house. Instead of simply razing an abandoned structure, teams of laborers dismantle valuable parts of a house that can be used to build new housing or make improvements to existing housing.

This method is more costly than knocking down a structure, but it employs more people and reduces the need to purchase new lumber. Plus the items saved are usually choice pieces of wood that are hard to come by and fetch a good price.

Hamtramck has seen a dozen or so houses dismantled in this fashion.

Locals pitch in to help Flint residents with water crisis

Hamtramck recently joined dozens of other cities that are helping Flint residents survive their water crisis.

During the past few weeks there have been a handful of water bottle drives and deliveries from here to Flint. Councilmember Anam Miah made a delivery as well as the folks at Al-Haramain International Foods.

Councilmember Saad Almasmari delivered over 22,000 bottles of water.

Recently, the Common Word Alliance kicked in its share - a 53-foot-long tractor trailer stuffed with pallets of bottled water. The water was donated by former Hamtramckans who now own a trucking firm, Velic Transportation.

The company also donated a truck and service of a driver to deliver the water.

The driver, Elvedin Paric, emigrated from Bosnia 20 years ago, said the company was moved by an old saying in Bosnia.

"Your neighbor is more

important that your own brother."

How's that?

"Because if your house catches on fire who are you to run to? Your neighbor," he said.

While many in the state are pitching in, the water crisis continues to haunt Gov. Rick Snyder's administration. It was his administration that ultimately made the decision to switch from Detroit's water service to activating Flint's old water system. That switch was not

properly done and subsequently Flint's water supply became contaminated with lead.

There has been plenty of outcry in the state and nationwide.

Hamtramck Mayor Karen Majewski was one of those who lashed out. On Facebook, she responded to some who said the crisis was the fault of Flint elected officials even though the city was under the control of an emergency manager at the time the water crisis developed.

"This is infuriating. Under emergency management, EVERY DECI-SION is under state control through the governor-appointed emergency manager and the Department of Treasury," Majewski said.

"The city can't do ANY-THING on its own and is subject to the whims and the competence or incompetence of its particular EM. State of Michigan, vou were the ONLY and the FINAL authority in Flint and other cities under emergency management. You own this one and you did from day one. How dare you try to blame those whose authority you yourself appropriated."

In Our Opinion

For the sake of the city's future, we must transition

Last week we discussed where the city is headed regarding the return of local control from the state.

It's been a year now that a state-appointed Transition Advisory Board has been in charge of overseeing the city finances. During this time it was presumed the city would have moved forward in transitioning back to local control.

The former emergency manager left in December 2015 with a number "final directives" aimed at reaching that goal of local control.

Unfortunately, we have seen scant evidence of this transition.

We are not pointing fingers at anyone for this predicament, but we are asking someone to step up and take control of this process. Hamtramck is no longer suffering from a financial crisis nor is it in deficit spending.

The EM came in and made needed changes to existing labor contracts that elected officials did not have the legal muscle to force happening. The city needed that surgical strike the EM law afforded.

But state officials noted that part of the reason the city suffered a financial crisis stemmed from the city's toxic political culture. The state insists that has to change.

One place that starts is in offering education programs for elected officials on how to govern and run a city. Some of our elected officials have made good on that EM directive, while others have

This is a crucial first step in regaining local control. If you ran for office, this was part of the deal, and those who have ignored the directive are doing a disservice to the community.

Regardless of how cooperative local officials are, in two years the current governor will be termed out of office. Someone new will be stepping in, and we're sure that a review will be made of those cities that are still under the eye of

The oversight can't go on forever.

We are starting off in a new year, and we need to see more cooperation between the council and the city manager. Again, we're not finger-pointing, but the transition process must start to become more visible.

We can't afford to just bide our time and wait for the state to pull out. If we don't learn how to get along and manage our affairs, Hamtramck is doomed to repeat history.

We're pretty sure having the state intervene for a third time won't go well.


