'Best Little League player ever' passes on...

Hamtramck – and the nation – have lost a sports legend.


Art "Pinky" Deras died June 5 at the age of 75.

Deras not only excelled in sports at Hamtramck High School, he was known as the "Best Little League player ever."

How's that? Back in 1959, he led his Hamtramck team to 13 straight victories in the Little League World Series.

During that season, he pitched 75 scoreless innings, and also pitched 10 no-hitters. He was equally impressive at the plate, with a batting average of .641, with 33 home runs and 112 runs batted in.

Fellow team member Tom Paciorek remembered Deras as being bigger and more mature than the other kids.

"At 12 years old, he was bigger, taller and stronger than the rest of us, and the greatest player ever at that age," Paciorek told the National Polish American Sports Hall of Fame.

"He was just so much better than the rest of us."

After Little League and

graduating from HHS, he joined the St. Louis Cardinals baseball team, but stalled in their Double A farm league.

In his five-year minor league career, he never pitched an inning; the Cardinals tried to convert him to a third baseman, and then to the outfield.

He played 518 games in the minors, and only totaled 32 home runs. His best year at the plate, he hit .269 – for the Arkansas Travelers of the Texas League, the same year the Tigers were winning the World Series as underdogs to those same

The Review: Why a television station now for Hamtramck? Is this a first for the city, or not?

Greg Kirchner: Why not? At one time, the city had a daily newspaper (Polish Daily News), two or three weekly newspapers, and also daily radio programs. As time passed, they all went away, except for The

Stadium will be rededicated

Hamtramck's historic baseball stadium will be getting more love this Monday in a special Juneteenth celebration.

On Monday, the Friends of Historic Hamtramck Stadium (FHHS) will host a rededication ceremony at the stadium, starting at 1 p.m.

Some local bigwigs will be on hand, such as Wayne County Executive Warren C. Evans, former Negro Leagues baseball player and longtime Detroit baseball coach Ron Teasley Sr., as well as the family of Negro Leagues legend Norman "Turkey" Stearnes and representatives of the Detroit Tigers.

The stadium's field is named in Stearnes' honor. He played for the Detroit Stars, who called the Hamtramck Stadium home.

The stadium was built in 1930, but fell into disrepair by the 1980s.

At several points various city officials considered razing the stadium.

The stadium was built for the Negro baseball league, which was a time when African-Americans were not allowed to play in the Major Leagues.

The Hamtramck Stadium is one of only a few stadiums that still exist that served the Negro League.

Since its historical significance was uncovered, over \$2 million in grants from various organizations have been acquired to renovate the grandstands and field.

The Hamtramck Stadium Grounds Crew has been maintaining the field.

According to the Friends organization, Teasley is a "pioneering Detroit player and... is one of four living players from the Ma-

tor Negro Leagues' era (1920-1948)."

A native Detroit, Teasley played with the New York Cubans

in the Negro National League in 1948, and also played in the Brooklyn Dodgers' farm system the same year. A graduate of Wayne State University, holding both bachelor's and master's degrees, Teasley is a member of the Wayne State Athletic Hall of Fame and still holds several WSU batting records.

Teasley taught for more than 30 years and coached baseball, basketball, and golf at De-

troit's Northwestern High School for more than two decades. He is a member of the Northwestern High School Hall of Fame, the Afro-American Sports Hall of Fame, the Michigan High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, and a veteran of the US Navy.

Following the ceremony, there will be a Negro League tribute game between two high school baseball teams sporting the historic uniforms of the Detroit Stars and the Chicago American Giants.

The event is open to the public and is free to attend.

St. Louis Cardinals: 1968.

He later joined the Warren Police Department, and retired from there after 30 years of service.

Hamtramck was the last US team to win the Little League World Series – that is, until last year, when a team from Taylor captured that title.

In an interview with The Review last year, Deras had this to say about the downriver team: "I'm surprised it took so long! I never thought it would take 62 years, but I wish them the best."

Deras is survived by

his children, Kevin (Wendy) Deras, Deb (Paul) Budnick and Adam (Abbie Fletcher) and seven grandchildren; he is also survived by the mothers of his children, Carol Deras and Jane Chupailo.

Hamtramck's primary election ballot gets slimmed down a bit

The list of candidates for the city's August 2 Primary Election has been reduced.

Alberta Tinsley Talabi was kicked off the Democratic ballot for the 3rd District State Senator race. That district includes Hamtramck.

State election officials eliminated her from the election because Talabi was linked to a bribery scheme in 2015.

Also kicked off as a Democratic hopeful for Wayne County Executive is Monica Conyers, the wife of deceased former Congressman John Conyers. She was actually convicted of bribery while serving on the Detroit City Council.

Conyers challenged the law that bans those who were convicted of bribery while in elected office from ever running again for elective office. The court ruled against her.

Adam Hollier survived a challenge from fellow candidate Michael Griffie, who said Hollier should be disqualified because of incomplete campaign finance reporting.

A Wayne County Circuit Court judge ruled that Hollier had submitted the necessary paperwork to be on the ballot.

Hollier is currently a state senator whose district includes Hamtramck, but he has opted to run for an open seat in the US Congressional 13th Dis-

trict as a Representative.

So far, according to polls, Hollier has a tough battle facing him. Leading in the polls is another Conyers – this time John Conyers' son, who is also named John Conyers.

Locally, Hamtramck City Councilmember Mohammed Alsomiri is one of several challengers trying to unseat Wayne County Commissioner Martha Scott.

Scott has proven to be hard to beat in her 30-plus years in elected office.

State Rep. Abraham Aiyash, who lives in Hamtramck, has several challengers, all but one of whom are fellow Democrats.

Aiyash is in his first term.

Covid update: Hamtramck records one more death

It's been two weeks since we last checked in with the latest Covid update.

And to no one's surprise, COVID-19 is still with us. Over the past two weeks, Wayne County health officials recorded 62 new cases, bringing the total number of cases in Hamtramck for the past two years to 5,046.

Worse, this week the number of deaths from Covid during this period rose by one, to a total of 74.

The number of cases represents 17 percent of the city's population. According to the 2020 US Census, Hamtramck has a population of 29,853.

Out of that population total, about 64 percent of the residents have been vaccinated.

Still need a vaccination or a booster? You can get one at city hall, but only on Tuesdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. There is no charge.

So, just when can we expect Covid and its variants to eventually go away?

Probably never, say a number of health experts. In fact, there is a

prediction that another pandemic will sweep the nation.

There are a few things you can do to reduce your chances of catching Covid. The main ways are to mask up when going out in public, limit your exposure of contact with others, and keep your distance from one another.

Those precautions seem to be largely ignored by the public, at least lately here in the metro area. From what we've seen, restaurants and bars have been packed with people, virtually none of whom are masked.

Major events, such as sports games and concerts, have also returned, with people sitting or standing and sitting side-by-side.

The only good news is that the latest Covid variant seems to be less deadly, and many have reported experiencing only mild symptoms.

Locally, Mayor Ameer Ghalib has discontinued his weekly Covid updates, which perhaps is another sign that more and more people have moved on from being all that concerned.

Community television will soon make its debut in Hamtramck Continued from front page

Review.

Hamtramck needs a mass media outlet that can get information to its residents on a daily basis. I do not remember any TV stations operating from Hamtramck with local news, or one providing access to local organizations or government institutions.

Any TV outlet needs a wider financial support base. Only a small-scale

broadcasting system, such as one like we are setting up, can accomplish that goal.

The Review: Why do it through the library? Will you have your own area or spare room there to store equipment, edit pieces, etc.?

Kirchner: The library started an audio-visual department in 1998. It operated with a single

Hi-8 video camera and a couple of VCRs.

By 2010, we started using a computer to edit video. In 2021, when the ARPA grants became available, the library decided to apply, with the intent to expand the audio-visual department, and to utilize Hamtramck's government channel 12 for more than just council meetings (which aired a two-hour broadcast twice a month).

When the city decided not to share the channel, efforts were made to secure another channel for local broadcasts.

After several meetings with Comcast, we finally received the rights to use channel 19. We do not have the space, or money, to build a large studio or a sound stage. Maybe someday.

We do have much more equipment to record and edit footage, and then broadcast it later from computer files. We will also find a corner to set up a green screen and a news desk for daily informational service. Eventually, we intend to broadcast 24 hours per day.

The Review: Can you tell us more about the process of getting to use channel 19?

Kirchner: Comcast channel 19 is an educational channel. It was not being used currently, and by us making a commitment to provide content of at least eight hours per day, Com-

cast agreed to assign it to our library as a community broadcast channel.

Every few years – last time, it happened during the Obama Presidency – the federal government provides grants totaling \$250,000,000, including up to \$1,000,000 for over-the-air community broadcasting stations on an FCC assigned frequency.

With the experience we gain broadcasting cable channel, we might be ready to take advantage when these grants become available again.

The Review: Besides basic community info, what else might you show on the channel? Will you have, for example, live music, or theatrical performances, or teleplays?

Kirchner: Some of the content we would like to broadcast includes: council meeting highlights; commission meeting highlights; library programs for adults and for children; story times for young kids; events sponsored by local organizations.

Also, school events; sports events; social gatherings; informational videos prepared by governmental entities; opinions expressed by residents and business owners; debates and discussions on local issues; performances by local musicians and artists.

Additionally, one or more game show(s); lo-

cal news; a calendar of events; speeches by political leaders; lectures by intellectual personalities; interviews with both locals and visitors; and more.

The Review: What will be the focus of the station as it presumably grows a bit of audience, moving forward? Any plans to expand it in any way, and if so, into what areas?

Kirchner: The focus will be to serve as a communication hub for our community; to promote Hamtramck; to bridge the divide between different ethnic groups; and to start a dialogue between residents with wide spectrum of opinions and habits.

It is difficult to predict how successful our efforts will become, but we (feel that we) need to try. In many ways, we are not so different, and finding common interests might bring us closer together.

The Review: Feel free to add anything else that you'd like to to the discussion.

Kirchner: It is our hope that we can develop a close cooperation between the city's only weekly newspaper and our broadcasts. We would like to list a schedule of programs for the coming week in The Review, since there will be no printed TV guide for our station.

We would also like to share content and resources on file. In time, it is my hope that a community group will be formed

– to serve in an advisory capacity at first, and then, in the future, to branch off from the library as a fully-fledged broadcasting network.

As we get started, our signal will be available to about five million cable subscribers in the Southeast Michigan area, with the possibility to expand nationwide to 21.5 million Comcast subscribers.

We hope, someday, to develop cooperation with other national networks to promote Hamtramck worldwide. It will take a while to develop quality programming. I hope we will succeed.

In a June 14 update to this interview, via email, Mr. Kirchner mentioned a few updates:

- The fiber optic dedicated line has now been built up to a point reaching as far as the library building itself.

- The junction box that allows connection to the Comcast network has been installed inside the library.

- On June 9, a Comcast technician picked up the new station's signal encoder, which will now be programmed, returned and connected to the network by a scheduled date of June 23.

- Once the system is activated, the staff will begin a week or two of beta testing the equipment and then, after that, some time early in July and assuming everything functions correctly during those tests, then the station shall go live.



Classes designed to prepare Adult Learners for the battery of HSE Tests (English/Reading, Math, Science, and Social Studies).

ABE Adult Basic Education

Adult Basic Education provides instruction for reading, language, writing and math skills below the 9th grade level for adults with or without a high school credentials. Sometimes referred to as Pre-GED.
