

The front face of the two separate races for

One race is for two seats, each a full term for six years. That race includes incumbents Jackie Starr and Hedy Shulgon. They face five challengers: Jeff Salazar, Moortadha Obaid, Renee Savage, Lamont Stinson and Showkat Chowdhury.

The other race has only incumbent Salah Hadwan, who is running for a par-

Couple face homicide charge in death of toddler

Two Commor St. residents have been charged with the death of a 16month-old girl.

According to investigators and media reports, Hamtramck officers responded to a 911 call last Tuesday about a toddler having breathing difficulties.

The mother of the child, Asia Markham, was in front of her house holding her child. Amina Markham. when officers arrived. The girl was not responding to attempts to get her to breathe.

The child was pronounced dead when she arrived at Children's Hospital in downtown Detroit.

As it turned out, the cause of death was determined to be the result of blunt force trauma.

No other details about how the death occurred have been released.

Markham, 27, and Christopher Scott Olinger, 23, were arraigned in the death of the girl on first degree murder charges as well as first degree child abuse charges. It is believed that Olinger is not the father of the child, but lives with Markham.

Both are being held with no bond in Wayne County Jail until further court proceedings.

"Every community Elec-Commission Michigan holds a Public Accuracy Test to verify the tabulators are working properly," Gitschlag said in an email.

"The day and time of the test is published and they are open to the public. Michigan is a paper ballot state, so there is always a voted-on piece of paper sealed in a case as backup."

Trump supporters are claiming non-citizens will be voting and others will use the names of deceased voters to inflate the vote for Democratic challenger Hillary Clinton.

Gitschlag said there is no way either scenario can play out.

"While we may have deceased individuals on the voter rolls, it takes time for that information to turn around in the system. Zero evidence exists that any of them have ever attempted to vote," he said.

As for non-citizens voting, Gitschlag had this to

"Two or three times a year the Clerk's Office is contacted by Immigration Services to inquire about a green card holder showing up as registered to vote," he said.


"In each and every instance, the individual was registered inadvertently by a local agency without the individual's knowledge. Not one of them ever attempted to vote. If they had, their green cards would be revoked and they would face immediate deportation. The costs far outweigh any benefit."

In other election news, voter turnout next Tuesday is expected to be heavy in Hamtramck upwards of 4,000 voters.

There are already over 600 voters who have voted by absentee ballot. That number is expected to top 1,000.

As of Thursday, the day The Review went to print, the race between Clinton and Trump was neck and neck, although political observers say Clinton had the Electoral College vote pretty much locked

High-speed crash takes the life of two men

Two young men died early Sunday morning after their car slammed into another car at Caniff and Brombach.

The Hamtramck Police Department declined to give details about the incident because the matter is still under investigation. But according to other sources one man was 19 years old and the other was 20 years old.

Both were part of the local Bangladeshi-American community.

Police Chief Anne Moise did release some information on how the crash occurred:

At about 2:30 a.m. a car travelling westbound on Caniff turned southbound on Brombach. As it did, it was struck by the car with the two men who died.

The two men were travelling behind the first car and hit the driver's side of the car at a "high rate of speed," Moise said.

The first car crashed into the Jurkiewicz & Wilk Funeral Home. The two occupants of that car suffered only minor injuries and were able to walk away.

The second car also had a backseat passenger who suffered broken bones, a head injury and several abrasions.

Michigan State Police are helping in the investigation, Moise said.

"The investigation is still ongoing and no further information is available for

dissemination at this time," Moise said in an email on Tuesday.

The owner of Jurkiewicz & Wilk Funeral Home, Mike Wilk, said he was out of state at the time of the crash. He lives above the funeral home.

He said insurance investigators will determine the extent of damages to his building, including whether there is significant structural damage. The car that crashed into the building went through the brick and partly into Wilk's downstairs office.

Wilk said that despite the damage, his business is still operating.



City Hall Insider ...

What is our City Council up to these days? We have the highlights of the latest council meeting.

The city council met on Oct. 11. Before the council meeting a work session was held.

During that meeting Kathy Angerer, the Director of Community and Government Affairs, said the city is undertaking a pilot program in which it will purchase 11 properties from Wayne County that were going to be auctioned off.

(Editor's note: The city's purchase was later adjusted to 10 properties.)

The houses were foreclosed because the owners failed to pay property taxes.

Angerer said the houses will be bid out to developers who will be required to rehab them and sell them to people who will live in them. The properties will not be allowed to be rented out.

The cost to the city is \$46,000, but that will be recouped by developers who buy and rehab the properties. Angerer said this program will ensure the houses will get back on the tax rolls. Previously, she said, bidders would buy the properties but often never do anything

with them.

City Manager Katrina Powell talked about the city's water rates and the breakdown on the charges city customers receive. The breakdown of the rates can be viewed on the city's website.

She added there will be a study performed on the rates to make sure the city is charging the appropriate amount.

She noted that no one in city hall knows how the rates were determined.

Powell also said that the city is applying for a dis-

tressed city grant, worth \$2 million, that will be used to fund the second phase of the city's sewer repair project.

Regarding another issue, Powell said some residents are ignoring barricades on streets that are about to be paved. She said this has disrupted repairs. Some residents have almost hit workers while driving around barricades.

"Yes, it's an inconvenience for a couple of days but you're getting a new street," Powell said.

Councilmember lan Perrotta asked about ticketing cars parked on streets where there are "no parking" signs to allow street cleaning.

City Manager Powell said the city has no ordinance prohibiting parking, which is something former District Court Judge Paul Paruk pointed out.

Councilmember Saad Almasmari questioned how many of the city's fire hydrants are not working. He said he heard there were eight not functioning.

"It's supposed to be zero," he said.

In the regular meeting, a spokesman for the Regional Transit Authority

urged voters to support an upcoming millage on the Nov. 8 ballot. The millage would expand public transportation.

The cost would be an extra \$96 a year for homeowners. The millage will be voted on in four counties, including Wayne.

The millage, the spokesman said, will "create a regional economy."

During the public comment section, a housing discrimination plaintiff asked if there was a point person in the city he could talk to about the plaintiffs' complaints about recent

District court now offers online ticket pleas

Rather not testify in person for that pesky Hamtramck traffic violation? Just make your court appearance in cyberspace.

has launched a computerized system originating from the University of Michigan Law School that allows accused traffic violators to resolve their tickets electronically.

that not everyone has the option of taking time from work or school to come to court to address a traffic ticket," 31st District Court Judge Alexis Krot said.

"The online resolution The 31st District Court system provides an alternative method for drivers to have a ticket reviewed by the city attorney without having to make a trip in person to the courthouse," Krot said.

The system, dubbed "The court understands Matterhorn, walks individuals through a series of qualifying questions and allows them to submit their position online as if they were in court.

The information goes to the city attorney, who reviews the case and decides whether or not to offer individuals alternative charges.

Krot said the online system fits in well with the court's mission to better serve its customers.

"Offering online resolution of traffic tickets fits squarely with the court's larger goal of improving customer service by seeking new and innovative ways of conducting business," said Krot.

Exceeding Your Expectations

Court Innovations Inc., an Ann Arbor-based software company that originated in the University of Michigan Law School, developed the Matterhorn platform.

Court Innovations Inc. CEO MJ Cartwright applauded Hamtramck's efforts to serve up justice in a more efficient and timely manner. With the new system drivers can now access the court 24/7 using their smartphone, tablet, or computer and quickly resolve their minor traffic violations.

The online ticket resolution system allows courts to handle many types of high-volume infractions completely online, saving time and money for citizens and courts

"Across the board, when courts adopt Matterhorn, the time for a case to be resolved drops dramatically, and citizen satisfaction with the courts imsignificantly," proves Cartwright said.

The 31st District Court is one of 18 district courts across Michigan offering this online option, including six courts in Metro Detroit.

Motorists who have recently received a civil traffic infraction violation in Hamtramck can visit www.courtinnovations.com /MID31 to resolve the matter online.



housing assessment increases.

Councilmember Anam Miah said city officials can't discuss the matter because there is an ongoing lawsuit. City Attorney Travis Mihelick advised the plaintiffs to talk with their attorney.

"We don't trust our attorney," the plaintiff said.

"It's a big issue for the entire state," she said. "The reality is we have to pay off \$5 million in five years."
