Quick Hits

It's tax season. Yes, that's nothing to celebrate about, but the city administration is trying to ease the pain for you. Here's a word of warning, says the city's Income Tax Department: If you have a company, person or friend prepare your tax return be "vigilant." Hamtramck officials have this to say to every tax preparer: "As the tax season gets busier, it becomes much more difficult to serve taxpayers efficiently if tax returns are missing information. A complete tax return includes attaching all W-2 statements and copies of all relevant federal schedules to the Hamtramck Tax return.

"This includes page one of the federal form 1040. It can also include a copy of the federal Schedule C, federal Schedule D, or federal Schedule E, depending upon the situation. It also includes attaching another city's tax return, such as Detroit, if the client is claiming a tax credit. "Be sure to carefully review your client's Hamtramck returns before they are submitted to the Income Tax Department."

Search for new city manager put on hold until charter is changed

It looks like Hamtramck won't have a permanent city manager in place for at least several months.

At a special meeting Monday evening, a bare majority of city councilmembers rejected hiring the only candidate recommended for an interview by the city's search firm.

Former Sterling Heights and Eastpointe city manager Stephen Duchane was questioned for two hours in a hot and steamy council chambers before a vote was taken.

The city's search firm, GovHR, prepared 18 questions and four options on what action to take after the interview. Those options included:

- Hire the candidate.
- Request to interview

the two candidates who were not recommended for an interview.

- Re-advertise for the position.
- "Pause" the search until the city charter qualifications are modified.

Duchane was one of 38 people to apply for the job. Only three met the city charter qualifications, which the search firm said limited the field of candidates.

Soon after the interview, Councilmembers Anam Miah, Saad Almas-mari, Abu Musa and Fadel Al-Marsoumi chose the fourth option to delay the search until the charter requirements are changed.

That action will require voter approval, which at the earliest can happen in the August Primary Election coming up. Their vote caused friction with Councilmem-

bers Ian Perrotta and Andrea Karpinski as well as Mayor Karen Majewski, who all said Duchane, who has 37 years of experience in municipal ad-

ent exasperation. Duchane, she added, “would have won hands down” against any other candidates. Councilmember Karpinski was blunt in her opposition to waiting for a charter change, saying the vote to delay was a “stall tactic.”

She said rejecting Duchane and waiting for a charter revision will make state officials “look at us as a joke.”

Hamtramck is still under the supervision of a state-appointed Receivership Transition Advisory Board. That board has final say in all expenditures and contracts.

The city has been seeking to have local control returned.

The four councilmembers who voted to wait for a charter change argued the city needs to consider more than just one candidate.

Councilmember Miah, who proposed waiting for a charter revision before continuing a search for a city manager, said he is seeking for a candidate who has a “Hamtramck vibe.”

“I didn’t hear that today,” Miah said. “To fix the charter, a couple of months are not going to

hinder us.”

Tensions rose to the point where Councilmember Perrotta abruptly announced he had to leave, and as he walked out, Councilmember Karpinski and Mayor Majewski joined him.

There was still a quorum remaining, and Miah, the Mayor Pro Tem, took over chairing the meeting.

He said before the vote that while there was not a total agreement, this is how government operates.

“Sometimes you come up short... but the process of democracy must prevail,” Miah said. “The majority rules.”

Right before the vote was taken Councilmember Perrotta returned to take his seat. He voted against delaying a hiring.

Perrotta “admitted” he should not have walked out. He called the vote “short-sighted.” Perrotta suggested earlier that the council should wait until the next council meeting to vote on the matter in order to process the interview and the options.

After the vote Mayor Majewski also returned. She said the vote was part of a “clear agenda ... an unspoken plan that some councilmembers are privy to and others are not.”

She did not elaborate on her comment.

CRIME WATCH... GRAFFITI

Graffiti is not commonly thought of as a crime.

Most folks think of it as blight.

Well, it's both.

A week or so before Paczki Day, three prominent buildings in the central Jos. Campau business district were marred by graffiti.

Police Chief Anne Moise told The Review witnesses said there were two men seen spraying the graffiti with white paint. The graffiti is indeed in white paint.

The defacing of the buildings caused concern about the overall appearance of the city as it braced for thousands of visitors coming into town for Paczki Day.

Acting City Manager Kathy Angerer said there was little the city could legally do to make sure the graffiti was quickly removed.

"The property owners were the victims," she said.

There is a time limit, however, on how long the graffiti can remain. Still, the city has little legal muscle other than to ticket the property owner.

Angerer said she would like to toughen up the city's graffiti ordinance.

"We need to do something with that ordinance," Angerer said.

As it turned out, the owner of the former Shopper's World immediately removed the graffiti.

The owner of the building at Jos. Campau and Belmont – the tallest building in the city's main business district – agreed to clean off the graffiti.

The city issued a ticket to the owner of the building at Trowbridge and Jos. Campau because that person could not be contacted.

According to Wayne County Treasurer's property records, there is no person listed as an owner. The building was last used as a bar, known

as the Trowbridge House of Coffee.

In another crime trend, Police Chief Moise said there have been a "couple" of purses being stolen out of cars. The purses were in plain sight on the passenger seat of the cars.

Here's the unnerving part:

When women were getting out of the car, Moise told us that the suspect "opened the passenger door stealing the purses."

The suspect is described as a black male of medium build.

The latest incident happened on Wednesday morning, a little after 8 a.m., near Whalen St.

Moise gave this advice for everyone:

"I advise that people be aware of their surroundings and to keep a close hold on their belongings, especially purses," she said.

stored by the work crew as well. The new color highlights the exhibits much better, according to the Museum's missive.


