council's two public comment periods.

And, speaking of the public comment sections of the city council meetings, the council agreed to extend the first portion of public comment.

Each speaker will now get to speak for up to three minutes – instead of just two – and then request an additional minute if needed.

The first public comment section will allow the public to speak on any issue, and the second comment section will be limited to council agenda items only. That time limit per speaker is still set at two minutes, with an additional minute given upon request.

There has been no word on whether the Hamtramck Public School Board will bring back Zoom-based public participation. Those monthly board meetings are also broadcast on YouTube.

### Losing the Polish Parade opens a door for a new one

We know there are plenty of folks in town who are upset that the organizers of the Polish Day Parade have moved the event from Hamtramck to Warren.

It's been no secret that parade organizers have long entertained this thought.

The parade has traditionally been held on Labor Day, which capped the long Hamtramck Labor Day Festival held that weekend. In the past, the relationship

between festival organizers and the parade folks has been uneasy at times.

At times, festival organizers have argued that the parade folks should be pitching in money to help offset the cost of the extra police needed for the event.

Parade people argued that they had no budget, and should get credit for boosting the attendance of the festival.

past racist behaviors have within our community. We strive to emulate values that empower students to rise above behaviors that negatively impact ethnic groups or individuals. We celebrate and positively affirm the diversity that HPS encompasses."

The Review reached out to Nagi for comment, via email, but he did not respond. The Review also attempted to reach him by phone, but the district's phone system was not working.

Some teachers said that they were equally baffled by the letter.

"I don't know anything solid," said one teacher. "I've been asking around, myself."

According to our sources, there was an incident involving students at Dick-

inson East Elementary School who taunted African-American students with racial slurs.

Nagi's letter went on to say:

"While such an incident can be divisive, let us use it to effect change and come together by not supporting hate commentary that is spoken, written or implied.

"Stand up and report such incidents to administrators, counselors, teachers or other staff members."

The Hamtramck Public School District has long had verbal and physical fighting between different racial and ethnic groups, going back decades.

But the district has also been aggressive in coun-

seling students, through various programs, on how to get along.

While there have been some problems, the district has also long been a melting pot of many ethnic communities. That unique atmosphere led the high school to adopt the nickname of their sports teams as "The Cosmos," – as in, cosmopolitans.

Nagi concluded his letter to the community with this message:

"Change starts with each individual. We all have a responsibility to ourselves and each other to build mutual respect.

"HPS will not tolerate behaviors that violate the core values of respect for all groups, and individuals that are a part of our community."

**Free vaccines...** Hamtramck will soon have another way to get their Covid vaccines free and easy – and this one comes with some incentives.

On Thursday, March 3, from 11a.m.-3p.m., persons 5 and older can receive their first or second dose, or booster, of the Pfizer vaccine, or persons 18 and older can get any of those doses of the Moderna vaccine.

Doing so will get you a \$20 gift card per Covid shot. Minors will need a signed parental consent.

Free flu vaccines will also be available.

This will be going on at the State of Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) building, also called the Hamtramck Woody Plaza,

at 12140 Jos. Campau Ave. (east side, between Carpenter and Commor.)

You must register in advance to be able to receive the gift cards, as well as the free health care packages containing laundry baskets, facial tissue, face masks, hand sanitizer and more (one per household).

Register by calling (313) 815-2658, or by emailing Fawazh@michigan.gov. Health professionals will be on hand to answer questions.

The free vaccination clinic is sponsored by C-Asist, in conjunction with the MDHHS. C-Asist is a Dearborn-based non-profit that helps low-income and underserved communities in that city, and neighboring areas.

## Treasurer offers ways to avoid foreclosure, but you should act soon

Wayne County Treasurer I am urging residents who owe property taxes for 2019, or prior years, to get into payment plans by March 14 or pay their property tax bills in full by March 31.

Otherwise, they risk having the property go into foreclosure.

This will mark the first year that occupied properties will have been foreclosed upon since the start of the COVID pandemic. In both 2020 and 2021, I have successfully petitioned the 3rd Circuit Court to halt the foreclosure of occupied properties, because of hardships caused by the pandemic.

Let me further explain:

While my office remains committed to doing everything it can to keep people in their homes – through payment arrangements, for example — we also have to comply with the law.

It is very important that individuals who owe back property taxes for the year 2019 or prior either pay the tax bill in full or work with our office to make payment arrangements.

I also hope that a new program, the Michigan Homeowner Assistance

Fund (MIHAF), will help save many owner-occupied Wayne County homes from foreclosure. Launched this week by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer, the program provides \$242 million in American Rescue Fund dollars to help Michiganders pay back taxes and for other needs. Homeowner applicants for the MIHAF program can qualify for an extension to redeem their properties through March 2023.

To qualify for MIHAF, applicants must have experienced a qualified financial hardship due to the coronavirus pandemic after Jan. 21, 2020, or had a qualified hardship that began before Jan. 21, 2020, and continued after that date.

They also need to meet income eligibility requirements, and the property must be owner-occupied. The maximum amount

of assistance available through MIHAF per household is \$25,000.

If you apply for the MIHAF funds, please forward a copy of your verification via email with your name, property address and parcel identification number and your MIHAF confirmation number to: MIHAF.WCTO@waynecounty.com. The Wayne County Treasurer's Office has several options to help residents stay in their homes, including financial hardship extensions, the Pay As You Stay program and other payment plans.
