By Charles Sercombe A federal investigation into an energy savings company has resulted in a \$1 million settlement for the Hamtramck Housing Commission.

In a press release issued by the Department of Justice (DOJ), Siemens Corporation will pay \$1,086,430 to the commission for allegedly issuing false claims.

In 2011, the Hamtramck Housing Commission contracted the corporation to install promised energy-cost-saving devices. The DOJ said the company "relied on inaccurate data in its analysis" in its

By Charles Sercombe A few weeks after getting a job evaluation that said she was "minimally effective," Hamtramck Schools Superintendent Jaleelah Ahmed has taken

a paid leave of absence. The Review obtained an email announcing Ahmed's leave through an anonymous source in the public school district, and confirmed the superintendent's leave through other sources.

Neither the district nor Ahmed offered an explanation for her leave, nor did they say how long the leave will be. However, sources say it could be for as long as two months.

Ahmed did not respond

poorest job evaluation of "ineffective."

That evaluation came after the school board met for three hours in a closed meeting to discuss her yearly job performance. According to sources, it was a heated meeting.

Board Vice President Salah Hadwan took part in that evaluation, but left before the board returned to officially vote on the evaluation in an open meeting.

Boardmembers did not explain their decision.

The decision by the board means that Ahmed will not get an automatic one-year contract extension, nor a "merit" bonus worth \$11,700.

Paczki Day comes early this year, and it's just in time to help scrape away the gray winter doldrums around here.

This coming Tuesday, Feb. 13, is Hamtramck's official city holiday, which is our modest version of Mardi Gras where we can let our hair down, indulge in a fattening paczki, and guzzle shots of "Jezy" (Polish brandy for the uninitiated) and then... well, anything goes.

The point of Paczki Day (also known in religious circles as Shrove Tuesday) is to feast before Lent begins the next day on Wednesday, which means a number of folks will straighten up for 40 days.

To kick the festivities off, once again the Paczki Run will close down a number of city streets at 8 a.m. this Saturday for about five annoying hours.

But seriously, thousands of visitors will be running wild in the streets - well, not "wild," exactly --in order to get in shape for, you guessed it, the beer and booze drinking that starts as soon as the runners and walkers cross the finish line. The race begins at 10 a.m.

"This settlement demonstrates our Office's commitment to protecting the taxpayers' money in any matter where the government ultimately suffers from misconduct by contractors."

Renee Willoughby (Shout out to Renee!), and both are being performed together at Planet Ant.

Yes, about how to buy them! I'll have the new issue for sale at the Planet Ant show, along with back issues, books too, even Stupor T-s and Stupor totes.

Review: Who among the suspects - being, you or The Hinterlands – was the first to turn to Roberto Bolaño's work for inspiration? Is he heavy on crime writing/reportage? Or else, why the crime angle to this show?

Hughes: Before our Stupor collaboration, The Hinterlands (a performance group based in the neighborhood north of Hamtramck) were sketching out possibilities for a piece based on Roberto Bolaño's short novel "Antwerp."

Bolaño is Chilean author. His stories are surreal and poetic, but also deal with some tough subject matter like homicide, crimes of passion, and the weird normalization of disappearances - like one day your neighbor might just be gone - Poof!

The Hinterlands were fascinated by Bolaño's work. It rubbed off on me. Over the course of our collaboration, I read almost all his books. The stories in these new Stupors reflect it.

Review: How did you assemble your cast for this show? Did you hold auditions, or just anoint actors with roles based on know-

ing them from before? Or...?

Hughes: We had auditions at Planet Ant in early December. The brain behind the production belongs to Myles De Leeuw. As a director, she's quick to see what's working and what's not, and skilled and even in correcting whatever problems come up.

Really, I think she's outstanding, so it's very good to be working with her again. Yes, some of the actors who appeared in last year's show are also back for this one. I've been going to the rehearsals, and I have to say, I have a ton of respect for them.

Review: Were there any stories that you heard from interviewees that were too much to handle—we imagine that some of it could just be downright heartbreakingly sad. Did you err toward the comedic or darkly comedic more in choosing which stories to fit into this show?

Hughes: It's true we heard all sorts of stories, but I sure don't remember any that were sad or hard to hear. Sure, some were absurd.

Some felt like... wow... I can't believe you did that, or how is that possible? Of course, we were at the bar collecting the stories. That means, most of us were enjoying ourselves with a drink or two, and most of the patrons we talked to were in good spirits as well.

The stories that appear in "MY SECRET SICK-NESS" and "DISAPPEAR-ING ACT" came from a three night bar-tour of Hamtramck: first Bumbo's. then Painted Lady, and last Outer Limits.

Overall, we collected 45 stories via video camera. I transcribed them and that text became the rough drafts for the ten stories that made it to print and will be performed at Planet

Ant.

Review: Have you started plotting out what's next in the Stupor Universe yet? There are probably all sorts of directions you could go in - embarrassing moments from childhood; animal encounters; feelings about what the afterlife is like; etc.?

Hughes: Next year, 2025, marks 30 years of Stupor, and also 30 years since I've lived in Hamtramck. It's been a good run. I'd like to make a new issue to celebrate the big 3-0.

Review: What's this about last weekend's reading at Book Suey? I heard it ruled!

Hughes: It did rule because Book Suey rules! It was a pre-party event to celebrate the Planet Ant event. I read with poets

and flash-fiction writers from Book Suey workshops.

After the readings, there was a performance by the electo-synth duo that call themselves "o0." Book Suey is an awesome store. I am so happy they decided to open shop here. Also, they happen to have the largest collection of Stupors anywhere in North America. Long live Book Suey!

The reviews are in, and they're already calling it the Hamtramck Literary Event Of The Year! Funny that it's happening right next to the library, where one might guess, not a single Stupor is to be found.

In Our Opinion **Better late than never** for school board

Hamtramck School Boardmembers are talking about tackling a nagging problem among some members: absenteeism.

It's about time.

For some reason, the board has not had a policy regarding the absences of members. Most public bodies have such a policy.

We have never seen a board where members are so cavalier about their duties as elected officials. It certainly doesn't set a good example for students - especially when there is a nationwide problem with students being chronically absent from school.

We suggest that the board settle on a policy that addresses not only unexcused absences, but also limiting the number of excused absences. There is no reason the public should put up with a board

member who misses meetings for most of the year - excused or not. Board President Jihan Aiyash is a prime example of a board member

taking advantage of missing most of 2022 without a public explanation about why she could not attend.

If board members find incapacithemselves tated for one reason or another for a length of time, they should do the honorable thing and resign in order to allow someone else to carry on the duty of making sure our kids get the best education we can offer.

While it's encouraging boardmembers say they should set a policy, there's a cliché that comes to mind: Talk is cheap.

Will boardmembers actually follow through? So far, we have not been encouraged that they mean what they say other than give themselves fat raises at the beginning of this school year and manage to not be able to meet at all for three separate months in 2023.

What is our City Council up to these days? We have the highlights of the latest council meeting.

The city council met on Jan. 9, and all councilmembers were in attendance.

The meeting, the first of the year, started with an appointment of a councilmember to be the mayor pro tem.

At first, there was confusion on when a councilmember can make a motion to nominate a candidate.

But before a nomination was entertained, public discussion was opened up.

then nominated Councilmember Hassan to the position, but that, too, resulted in a tie vote with the mayor once again declining to break the tie.

Councilmember Muhith

"I have to be neutral," he said. "You guys have to work as a team. ... This is personal. I don't want this vote to cost me any animosity."

At this point the city attorney informed the mayor and council that the mayor has to vote and break tie

nation process "was like a charade." He said the mayor was right to remain "neutral."

"The mayor should have never been involved in this one," Meyer said.

Hamtramck Police Chief Anne Moise presented the annual report from her department.





During public discussion, Bill Meyer said he wished more people would attend council meetings and address the council and mayor.

As for the ongoing, regionwide, bike lane project, Meyer said hardly anyone uses the bike lane here in Hamtramck.

"You'll find out it's a total waste of time," he said. "Hamtramck is not ready for it."

Moise later announced her retirement from the department at the end of January, and that this is her last city council meeting that she will attend.

She has been chief for nine years.

"I've had a very rewarding career," Moise said.

Those in the council chamber gave her a standing ovation.

Mayor Ghalib responded: 'We appreciate your service. ... We and the whole community will miss you."

Moise is the first female to be appointed chief in Hamtramck.

The council approved a contract renewal for the services of McKenna Associates to perform inspections of commercial

The project is federally-funded and is called the "Joe Louis Greenway."

According to City Manager Garbarino, hundreds of thousands of dollars have already been spent on creating the initial bike lane here in Hamtramck.

Members of the city's Community Economic De-Department velopment gave an update on what's been done so far here, as well as what the completed project will look like.

The Director of the department Karolynn Faulkner stressed that the overall project will take five to 10 years to complete, but once it does, it's expected it will be used by thousands of people and will be an economic boon to local businesses.

Councilmembers, however, said no one uses the existing bike lane and that all it has accomplished is to remove parking spaces for businesses.





Property tax payment plans are available now!

Interest Reduction Stipulated Payment Agreement (IRSPA)

This payment plan reduces the interest rate from 18% to 6% for eligible taxpayers. To sign up, you must own and live in your home, and have a Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) and ID that proves residency.

Stipulated Payment Agreement (SPA)

Available to everybody, this plan allows a taxpayer to pay taxes pursuant to a payment schedule. The plan will avoid foreclosure provided that payments are submitted per the agreed upon schedule.

Distressed Owner Occupant Extension (DOOE)

This program is not available to everyone. If you own and live in the property, and are suffering financial hardship you may qualify for this program. Proof of ownership, occupancy, and hardship are required.

Pay As You Stay Payment Agreement (PAYSPA)

Only for those who have first applied for their local municipality's Poverty Tax Exemption (PTE) and received an approval. Once notified by your local Assessor's office and deemed eligible, our office will mail you a notification letter with your Reduced Amount Due. You will have the option of paying a lump sum (additional 10% off) or enrolling into a PAYSPA.
