Paczki Day may be over, but the Hamtramck party continues.

The Hamtramck Music Festival is this weekend, and there are over 180 bands performing and dozens of bars, halls and spaces hosting the annual event.

Check out the back page of this issue for the schedule.

HMF is a family-friendly event with both daytime and nighttime sets, wide-ranging music genres, and a desire to provide a communally-oriented and positive environment for all.

All festival proceeds go to Ben's Encore, a non-profit 501(c)3 that provides instruments, music lessons, and scholarships to aspiring young musicians and underserved school music programs in and around Hamtramck and Detroit.

To enjoy all this it costs only \$10 – good for the entire weekend.

For those visiting here, there will be free and secured parking at the parking lot at Holbrook and Jos. Campau, as well as free venue-to-venue SMART Bus shuttle service.

The shuttle service will run the main route of the festival on March 3 and March 4, from 9 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., to ensure that the festival attendees can catch their favorite bands in a timely and safe fashion.

A highlight this year is a brunch starting at 11 a.m. on Sunday, March 5. Attendees will also have a chance to participate in a free Festival Pop-Up Record Shop and purchase band merchandise from 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. in the upstairs level of P.L.A.V. Post 10.

OK with us, but what an eating machine.

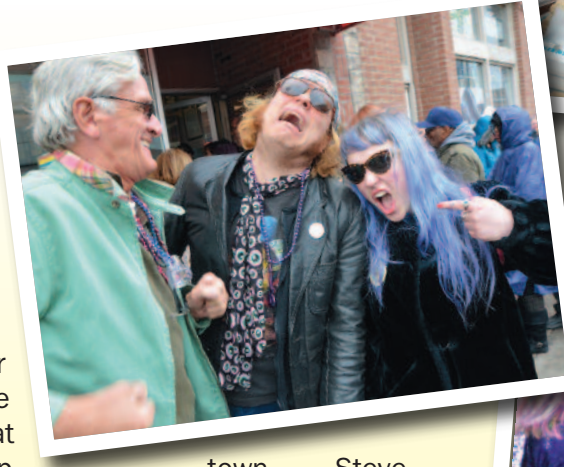
Second runner-up was local scribe about

Mayor says she will seek another term

The guessing is over.

A supporter of Mayor Karen Majewski has announced that she is seeking a fourth term this year.

School Boardmember Salah Hadwan recently posted on his Facebook page that he and School Board Vice President Evan Major are throwing their support behind Majewski, who has served as mayor for 12 years.

"Holding a position in elected office takes hard work, dedication, integrity, and a strong moral compass. This is why we are supporting current Mayor Karen Majewski for her mayoral bid," Hadwan said.

For the past few months Majewski said she has not made up her mind whether to seek re-election.

Majewski confirmed with The Review that she is running for office, saying "there is too much momentum, too much progress, at stake, and I want to make sure that it isn't derailed."

She further said: "With a new term, I plan to continue to support work on our critical infrastructure, as well as some new initiatives in the works that impact our quality of life and attractiveness for residents and investors – including a dog park, bike lanes, and of course the continuing work on Keyworth and Hamtramck Stadium.

Three years later, JC-Belmont building still sits vacant

If the name Dennis Ke-fallinos sounds familiar to Hamtramckans, that's because he has his own real estate issues here.

Real estate tycoon Keefauver has been in the news spotlight this past week when Detroit officials forced the closing of his most well-known building; the 2.2 million-square-foot Russell Industrial Center located off of I-75, just a few minutes south of Hamtramck.

Hundreds of tenants, mostly artists, are being forced to remove their possessions from the building because of numerous safety violations that Kefallinos had been warned about.

Kefallinos has come under criticism in recent years for what some say is his neglect of his many real estate holdings.

Three years ago we reported on Kefallinos buying the four-story Jos. Campau Belmont building, the tallest structure on the city's main business drag. At the time the building's façade was falling off, and the property had to be fenced off so pedestrians would not get harmed.

City officials said Ke-
fallinos planned to cre-
ate lofts on the top floors
and commercial space

on the ground floor.

No work has been done at the site since then, and Kefallinos pays a \$300 yearly fee for keeping the building vacant.

At that time a website called Detroit.curbed.com took a critical look at the building and its owner.

The headline of its article pretty much summed up the writer's opinion of Kefallinos, who owns a real estate development company called Lafayette Lofts, Inc.

The headline read:
“Downtown Hamtramck
Gets a Taste of Kefalli-

nos Neglect.”

The article, written by Paul Beshouri, went on to say:

“As hungry crowds fill Hamtramck’s bakeries for Paczki Day tomorrow, one of the enclave’s most prominent buildings – known on this blog as the HamTower – will remain as gloomy as ever.

"The historic building has continued to decay since being auctioned off by the City of Hamtramck in 2014, with some previously boarded-up windows now open to the elements."

The building was purchased by Lafayette Lofts for \$85,500. For a short while it appeared there was some work being done, at least on the ground floor.

Kathy Angerer, who in 2014 was the city's Director of Community & Economic Development, said she was told window replacement would begin as soon as the "weather breaks."

Beshouri characterized Kefallinos as a “noted property baron” and the owner of “many cheap loft buildings.”

The Review attempted several times to contact Kefallinos but no calls were returned.

Michigan Municipal League's Economic Development & Land Use special committee, so I'll be working with other officials and state legislators on policies that encourage respectful investment in our core urban areas. And I look forward to continuing to tell Hamtramck's story nationally and even internationally, to a world that's clearly interested in how to navigate an increasingly diverse society. We are moving forward, and I want to make sure that that progress accelerates for everybody in Hamtramck."

So far City Councilmember Mohammed Hassan and community activist Kamal Rahman have also said they are interested in running for mayor.

Hassan's term on council ends this year.

This election year features three council seats up for election: Hassan,

and Councilmembers Andrea Karpinski and Ian Perrotta.

Hamtramck's political landscape has become more volatile in recent months. Majewski has often clashed with Councilmembers Hassan, Anam Miah, Abu Musa and Saad Almasmari.

With the election of Al-masmari last year, the city attracted the attention of national and international media outlets about Hamtramck becoming the first community to have a Muslim-majority council.

Majewski was often quoted by news outlets saying there are no ethnic or religious tensions in Hamtramck.

Back when Majewski was first elected the city was transitioning from control by a state-appointed emergency manager. Three years ago, the city once again found itself in another financial crisis and was put under the control of a second

emergency manager.

That emergency manager left her post two years ago after appointing a new city manager. Majewski has been a supporter of City Manager Katrina Powell.

Powell, though, has also been at odds with Councilmembers Hassan, Miah, Musa and Al-masmari, who recently rejected a resolution to begin contract extension negotiations with Powell.

Powell's employment contract ends in June.

In his Facebook page endorsement of Majewski, Hadwan said the mayor has worked “for the best interest of all community members regardless of background, ethnicity, race or religion.”

He further said: "Mayor Majewski has done this for many years, has fought for this city, and is well respected by other elected officials in southeast Michigan."

Top economic challenge for the city: Fill those empty buildings

Empty buildings and storefronts in Hamtramck. That's been a topic of discussion for the last few months. The concern among a number of people is that there are a number of empty commercial properties and storefronts that should be filled.

But the hang-up is that some property owners are being stubborn about renovating their buildings or seeking renters.

The city charges these property owners \$300 a year to register their buildings as being vacant. There is no law that forbids someone from owning a vacant building, but

there are health and building codes that must be met.

On Jos. Campau alone there are a couple dozen empty storefronts. The four-story building at Belmont has remained empty and in need of repair for several years now.

The current owner of that building, Dennis Ke-fallinos, is now in hot water with Detroit over a number of rundown rentals he owns. He has made no indication of what he plans to do with the Belmont building in the coming year. In fact, repeated phone calls to him for comment were unanswered.

It makes you wonder why some folks buy these properties in the first place. And what makes this even more frustrating is that commercial properties in Hamtramck are now fetching a good price because many in midtown Detroit are getting priced out.

The city is currently looking for someone to head up economic development. This is obviously one of the top things that needs to get looked at.

There is so much potential in Hamtramck. It's a shame that a handful of short-sighted property owners are gumming up the momentum here.

Odds & Ends

Metro news ...

It's said that whatever happens to Detroit, so goes Hamtramck. Our friends over at modeldmedia.com have been reporting on fascinating development projects for the past several years.

With their permission, here is an edited version of this week's story:

Hamtramck owners of historic buildings, take note, you can repurpose your building for unique ventures. And make a buck from it.

The Michigan Urban Farming Initiative (MUFI) is looking to strengthen its mission in Detroit's North End neighborhood with the transformation of an abandoned three-story apartment building into a community center. Should MUFI successfully raise \$50,000 through a crowdfunding campaign, the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) will provide a \$50,000 matching grant.

MUFI has been steadily working toward its goal of

building "America's First Sustainable Urban Agrihood" since purchasing land in the North End in 2011. The planned community center, which would offer gathering space and nutritional and educational programming, would join a two-acre urban farm, 200-tree fruit orchard, children's sensory garden, water harvesting cistern, and more. A healthy food cafe and commercial kitchen is also planned.

A non-profit made up of volunteers, MUFI provides more than 300 varieties of produce to approximately 2,000 households, churches, and food pantries within a two-square mile radius of the farm. The produce is free.

The crowdfunding campaign and matching grant is part of MEDC's Public Spaces, Community Places placemaking initiative. MUFI has until Sunday, April 2 to meet or exceed the goal, which is being hosted on the

Michigan-based Patronicity crowdfunding platform.

Auburn Hills-based automotive supplier BorgWarner kicked off the campaign with a \$10,000 donation.

"The Public Spaces, Community Places placemaking grant is a creative way for supporters of the Michigan Urban Farming Initiative to have a hand in helping build America's first sustainable urban agrihood located in Detroit's lower North End community," Tyson Gersh, president and co-founder of MUFI, says in a statement. "Through the program, we can expand our agricultural campus with donations used to fund the restoration of a long-vacant building into the neighborhood's most sustainable Community Center along with a new healthy food café."

Michigan Urban Farming Initiative is located at 7432 Brush St. in Detroit.
