This Saturday offers a unique opportunity to do your holiday shopping and support local entrepreneurs.



qualification After matches ended Saturday afternoon, Holbrook sat in the #2 seed position with a perfect 5-0 record. They competed against 36 teams from around the state.

Kosciuszko's rookie team also represented Hamtramck Schools very well, qualifying in the rank of 11th with a record of 3-2. Moving into the elimination matches Kosciuszko ended up losing to the #1 seeded alliances in the semifinals. ending an outstanding performance from the rookie team

The Holbrook team continued its winning performance, ending up in the finals playing a very strong #1 alliance. After 2 very completive matches (best 2 out of 3), Holbrook came out on top winning the event and qualifying to represent Hamtramck this weekend in Battle Creek at the State FTC Championship.

Not only did the teams from Hamtramck perform well on the field they also continued to impress in the judging room. Holbrook's team won the Rockwell Collins Innovate Award,

This is a description of the award: The Rockwell Collins Innovate Award celebrates a Team that thinks outside the box, and has the ingenuity and inventiveness to make their designs come to life. This judged award is given to the Team that has the most innovative and creative Robot design solution to any specific components in the FIRST Tech Challenge game. Elements of this award include elegant design, robustness, and "out of the box" thinking related to design.

This award may address the design of the whole Robot, or of a sub-assembly attached to the Robot. The creative component must work consistently, but a Robot does not have to work all the time during Matches to be considered for this award.

The Team's Engineering Notebook must include journal entries to show the design of the component or components and the Team's Robot to be eligible for this award. Entries must describe how the Team arrived at their solution.

Kosciuszko's team won the Control Award, Mastering Robot intelligence. This is a description of the award: The Control Award celebrates a Team that uses sensors and software to increase the Robot's functionality on the field.

This award is given to the team that demonstrates innovative thinking in the control system to solve game challenges such as autonomous operation, immechanical proving systems with intelligent control, or using sensors to achieve better results on the field.

To some in the Detroit area, Hamtramck itself may seem like a throw-

People often think of the city in terms of the past. Perhaps they grew up in, or around. Hamtramck. Maybe they used to come here for the many bars, clubs or restaurants that have long been such a part of the city's fabric.

Judging by their name, Woodward Throwbacks clearly isn't shy about letting people in on their love of civic nostalgia. Now occupying the former Garrity Dodge Dealership, last known as Al Deeby Dodge, the 24,000-square-foot two-story building is open to the public as a source of salvaged, repurposed lumber, hardware and unique functional furniture pieces, barware, wall art and more.

You have a great chance to get to know the creative team of Kyle Dubay and Bo Shepherd at their first-ever Hamtramck Open Market

Night this Saturday (Dec. 16) from 6-11 p.m.

They'll have a couple breweries serving up suds, a couple of food trucks slopping out chow, and a DJ. There will also be roughly 45 artists, as well as some vintage clothiers, set up to peddle their wares. Just in time for lateterm Christmas shopping.

The old Garrity-Deeby building, which had sat empty for the previous halfdozen years, features a high-ceilinged street level floor and a standard height

second floor, a design befitting its former use. The roof is also accessible, and there has been talk of installing AstroTurf, if it hasn't happened already.

In all, visitors can look forward to ample space for the gathering, and a wide selection of potential gifts, from large to stocking-filler

Woodward Throwbacks is also proactively offering both workshops and internships for people interested in learning creative woodworking. Their webbacks.com, has a link on its page to a couple of upcoming Wednesday evening classes.

On Jan. 24, come in and build yourself a record crate to take home. Or, choose to build your pet a food-and-water combo on Feb. 7.

The classes are inexpensive and informal. The reasonable fee includes materials. the use of tools, and instruction. Refreshments and snacks are provided, and you can bring your own beverages too. Wink, wink.

For many, it will be a pleasure to see a company that makes products from repurposed materials, in a repurposed building, in a city that seems to be repurposing itself daily, growing and evolving.
