Mayor Ghalib says the city has rebounded and will grow

Hamtramck's financial picture has made a drastic turnaround in recent years, says Mayor Amer Ghalib.

Recently, Mayor Amer Ghalib spoke at the inauguration ceremony of three city councilmembers, and gave what is basically a state of the city address. At the event, held a few

weeks ago at the Hamtramck Public Library, Ghalib gave a recap of events since he took office two years ago.

Ghalib is the city's first Yemeni-American Muslim mayor in Hamtramck's over 100-year history of being predominantly a Polish enclave.

He said, prior to taking office, that the financial forecasts for the city were dire, with anticipated deficit spending that would eat up the city's budget and possibly lead to a third state-appointed emergency manager to take control of the city.

turned around, he said.



Hamtramck Mayor Amer Ghalib gave a recap recently at the Hamtramck Public Library of what has happened in the city for the past two years, and also what to look forward to in the coming years.

"For the past two years, Hamtramck has achieved a lot of success," he said. "There is so much stability in city hall. There's prosperity, economic growth, population growth as well. And for the first time, two consecutive years of a budget surplus - something that was not in the mind of the most optimistic person."

(In the few years leading That prediction has up to Ghalib taking office, Hamtramck had a budget

surplus but was in deficit spending.)

Ghalib acknowledged that Hamtramck has received \$32 million in various grants since 2023. Some of those grants were in the works before Ghalib took office, and most of them were one-time only.

The mayor said that part of the city's turnaround is based on political stability, enjoyed for many years. Gone are the outbursts of

elected officials and the combative stances some previous councilmembers exhibited.

"That used to be the norm in Hamtramck politics in the past," Ghalib said, of Hamtramck's rough and tumble reputation.

Crime Watch: Incidents of fraud are on the increase

Police Chief Anne Moise says that, during the past year, incidents of retail fraud shot up by a whopping 60 percent.

That was part of her recent yearly overview of what happened with the police department.

Moise did not reveal the number of retail fraud incidents in the city, but the daily crime incident reports issued by the department will typically include one or two such incidents.

It's not every day, but it's a good guess that there have been any-

where from 100 to 200 incidents of retail fraud in the past year. A number of residents reported that they, also, were victims of fraud, which usually are related to online scams.

So, just what is retail

According to the website Fraud.com, it can consist of several aspects. Let's take a look (and here, we quote them):

Return fraud

Return fraud occurs when a customer returns an item for a refund or exchange without a valid reason, often using fake receipts or returning stolen merchandise.

Employee theft

Employee theft is an internal form of fraud that occurs when employees steal from their employer. This can include stealing cash or merchandise, taking unauthorised discounts, or manipulating sales data.

Shoplifting

Shoplifting is a wellknown form of retail fraud where customers steal merchandise from a store without paying for it. Shoplifters may use various tactics, such as concealing items, using large bags, or working in

groups to distract store employees.

Price tag switching

Price tag switching involves placing a lower-priced tag on a more expensive item to purchase it at a reduced

Credit card fraud

Credit card fraud occurs when a customer uses a stolen or counterfeit credit card to make a purchase. This can result in chargebacks and financial loss for the retailer, who may be held responsible for the fraudulent transaction.

Presidential primary **ballots** are out now

You can get a head start on voting in the Feb. 27 presidential primary election.

For those who applied for an absentee ballot, they were mailed out last week, said City Clerk Rana Faraj. You can still request an absentee ballot (commonly called AV ballots).

For those who prefer to vote in-person, early voting begins on Feb. 17 through Feb. 25 in city hall, specifically in the city council chambers on the 2nd floor.

In this primary, you must select either a ballot for the Republican or Democratic candidates. That also applies to those who are independent voters. If you don't specify which party ballot you want, you will not be given one.

This primary in Hamtramck could foretell whether Hamtramck will remain the Democratic stronghold that it has been for decades.

Recently, a number of Muslim voters have said they will not vote for President Biden to be re-elected because of his support for Israel and its invasion of Palestine.

Hamtramck's majority population is now those of the Muslim faith.

Those who have been critical of Biden have not said who, if anyone, they would support for president. However, political observers say that not voting for Biden is basically a vote for former President Trump.

Both Biden and Trump are the presumed presidential nominees for the Democratic ticket and Republican side respec-



Mobile crisis services are on the move

The Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN) is rolling out a dozen mobile crisis units into communities and neighborhoods to help children and adults in cri-

DWIHNs mobile crisis units are staffed by a master's level Clinician and Peer Support Specialist who assists the child or adult through the crisis. Anyone in the Wayne County area regardless of insurance status can call the DWIHN Access



to Care 24/7 Helpline at 800-241-4949 and get a unit deployed to their location.

"As a behavioral health organization, we are always looking for innovative ways to help people right where they are; this is just one more way to serve people in their communities," said DWIHN President/CEO Eric Doeh. "The program is a community-based mobile crisis response team that will go to a person in crisis, regardless of location and get them behavioral healthcare resources they need."

Phase One of the mobile crisis units were deployed mid-December 2023 with the dispatch of four teams, available Monday through Friday from 7am to 3pm for adults only. The mobile crisis teams will eventually provide around the clock services for both children and adults; as trained mental health professionals will provide de-escalation and crisis intervention services. connecting people with the appropriate behavioral health resources.

"Our hope is to rapidly respond by offering immediate community-based intervention. resources and reduce or prevent the need for care in a more restrictive setting," said

In other election-related news, it looks like a proposal to have voters decide on whether to eliminate property taxes in Michigan is gaining momentum.

The state board of canvassers is close to approving language for a petition that would require at least 446,198 valid voter signatures in order to get a ballot proposal in front of voters.

If voters approve the constitutional state amendment, the state would then require shifting more of the state sales tax to municipalities.

The amendment would

also restrict how much the state and local communities could raise oth-

er taxes. There has been some support for eliminating property taxes here in

Hamtramck. Former city council candidate, and former Hamtramck Board of Education member, Nasr Hussain, has been outspoken in his support of eliminating the tax.

If voters do eventually approve the amendment, it would be a devastating blow to Hamtramck's budget revenue. The city's largest revenue collection is from property taxes.

Last year, property taxes generated \$7.6 million for the city.

Property tax payment plans are available now!

Interest Reduction Stipulated Payment Agreement (IRSPA)

This payment plan reduces the interest rate from 18% to 6% for eligible taxpayers. To sign up, you must own and live in your home, and have a Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) and ID that proves residency.

Stipulated Payment Agreement (SPA)

Available to everybody, this plan allows a taxpayer to pay taxes pursuant to a payment schedule. The plan will avoid foreclosure provided that payments are submitted per the agreed upon schedule.

Distressed Owner Occupant Extension (DOOE)

This program is not available to everyone. If you own and live in the property, and are suffering financial hardship you may qualify for this program. Proof of ownership, occupancy, and hardship are required.

Pay As You Stay Payment Agreement (PAYSPA)

Only for those who have first applied for their local municipality's Poverty Tax Exemption (PTE) and received an approval. Once notified by your local Assessor's office and deemed eligible, our office will mail you a notification letter with your Reduced Amount Due. You will have the option of paying a lump sum (additional 10% off) or enrolling into a PAYSPA.
