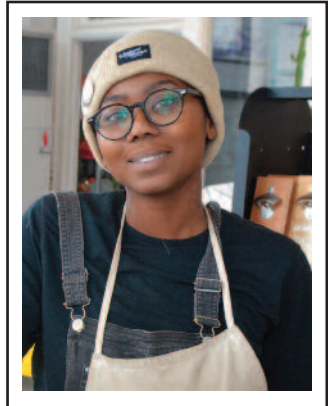

Hamtramck’s very own holiday kicks off this Saturday.

At 10 a.m. the annual 5K Paczki Run starts at Jos. Campau just south of Holbrook (in front of the Motor City Bar).

After the run, which is sponsored by Tour de Detroit, the fun continues at the Downtown Development Authority’s Countdown to Paczki Day in heated tents set up in the Hamtramck Town Center parking lot.

Inside, you’ll get free paczki and enjoy live polka music. Thousands of runners and spectators have been turning out for both events.



Local bakeries will be jammed with paczki lovers this coming Tuesday. The wait can sometimes stretch for over two hours. You can beat the rush on Paczki Day by picking up your dozen on Monday.

The Mardi Gras spirit continues on Tuesday, Feb. 13 – Paczki Day. Once again, thousands of people will be walking the city streets to buy their dozens of paczki at local bakeries.

The day is also a huge revenue stream for local bars, many of which host live music.

A crowd favorite is watching the paczki eating contest hosted at PLAV Post

CM search leading to charter change

Some 39 people applied to be Hamtramck’s next city manager.

But only three met the city’s charter requirements, and only one is being recommended to interview for the job.

That was the result of a search performed by a private company called GovHR USA. The city council and mayor were presented with the findings at a special meeting held on Monday.

The lack of candidates to interview led to some anguish among councilmembers, and they are

10, in the upstairs hall. That starts at noon, and lasts an agonizing 15 minutes. In the past, the winner has eaten upwards of 20 paczki.

Don't think too hard on that.

Also later at Post 10, Hamtramck favorites Danny D plays at 4 p.m., and the Polish Muslims play their third and final set at 6:30 .m.

The Polish Muslims kick off the day at 10:30 a.m. at the New Dodge Bar, and then move the party over to Whiskey in the Jar at 2:30 p.m.

Post 6, at 9545 McDougall, will be open at 10 a.m. on Saturday to accommodate runners from the 5K, and on Paczki Day the bar opens at 9 a.m. where they say you can “enjoy your Paczki Day in comfort.”

You can start your day really early at the Moose



Paczki festivities kick off on Saturday (Feb. 10) with the 5K Paczki Run. The run starts at 10 a.m. on Jos. Campau just south of Holbrook. After the run you can enjoy free paczki in a heated tent located in the Hamtramck Town Center parking lot.

Lodge, located at 9421 Conant. Starting at 7 a.m., they'll be serving up egg souffle with kielbasa and paczki. DJ "Chuck E" will be spinning tunes. Admission is super cheap at \$6 with proceeds going to the

Hamtramck Goodfellows. Over at Trixie's Bar on Carpenter just south of Jos. Campau the bar will open at 4 p.m. on Tuesday, featuring “Jezy” (Polish brandy, also known as “stupid juice”) specials, food, open mic comedy and karaoke.

Small's Bar, at Caniff and Conant, also opens early at 10 a.m. and will once again offer up their “paczki bombs.” If you have not heard of this before, just take a guess, considering this is a bar and they are offering paczki.

Yes, you guessed correctly, it's a booze-infused paczki.

The bar also has a fantastic line-up of bands. One of the highlights is Polka Floyd, which again if you are guessing what that is, it's a polka band playing Pink Floyd tunes.

Community groups take a creative approach to battling litter

Tired of seeing trash in the streets of Hamtramck? The folks at the 3C7 Block Club in Hamtramck’s northwest corner were tired of it too. Then they came up with a clever solution. But let’s back up a moment.

The Hamtramck Community Initiative, or HCI, is a civic activist group that all residents should know. Per their website, their overriding mission is to help create and ensure a “safe, clean and vibrant Hamtramck.”

Their “Weed and Seed” project, begun more than a decade ago, serves as a focal point for block clubs and oversees the city’s important Community Patrol.

Their intern for 2016, Naheda Begum, through Wayne State University’s Social Work school, researched the phenomenon of litter in the city. It was her conclusion that engaging youth was an important aspect in creating and maintaining neighborhoods.

During July and August of that year, HCI and the 3C7 block club (the

blocks in question being those bounded by Carpenter south to Caniff, and I-75 east to Jos. Campau) teamed with the H.O.P.E. Summer Program Middle School (the acronym stands for

Hamtramck Odyssey Project for Excellence, a three-pronged school enrichment initiative) to have students design and paint half-a-dozen garbage cans.

These cans were then

placed at logical locations within the block club’s range. Several local businesses, among them recognizable names like Steve’s Party Store, Caniff Grocery, Sam’s Market and USA Party Store, were asked to oversee the cans upon their installment.

This responsibility involved allowing the cans to be chained to their physical building or a nearby light post, emptying the cans when full, and politely reminding customers to use them to keep the area clean.

Metro news...

It's said that whatever happens to Detroit, so goes Hamtramck. Our friends over at modelmedia.com have been reporting on fascinating development projects for the past several years.

With their permission, here is an edited version of this week's story:

Heads-up Hamtramck, here's an idea from our neighbor, Detroit, that's worth making happen here as well:

The city of Detroit has

issued itself an important, albeit monumental task: make sure every rental property in the city is up to code. On Feb. 1, an initiative began to have landlords renovate their rental properties to make them follow all of the city's regulations and safety standards.

The initiative started in the 48215 zip code near the Grosse Pointe border, which will undergo a six-month compliance period. Landlords have until

May 1 to register their rental properties.

Properties will then be inspected to assess renovation plans and receive a certificate to confirm the compliance period, which begins Aug. 1.

The city plans to add a new zip code approximately every month for inspection. After the zip code 48215 launch begins, the next will be 48224 (March 1), 48223 (May 1), 48219 (June 1), 48209 (July 1) and 49210 (Aug. 1). Information about the rental property repairs will be sent out to residents as the start date nears.

The city will also safeguard renters from a variety of outcomes. For example, landlords will not receive payment from renters if the property has not been registered for the compliance period. If the landlord does not register the property, renters will be granted their money back without being evicted.

And if landlords meet all the guidelines, there will be fewer inspections on their properties.

Public records will be posted on a website to show what properties have been registered and certified.

Touch the past at Holbrook School

in the history of Hamtramck.

There is an argument to be made that Holbrook School is the most historical building in the city today. The story goes back to 1891 when Hamtramck was still a township stretching far into areas of what are now parts of Detroit. But at that time a group of people had settled in the area where Hamtramck is today, mainly near the railroad tracks at the south side of town.

With the new community taking shape the township government gave approval for the building of a school, and

in 1896 or so (the date is not exact) a small wooden school building was erected on land once owned by Dewitt C. Holbrook, who became county clerk.

In 1897 the wooden building was supplemented with the construction of six classrooms in a brick structure. In three years this modest building would play a key role in Hamtramck's history for it was here in 1900 that a group of area residents met and decided to petition the state to form the Village of Hamtramck.

Those old red brick walls witnessed that act

as it happened and remain one of the few places you can reach out and still touch the past dating to that era.

In 1913 Holbrook School was expanded, which included adding a third floor. By then Hamtramck was in the midst of incredible growth as thousands of immigrants were flooding into the community.

With the population exploding, immense pressure was put on the school district, and by the mid-1920s Holbrook School was deemed too inefficient to continue operating. Plus it was called

We have the highlights of the latest council meeting.*

The city council met on Nov. 28, and Councilmember Mohammed Hassan was absent. Before the regular meeting, the council met in a work session.

At that meeting, Councilmember Anam Miah questioned the cost of repairing water shutoff boxes.

He said it costs the city \$1,400 to replace damaged boxes but that amount is usually more than what the customer

owed the city.

Rodney Johnson, the director of public works, said the city can't allow homeowners to keep running up water bills.

now seeking to rewrite the charter requirements.

Even the search firm, GovHR, said the city charter’s requirements “significantly hindered the opportunity to vet additional candidates for the city manager position.”

Seven of the candidates who applied worked in executive positions in cities and counties with populations of over 100,000.

Hamtramck’s charter requires a candidate to have been a city manager or assistant city manager for at least three years in a community with a population of at least 10,000.

Councilmember Anam Miah was the only councilmember to vote against interviewing the lone candidate because he said the city first needs to change the charter.

“We should fix this, even if it puts the process back a little bit,” he said.

Miah added that the city is missing out on a chance to widen the candidate pool.

Changing the charter would require putting it on a ballot and winning the approval of voters.

Councilmember Ian Perrotta said despite the charter’s stringent requirements, the city

needs a city manager in place.

“We need somebody in charge of the ship,” he said.

The previous city manager, Katrina Powell, left at the end of last June. A divided council blocked extending her contract.

Since that time, Kathy Angerer, who had served in several roles in the city administration, has been acting city manager.

Stephen Duchane, a former city manager for Sterling Heights and most recently Eastpointe.

Duchane, 62 years old, was let go from the Eastpointe job last August after serving there for seven years. He has been in the city administration field for nearly 40 years.

The reason for the departure, according to a report in the Macomb Daily, was because a divided city council had a falling out with him. Duchane said the council wanted to “go in a new direction.”

But one councilmember, Cardi DeMonaco, told the Macomb Daily the issue with Duchane had to do with him not following Eastpointe’s bidding process when making purchases.

Duchane has been lauded in his handling of finances, notably turning around Eastpointe’s

budget deficit as well as one in Lincoln Park where he served as city manager.

Duchane has written a number of papers on municipal affairs for the Michigan Municipal League and is part of a lawsuit challenging the state’s interpretation of the Headlee amendment and how tax dollars are distributed to communities.

He says the state is cheating communities out of their fair share of tax dollars.

In a brief interview with The Review, Duchane said he thinks Hamtramck has a bright future.

“It’s a very exciting time for Hamtramck,” he said in regard to the city’s potential for development.

Taking off of the city’s motto, he added: “The world in two square miles is appealing to me.”

a fire trap that posed a danger to the children. In fact, it was not used to capacity because of that fear.

Within a short time of that report being made the building did catch on fire, which destroyed the third floor. In 1929 the building was remodeled and upgraded, minus the third floor. Remarkably it has remained in use ever since.

It has fireplaces and built-in bookshelves that give some rooms a charming feel of the past that remains today. Through the years many persons have served as principal of Holbrook School including E. G. Van Deveneter, Hamtramck’s first superintendent more than 100 years ago, and current superintendent Tom Niczay.

But it’s that link that this is the place where the concept of Hamtramck Village took shape that gives the building its special tie to our history. There’s something wonderful about going to a place where history occurred and physically connecting to the past.

You can do that also at the Hamtramck Historical Museum, 9525 Jos. Campau. Hours are 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday and by appointment. Call (313) 893-5027. And visit the website www.hamtramckhistory.org.

City reaches a fair deal for water bill snafu

Recently, city officials agreed on a deal to settle up on water bills with a few hundred property owners.

What happened was that the city's meter equipment underreported actual consumption of water and sewer services. When new meters were installed, over 300 folks received bills for hundreds of dollars — and in some cases thousands, for service that had not been reported.

Obviously, many folks were upset at receiving that bill.

So, the city administration and city council agreed that the city will eat 60 percent of the corrected bills, and property owners will have to cough up 40 percent of the new bill.

That's a generous solution considering that although the meters were under-reporting water and sewerage usage, that service was actually used.

In other words, property owners are getting a deal.

This episode underscores a disconnect in city hall. How in the world did this problem go undetected for so long?

And by so long we mean this problem could have been going on for several years.

It's mind-boggling to say the least.

A silver lining to this mess is that under the current acting city manager's administration, problems are being fixed. Let's hope whoever gets hired as the new city manager continues to address problems rather than let them linger.

administration will “drill down” on the matter and figure out a way to work with water customers.

A discussion was held on whether the city owes former City Manager Katrina Powell vacation pay. There was some confusion over whether Powell's contract allowed her to pay herself for unused time off.

City Attorney John Clark said that the former emergency manager, Cathy Square, will likely say that the contract she made with Powell includes a payout for unused time off.

Councilmember Ian Perrotta said if the city demands Powell to return the payment, the city will be met with “the middle finger.”

During the public comment portion of the regular meeting, Carrie Beth Lasley said it's unwise to make an issue of Powell's vacation payout.

“It's a very strange message to send at a time you're trying to hire a city manager,” Lasley said.

She said the issue adds to the city's reputation of being petty and a bully.

Later in the meeting Councilmember Miah proposed sending Powell a letter demanding she repay the city.

Miah defended his proposal, saying there is a principle to uphold in spending the public's money wisely.

Councilmember Andrea Karpinski said this proposal will only “put a black mark on our community.”

The proposal failed to gain support.

Attorney Mark Koroι urged the council to find out where the state police investigation into election fraud is heading. He said the city needs to determine if this is a “witch hunt.”

(Editor's note: A spokesman for the state police recently told *The Review* the investigation is still ongoing.)

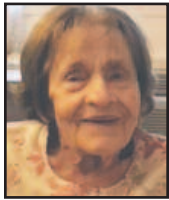
