City hall faces a void

In the next couple of months, Hamtramck could be with a skeleton administration.

City Manager Katrina Powell's employment contract will expire on June 30, and so far it doesn't look like it will be extended. A bare majority of councilmembers, Anam Miah, Mohammed Hassan, Saad Almasmari and Abu Musa, have rejected a proposal to extend her contract.

Also lining up for an exit is Mark Ragsdale, the Director of Public Works, Bhama Cairns, the city's Financial Director and Jay Singh, the City Assessor. Already gone is Powell's administrative assistant.

City Treasurer John Gabor's contract is also set to expire on June 30.

What is still unknown is whether the state-appointed Receivership Transition Advisory Board, which oversees all major financial decisions by the city, will step in and extend Powell's contract.


Or, it could be the state Treasury Department will step in.

departure Powell's along with her top administrators will leave a huge void in the city, and also poses a question of who is in line to fill the positions.

Under Powell's leadership the city has turned its financial crisis into a budget surplus of \$3-\$4 million dollars.

The Treasury Department recently warned the city that unless a full-time professional city manager is in place by the time Powell leaves - if she



State still has ultimate authority over city's control

Before any decision is the state had to intermade about who will fill the position of city manager, one thing needs to be kept in mind.

The state-appointed Receivership Transition Advisory Board is still the ultimate decision-maker.

The city has been under the financial supervision of the RTAB for over two years - right after the state-appointed emergency manager left her post here. Hamtramck has been under the state's thumb ever since it cratered into a financial crisis over four years ago.

It was the second time in about 10 years that point if the RTAB can

vene. Some elected officials think they can basically do anything they want - including not extending the contract of City Manager Katrina Powell and instead appoint an interim city man-

Her contract expires this June 30, and it appears a bare majority of city councilmembers are determined to bring in a new city manager.

Hiring a replacement must be approved by the RTAB. The RTAB has said in so many words that it wants Powell to continue on. It's unclear at this

keep Powell on without the cooperation of the city council.

Hamtramck Review

But one thing is clear: It can prevent a replacement from being hired.

This is a peculiar predicament, and it warrants those city councilmembers who wish to see Powell go away to rethink their strategy.

Hamtramck has to eventually emerge from under the eye of the state. So far, it's looking like some councilmembers have yet to come to terms with their limita-

Defying the state will only ensure it stays here longer.

State Senator faces felony charge for 'ghost' employee

By Charles Sercombe That didn't take long.

Just two weeks ago federal agents raided state Sen. Bert Johnson's Highland Park home and Lansing office to search for paper and computer records.

Speculation about the nature of the search was reported to be that Johnson had hired a "ghost" employee - that is, an employee who doesn't show up for work but receives payment.

On Tuesday of this week it was announced by the Detroit branch of the Justice Department that Johnson is indeed being charged with hiring a fake

employee who was paid over \$23,000 in taxpayer

Johnson is facing a felony charge with a maximum punishment of 10 years if convicted.

He has not released a statement, and is expected to be arraigned

According to the feds and media reports, Johnson took a \$14,000 loan from an unnamed co-conspirator who was paid back by being hired as a ghost employee.

It's unclear at the time The Review went to press whether the co-conspirator will be facing criminal prosecution.

Johnson's senate district includes Hamtramck. He previously represented Hamtramck as a State Representative until he was termed out. He then successfully ran for Senate, but he is being termed out once again.

This isn't Johnson's first brush with the law. When he was 19 years old he was convicted of armed robbery involving a theft at the Oakland Hills Country Club. He served several months in prison.

After he was released he reformed himself and made a comeback in the field of public service.
