#### Rogue tow truck driver is on the loose

Watch out when parking in private parking lots.

What's being called a "gypsy" tow truck operator has been possibly illegally hooking up cars that are parked in business lots that have signs designating parking is for customer only.

The operator is working after business hours and apparently without permission from business owners.

So far it is believed to be just one tow truck driver cruising the city looking for cars to tow. Cars have been towed from the CVS lot where patrons at Bumbo's bar were parked, as well as the lot belonging to US Fish and Chicken and Three Star Bar-B-Cue.

On Saturday, several customers who parked in the US Fish lot to grab an order of paczki at New Martha Washington Bakery were forced to pay the tow driver \$400 to get their cars released.

Sue Briskey, who owns Suzy's Bar, witnessed the encounters.

"The tow truck driver was circling the area like a shark," she said.

Police are asking anyone who has paid to get their car released to make a report.

City Manager Katrina Powell said the city attorney is looking into the matter to determine if the tow truck operator has violated any law.

Powell said if you find your car hitched by a tow truck operator after business hours and the driver demands cash on the spot to call 911 for police assistance.

The matter is now forcing the city administration to draw up an ordinance that regulates tow services. Powell said she was surprised to find out that the city doesn't have an ordinance on the matter.

nets for positive regional and national media attention, and they deserve it. These are two classic and timeless Jos. Campau stores.

Walking into either of them is like going back to the 1960s, the 1970s or 1980s, you pick the decade. They have survived, unlike others that sadly did not - Oaza and New Deluxe come to mind - and at this time of year they thrive.

At P.L.A.V. Post 10, the party was going on two floors. Bands were playing on the upstairs stage, downstairs it was karaoke and food by Srodek's in the back kitchen. I had the "hybrid" - smoked and fresh kielbasa with a heap of sauerkraut on a submarine sized bun, juiced up even more with white horseradish and yellow mustard.

A sandwich of pure genius, one of the best I've had in, well, forever.

Back outside the snow was coming down a bit harder, an appropriate wintry contrast to the clear skies and low-40 temps experienced on Saturday for the 5K Paczki Run. That event was organized by Tour de Troit and supported by dozens of local and Detroit-area sponsors. More than 2,500 runners and walkers (including dogs) took part in this year's race, an ideal way to expand the celebration beyond eating and drinking.

Making my way south, I ran into Alissa Shelton, who with her family is renovating the former Golden Hill restaurant at Jos. Campau and Caniff. Before that, it was the Martha Washington Bar. Originally, it was the Merchants & Mechanics Bank of Hamtramck.

There is some fascinating history here. I got a brief tour but plan to be back when work is further along. The plan is for a versatile space that can host events supporting ideas and actions to better community life, including exploring ways to fill more main street storefronts.

Sounds great. We will check in again here at a later date.

Across Jos. Campau, I popped into Detroit Threads, where owner Mikel Smith was hosting an afternoon and evening filled with DJ talent. Before moving on, I flipped through the "Synth/New Wave" record bins. Mikel has tons of vinyl of all kinds, not just the house and techno music he is best known for.

It was only about 2 p.m. but the tent in back of Whiskey in the Jar was predictably jammed. I squirmed in and quickly slid out when I could only get halfway into the performance area, then left to see about some paczki-inspired chocolates at Bon Bon Bon.

My last stop was at Bumbo's, where owners

Brian and Tia Fletcher Krawczyk have created an environment that can fit every occasion. I celebrated my birthday there last summer. We held our Public Pool holiday party at Bumbo's in December. The food pop ups have all been incredibly good, a model that can be, and I'm sure will be, used by other forward thinking local bar owners in the future.

I had a bowl of homemade kielbasa and bacon in kapusta, another perfect Paczki Day meal. I looked to the stool on my right and saw that Mayor Karen Majewski was sitting down.

As we normally do, we talked of the city as it is today, about proposals and projects planned for the near future, how opportunities seem to be accelerating as spring and summer approaches. We swapped stories of developments rumored or in the pipeline, then swore ourselves to secrecy until they are ready to be announced.

It was not only a good talk with the mayor on a great day for Hamtramck, but it was one where momentum for more positive growth was as thick in the air as the falling snow.

## Southend landmark bar is now up for sale

One of Hamtramck most venerable bars is up for sale.

According to a listing service that only real estate brokers can access. realcomponline.com, the southend bar is being listed for \$600,000, which includes the liquor license.

New Dodge is owned by Lew Gordon, the husband of former City Councilmember Cathie Gordon. When called about the listing, Cathie Gordon reacted in surprise.

"It is?" she said when told the bar is listed for sale. "You should call my husband. That's what happens when you live in Hamtramck and he lives in Sterling Heights."

Several years ago Gordon said she moved out of her Sterling Heights home to live with her mother. She said at the time that she had not separated from her husband.

The issue came up when there was serious doubt that she actually lived in the city while serving on city council. Gordon served one-and-a-half terms and then chal- just as Paczki Day was

lenged Mayor Karen Majewski for the mayor's job. She lost that election and a subsequent challenge a few years later.

Lew Gordon did not return calls for comment, but Cathie Gordon later called back.

She said she and her husband had been thinking about selling the bar and "testing the water" to see if anyone would be interested.

"We're both getting up in age," Gordon added.

The listing also says that employees at the bar are unaware of the sale.

News of the sale came

about to take place. New Dodge attracts one of the largest crowds for the yearly celebration. The bar has also showcased numerous local and national rock acts.

Several years ago Gordon received a DDA grant to redo the bar's façade, which now features a huge window.

The 5,000-square-foot bar is located at 8848 Jos. Campau. Besides serving up drinks, the bar offers hamburgers for sale. New Dodge's layout is a rarity in Hamtramck, featuring an upstairs area to view bands and to sit.

#### Flint, Michigan, black ashes, mortality and Lent

Ventline A walk up or down Caniff or Joseph Campau Avenue in Hamtramck, Michigan Wednesday may surprise some passersby who glance at the blackpalm-tree-branch-burntash-smeared foreheads of the faithful who are freshly marked with the cross-shaped ashen reminder of their mortality at the nearby Queen of Apostles Church on Conant, or, Saint Florian Church only blocks away from Jos. Campau.

For millions of Christians, including Catholics across the universe, a 40-day penitential season of Lent starts this week through Holy Thursday evening of the week when the same believers will celebrate Easter Sunday at the end of next month. An Old English word,

"Lencten," means "springtime." It is a time of intense praying, fasting from foods and meats on charitable giving, and, forgiving others more in this trek that is similar to the 30-day period of Muslims, called Ramadan. Additionally, the prophet Joel in the ancient Hebrew Scriptures warns old testament Bible readers, among others, to blow a trumpet, proclaim a fast, and, to call the assembly together.

While making my usual routine Monday afternoon through the 2.2 square-mile and diverselypopulated town nestled between Highland Park and Detroit, long lines of people from Waterford, New Haven, Shelby Township, and Harrison Township, for example, formed

in and around the lone two historic Polish-American bakeries blocks apart on Jos. Campau.

They aimed to get their hands on the traditional jelly-filled Paczki pastry to eat on "Mardi Gras" Tuesday just before the Ash Wednesday rigor of forgetting about such treats for four weeks. Christians intend to focus on the living, suffering and dying of Jesus the Christ, the Son of God, they claim, and, their guide, who came to show them the "way the truth and the life," and, to save them from the grip of sin and death, they believe.

"Do they have ashes sprinkled on those Paczki (pronounced ponsh-kee)," I asked aloud as cheerful noticed crowds Roman collar tight around

my neck, and tucked beneath my burgundy and black-lined scarf.

"No!" one blond-haired lady yelled back, "but they have lemon, prune, raspberry, and more," she concluded as checked off a long-narrow sheet with a long yellow lead pencil to mark off her order of a dozen or more of the sugar-highvolume cakes.

"The line is up front, Father Ventline" one elderly man blurted out, obviously aware of my visits "street evangelizing" that Polish passerby dubbed as my weekly work, as I made my way to the other bakery where even longer lines circled the corner and blocked traffic. After bit of friendly conversation there, I moved on.

Finally, on my way to the Polish Market across the street, I thought of the toxic neglect of the Flint River, and, how residents there in that that automobile city would observe Lent now that they have been exposed to contaminated drinking water for more than a year, according to some reports.

The children came to mind where the health risk strikes the mainly poor and largely African-American residents. An emergency manager approved the decision to draw water from the polluted Flint River in April of 2014, while another EM, a year later, vetoed a seven-to-one vote by Flint's city council who urged the immediate return to the Detroit water system.

After all, at Easter, many of those believers will watch water pour over the heads of the newly-

claimed Christians who are baptized or received into the church after their year-long formation in the faith, and, adults, and, infant children's parental attraction to have their kids join the Christian community.

Will the water still be orange-colored and contaminated, I wondered? Did race play a role in the decisions to save money in Flint? Could that happen in Dearborn, Ferndale or Birmingham? What if local officials who live in Flint made the final determination to shut off the flow of Detroit's water? Would the story end in such horror?

While I drove home after my few-hour trek through another troubled town along Detroit's borders, I thought about misery, mercy, and more. My own personal plans for Lent suddenly sobered me all over from heart and soul to saddened reasoning. With a bowed head before I laid my head on my bed pillow late Monday night, I thanked God for priceless water, for Flint, and for what may be a Lent that seems longer than usual, at least for my acquaintances in Flint, Michigan.
