Asthma help for city residents

Hamtramck's asthmatics may be about to get healthier.

The Michigan chapter of the Asthma & Allergy Foundation of America (AAFA-MI) has been chosen to start a HEAL (Health Equity Advancement and Leadership) program here in the area.

The focus here is on asthma: advancing health and wellness, finding or providing access to specialty care, assessing home environments, and providing self-management education.

The ultimate goal is to reduce asthma deaths and illness among high-risk populations – which is where Hamtramck comes in.

The AAFA of Michigan is looking for 50 people to join in with them on this project. To qualify, you must:

- Live in Hamtramck, or Detroit, Highland Park, Inkster, Redford, or River Rouge
- Be 18 or older
- Have been told by a doctor that you have asthma
- Be from a minority community, or else be affected by healthcare inequities (for example, you don't have, or can't get, any)

City is in line for a boost

Hamtramck's financial woes are getting a major fix.

But it's only temporary. Gov. Gretchen Whitmer recently announced that the state is allocating \$750 million to "underfunded municipal pension systems."

Hamtramck is included in that list of communities.

At Tuesday's city council meeting, Sue Feinberg of the Municipal Employees Retirement System (MERS) said the city could receive about \$17.6 million.

The city still has to apply for the financial aid, Feinberg said, and it won't come until next summer or so.

"There are a lot of bugs to work out," Feinberg said about the funding source.

City Manager Kathy Angerer said that what is coming will boost the city's pension funding from being at 45 percent to 60 percent of what's needed to being fully funded.

The city's payment to the pension fund this year



City finances will get a break through a major influx of funding through the state to help reduce the city's pension costs. However, the financial boost is for one-time only.

requires \$5.7 million out of its \$18 million budget.

Angerer, who is leaving her position this Friday (July 15) for a new job, obviously welcomed the news.

"We have worked hard to communicate to leaders in Lansing about the challenge of the pension obligation. I am so pleased that the State of Michigan finally recognized and the legislature came to agreement to relieve the burden the underfunded pension ob-

ligation is for our city and others and using the one-time available funds to do so," Angerer told The Review.

"This is so good for Hamtramck. I will leave my tenure as city manager knowing that this problem is on its way to being solved."

While this is indeed a one-time allocation, according to a state press release, there will be leftover federal funding that could be tapped into in the future.

"With billions in revenue still available, there is opportunity going forward to equitably invest those remaining resources to ensure Michigan is an attractive place for talent and supports thriving communities in ways that benefit everyone," said Whitmer in the press release.

That isn't the only funding coming to communities through the state. The other allocations include:

Election info is online

If the upcoming primary and regular elections have you a bit confused, you're in luck.

There's another resource in the Hamtramck area to help you sort out all the candidates, districting changes, and more.

It's CitizenDetroit, and they've launched a new campaign to help educate area voters.

They're partly the brainchild of co-founder and CEO Sheila Cockrel, herself a former Detroit city councilmember.

"At a time when democracy feels as if it's under attack, it is now more important than ever that voters are empowered to make well-informed decisions," she said.

To that end, their website, InformDetroit.org, features unedited two-minute videos from more than 50 candidates from both sides of the aisle.

There is no editorializing – the group is dedicated to "providing unbiased information on candidates and issues," as well as "encouraging civic engagement," their June 29 press release noted.

The group also has a map of all the new election districts.

They want people to come vote, and to come vote armed with their facts intact.

They have partnered with some heavy hitters, including the League of Women Voters of Detroit and a number of fraternal and sororal organizations, as well as media such as the Detroit Free Press, Detroit News, Michigan Chronicle, El Central, Bridge Michigan and WDET-FM, and corporate partners as well.

There's a new street name in Hamtramck

Add former Mayor Karen Majewski to the growing list of local notables having a street renamed in their honor.

Majewski was mayor of Hamtramck for 18 years – tying former Mayor Robert Kozaren for having served in that position for that length of time.

Majewski lost her bid for re-election last November. Kozaren, coincidentally, which, if had won, would have made him the lon-

gest serving mayor.

Anyway, on Tuesday evening, city officials and residents gathered right across from city hall to unveil an honorary street sign that sits atop the Winfrey St. sign. The honorary sign reads: and Mayor Karen Majewski Ph.D St.

(Majewski has an academic doctorate degree from the University of Michigan.)

Also happening Tuesday night was the unveiling of

a plaque commemorating the city's 100th anniversary of becoming an incorporated city.

That incorporation happened way back in 1922, for those of you not quick in the math department.

Majewski said the dual honors made it a "historic moment" for the city.

As for her honorary street sign, she said:

"This is a great honor, and I'm very moved by it. When I was persuad-

Covid: Something wicked this way comes?

Another covid variant is starting to appear nationwide, and past vaccinations may not be able to stop it.

Health officials across the country are sounding the alarm that a new Omicron subvariant, known as BA.5, is more infectious than previous ones. It gets worse, they say, because whatever immunity that has been gained from vaccinations or prior infections may be ineffective against it.

In Michigan, patients with the variant have been reported, and there is a concern that there will be a spike in cases that require hospitalization.

In Hamtramck, the week-

ly number of new covid cases remains steady in the low 20s. The exact number for the previous week, as of this past Monday, is 22 new cases, according to Wayne County statistics.

That brings the total number of cases for the past two years, since when the pandemic started, up to 5,164.

The number of city deaths from covid for this same period remains at 74.

And just to put things in perspective: the number of covid deaths in Michigan at this point is 36,982, and over 1 million in the US.

The new subvariant has health officials concerned whether the next round of a booster vax will be effective.

Despite that concern, those who have not been vaccinated are still urged to do so.

And there is more urgency for folks to mask up while out in public, and keep a distance from others, as well as wash hands frequently.

That ongoing message to mask up, as we have reported previously, has largely been ignored by people. Ask yourself how many people you see wearing a mask while at markets and shops in Hamtramck?

If you guessed not many, you are correct. But it's no different than anywhere else in the metro area.

A look back at Hamtramck's history...

Miss Ronolle Stanley (and her guitar) were the featured entertainers at the Davison Inn at 2951 E. Davison, in March 1943. Hamtramckans didn't just frequent bars in Hamtramck.



Music festival is the next big city event coming up

The Hamtramck Music Festival is on the move.

Moving toward a date with destiny, that is.

The "Largest Local Music Fest," as it refers to itself, is set for Aug. 11-14 this year, and they recently sent out a lengthy and informative initial press.

Wristband sales started on that day, and can now be obtained in a variety of ways.

The first way is online, through their link at <https://2022.hamtramck-musicfest.com/>, and the other way is at some local record stores in the area, with more venues possibly to come.

The pre-sale wristbands are discounted, and will set you back a mere 20

bucks, and will be good for unlimited band action at any venue(s).

Record stores where you can get the bracelet-style wristbands so far include Detroit Threads and Record Graveyard (both in Hamtramck), Dearborn Music (both locations, Dearborn and Farmington), Flipside Records (Berkley), Found Sound (Ferndale), Solo Records and UHF Records (both in Royal Oak), and Village Vinyl (Warren).

You might want to call first to check these stores' hours and whether they have the wristbands left. Sales at these physical locations continues through the Monday before the festival begins, which is Aug. 8. There are no added service fees to obtain them

this way.

Over 600 bands have applied to be part of the festival this year, including some familiar and some new. Over 20 venues will host shows this go-round, and a few of those will also be new.

Venues and acts are still being finalized. Go to the above website for ongoing updates, or check out the festival's Facebook and Instagram pages.

City's summer newsletter is chockfull of information

Most of you may already have the city's summer newsletter.

In any case, we're here to briefly summarize what you'll find talked about in that flyer. We highly recommend you getting a copy from city hall, if you

didn't receive one in the mail, or checking the city's website.

Note that it is, mostly, in English.

First up, Hamtramck Historical Museum Director Greg Kowalski talks about the city officially turning 100.

Among the interesting facts are that, during the decade before (1910-20), the township's population grew from 3,500 to 48,000; and that the incorporation was completed as part of an original city charter, on April 3, 1922, and was done – at least in part – to prevent Detroit from absorbing Hamtramck.

Also noted: the city re-dedicated the grave of Colonel John Francis Hamtramck, the city's namesake, during a Memorial Day ceremony attended by a large cross-section of the city's racial, religious and ethnic backgrounds; and that there are events planned all year (a local-history-themed scavenger hunt just happened last weekend, and the Music Fest and Labor Day Fest are on both the horizon).

Next, an excellent list of city department phone numbers directs you for reporting or solving various issues that you may

encounter.

Sewers blocked? Public Services. Need to hang a sign? Building Department. Somebody's laundry all over their porch, or their grass too long? Code Enforcement. An abandoned vehicle? Police.

You'll next find an excellent and detailed map of all seven of Hamtramck's voting precincts.

The Fire Department gives some summer grilling safety tips (keep grills at least three feet from houses and overhangs, wooden fences, trees, etc.) and the Police Department gives tips on gun safety, as well as numerous other general safety tips (no parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, for example).

There's a reminder to vote in the primary election that's happening on Tuesday, Aug. 2, along with contact info for the Michigan Voter Information Center and the City Clerk's Office.

And there's an email and phone number – mgilginas@hamtramckcity.com / (313) 800-5233 x326 – for getting more involved in the community as a volunteer.

Now let's get out there and enjoy the summer while we can – they don't last forever.

Nearby recycling plant raises more concerns

The recycling plant named US Ecology continues to rack up complaints, the latest one about the odors it emits.

Last week, State Rep. Abraham Aiyash (D-Hamtramck), Congresswoman Rashida Tlaib (D-Detroit), and state Sen. Stephanie Chang (D-Detroit), along with environmental justice groups and activists, hosted a press conference outside the plant, located not far from Hamtramck.

They are demanding that the state regulatory agency the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) keep up its pressure on the plant to comply with its many violations that were issued. They also called for the plant and the City of Detroit to enter into a host agreement.

That agreement would give residents and city officials more say in the plant's operations.

Too often, these types

of undesirable facilities get located in the inner cities of this country – and Detroit is no exception.

These facilities handle very toxic and dangerous items. The fear is that these items will directly affect those living nearby – and that should be a concern for Hamtramck residents as well.

What's of immediate concern is that the plant is emitting noxious odors.

No one wants to live next to something like that.

We applaud those working closely with residents to make sure the public's health is protected.

It should be noted that Tlaib, Aiyash and Chang are all up for re-election this August.

Another issue about waste products in the US is the amount of toxic products we create and consume. There has to

be a sweeping culture change in our consumer habits.

But that is a discussion for another day.

(US Ecology responds: "We respect and listen to any community concerns about site operations. The facility has implemented an EGLE-approved Odor Management Plan for the past year and a half, which has resulted in a substantial reduction in any offsite odors.

"The plan includes neighborhood tours twice a day by facility staff. We've been actively engaged in community meetings for years and remain committed to continued participation.

"We take pride in being a good neighbor and an environmentally responsible solution for customers in our community and are always amenable to conversations around improving our presence within the community.")

The event will be held at the Durfee Innovation Society, 2470 Collingwood St. on the west end of the Boston-Edison neighborhood in Detroit, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

It is co-presented by the Gabriel Music Society and the Motor City STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) Foundation.

Adults may best enjoy the Gabriel Brass Band, the youth ensemble Earfood, or DJ Al Wu. Kids will no doubt gravitate to the bounce house, gaming truck trailers or the hands-on art and science activities.

Hooray For Music (HFM) has donated instruments to Detroit's Renaissance High School in the past, and more recently did the same at Holbrook Elementary here in town.

They claim to have offered up the same to over 16,000 kids in all 50 states, but even more, in 32 countries around the globe.

If this story sounds a bit familiar, it could be because the promoters of the Hamtramck Music Festival also make a yearly donation of instruments to a chosen city school.

Hey, it's a great idea – why not have more than one group doing it?

It all makes us want to whistle a happy tune.

Reminder... Once again, the good folks at Holy Cross Parish are sponsoring a school supply drive for students.

They need all the usual supplies, also including winter coats.

This year's recipients will be the students at Holbrook Elementary School. Any donations would be appreciated. The parish is lo-

cated at Pulaski and Fleming, where you can drop off items.

And by the way, Holy Cross Parish is celebrating its 100th year anniversary, 1922-2022, which also coincides with Hamtramck's 100th anniversary as a city.

A new age of learning: HPS Offers Virtual Learning Institute

COVID-19 brought many changes to the education landscape, and now we realize that some of those changes are here to stay.

To produce the best learning environments for students across Hamtramck, educators at Hamtramck Public Schools launched our newly developed Virtual Learning Institute (VLI), making high-quality education accessible for any student in any situation.

Hamtramck's VLI provides advanced and rigorous courses powered by Pearson, a secure certified online curriculum provider. This allows students to get the equivalent amount of learning exposure to that of an in-person class, all from the learning environment in which they feel most comfortable.

Classes run similarly to Hamtramck's traditional in-person format, with the addition of some newly created STEM courses and elective courses in technology, business and health care. To continue building meaningful relationships and fostering

active participation, students have direct access to their Hamtramck Public Schools virtual teachers, Pearson virtual teachers and classmates through LiveLesson interactive sessions.

In addition, students enrolled in the VLI are still eligible to participate in dual-enrollment college courses, extracurricular activities and sports at HPS, as well as having complete access to school counselors and support staff, ensuring a well-rounded education experience for all scholars.

All students in the Hamtramck area and Wayne County in grades kindergarten through 12 can enroll in VLI. To access the program, students register for a full semester, which includes a month of online training. Class attendance is mandatory, just as it would be if a child were in person. In addition to English courses, Arabic, French and Spanish courses are available to students.

Our first year has been a tremendous success. We asked students who have completed one semester at Hamtramck's VLI to share their experi-




