Alley repairs pick up where they left off from last year

Hamtramck's alley repair program has begun its second year.

Last week work began ripping up repaving the alley on the west side of Conant, from Evaline to Norwalk.

Other portions of alleys along the westside of Conant will also be repaired. On Jos. Campau, alley repair will happen on alleys on the west side of the street. That work will begin in early July.

This year's project will cost almost \$600,000. The city is dipping into its budget surplus to pay \$200,000 of that bill.

"This is a good use of the fund balance," said Acting City Manager Kathy Angerer in reference to using budget surplus money.

Mayor Karen Majewski said the state needs to revise the rules on how cities can use their annual state road repair

grant. The state does not allow the grant to be used for alley repairs.

Last year's work was not completed because the contractor fell behind. Only three out of five projects were completed. The first project this year is to complete last year's work.

The city went with a new contractor, Audia Concrete Construction, this

Fred Kovaleski our spy - has died

Fred Kovaleski died a couple of weeks ago.

His name is probably not known to many Hamtramckans today but there was a time when he was in the papers almost weekly for years.

Kovaleski was one of the greatest tennis players Hamtramck ever pro-

duced - and that's saying a lot. He was a product of Jean Hoxie's legendary tennis program, and he didn't disappoint. He won championships around the world for years. But the most colorful aspect of his life took place off court.

Recycling program near end

Members of the Hamtramck Recycling Commission and their supporters gave it one more try.

At Tuesday's city council meeting the recycling commission made a pitch to the community for volunteers to step up in order to keep the monthly recycling drop-off site in operation.

Recycling Commission member Sarah Terrien said the drop-off program serves as more than an effort to reduce the waste stream.

"It builds community," she said, "and it shows pride."

Terrien said that on average a little over 100 people use the drop-off center - located on Caniff at Mc-Dougall in the city parking lot — each month. The amount of recycled items deposited equals about 2 tons each month.

The problem the commission is facing is that there are not enough volunteers on hand to run the drop-off center, and that those who have stuck it out are "burned out."

The center, which operates on the second Saturday of each month, has been in operation since 2009.

Terrien said at least 15 to 20 more volunteers are needed, and there is also a need for someone to take over coordinating the effort.

Unless volunteers come on board, the last day of the drop-off center will be Aug. 11. The next recycling date is July 14, and it runs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Also coming up this year is the repaving of Holbrook from Jos. Campau to Conant. That will cost \$1.3 million but 80 percent of it is being paid by a federal grant.

The remaining amount comes out of the city's annual state road repair grant, which this year amounted to about \$1.9 million.

The project also calls

for replacing water and sewer lines at a cost of \$500,000, which will come out of the city's Department Water budget.

Work is scheduled to begin in mid-July and go through the end of November. Holbrook traffic will not be impeded during the reconstruction as at least one lane will remain open.



City's latest newsletter has several helpful reminders for summer

In case you missed the city's spring newsletter or it missed you – we are here to summarize some of its more relevant points for you.

No need to thank us. Street Sweeping: The city is letting residents know that it intends to sweep all city streets over the course of the spring and summer. We

take that to mean each and every street in the city. It does not include alleys.

Planned days for this are Mondays and Tuesdays. Signs are to be posted "before the designated sweeping days," but exactly how much time they're going to give you to see the signs and move your cars is not specified. They promise

that "all streets will be swept at least once this season," but also caution that "every street will not be swept every week."

The city's website -www.hamtramck.us the provides schedule. If you don't have computer access, you can call the Public Works Department at (313) 876-7750.

Music in the Park:

Come See

For the second year in a let their children hold see a crime in progress, row, the city will be promoting a short series of concerts, one per month now through August. All shows begin at 7 p.m. They are co-sponsored by the Hamtramck DDA, City Hall and the Historical Museum.

Fireworks Safety: Seems like the right time of year to remind people to be careful (translation: reasonably sober?) when lighting off fireworks. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) is actually "opposed to the consumer use of fireworks." Could it be because, statistically, they cause an average of about 18,500 fires nationally every year?

Nor do they advocate even the enjoyment of sparklers. They show, in an interesting chart, that sparklers burn at 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, and note that they account for roughly one-fourth of all emergency room visits for firecracker related injuries. Could it be because some people even them? Yikes.

Basically, they're saying leave it to the pros. We're holding our breath until that happens. Yeah.

Police Department's spring safety tips: The city's police want to remind you of a few things to keep in mind now that warm weather is here.

When driving, watch for kids playing outside, as they don't always think to watch for you. On a related note, parents are urged to monitor their children closely, and also to remind them about running into the street.

On a second related note, citizens are reminded that residential side streets carry a maximum 25 miles per hour speed limit, whether posted or not. Parents of teen drivers are urged to remind them about speeding, seat usage, and especially to stay focused on the road and not on the radio, their loud friends in the back seat, or (the biggie) their cell phones.

Lastly, warmer weather can mean more people out on the street looking for an opportunity for easy money. Be sure to inventory your valuables by recording all serial numbers, model numbers, etc.

We'll go a step further and say that you could even add your name on a piece of tape and hide it on the item. Remember pricey items in the garage, basement, shed, or enclosed porch, as these are often-hit areas by thieves.

Be alert and aware. Dial 911 if you think you everyone.

or one that just occurred. Prompt notification can make a difference.

Water meter replacement program: The City of Hamtramck Department of Public Services wants to get everyone on the same page with their water metering. They remind you that there is no cost to have your meter replaced with the new equipment, and that it only takes about half an hour for their technicians to make the switch.

The new AMR (Automatic Meter Reading) equipment will help eliminate bills that are only estimates, and will also help bring all of the city's water meters into working condition.

Call (313) 800-5233 as soon as possible if you still need this done.

Grass height ordinance and weed/pest control spraying: Be neighborly and keep your lawn cut below a height of five inches. Yes, even those pesky dandelions that seem to grow a foot overnight.

Also, the city from time to time will be spraying public parks, boulevards, and playgrounds with pesticide and weed killer.

City Hall Insider ...

What is our City Council up to these days? We have the highlights of the latest council meeting.

The city council met on April 24, and all councilmembers were present.

Before the regular meeting a work session was held. At that meeting a discussion was held on a ballot proposal to change the city charter's requirement on the qualifications needed to be appointed as city manager.

City Attorney Harry Kalogerakos said the state Attorney General's Office has approved the proposed ballot language but wanted to refer to the Aug. 7 Primary Election as a "special election" within the ballot proposal.

In a discussion on filling a seat on the city's Downtown Development Authority Mayor Karen Majewski said there needs to be a change in the city's ordinance on the procedures for appointing people to various commissions.

Majewski said the process is "too complicated and doesn't work."

It was announced that the city will once again

sponsor a summer youth program, thanks to a \$50,000 grant. (The grant has since been increased to \$75,000.) The teens will be working on several city improvement projects.

Councilmember Perrotta questioned who will be the point person to work with the school district to win a grant from the Ralph C. Wilson Foundation. Acting City Manager Kathy Angerer said she hired a person on a part-time basis to work on the project, as well as other projects.

Perrotta added that the Wilson Foundation grant is a huge opportunity for the city. The city and school district could win a multi-million dollar grant to renovate Hamtramck Stadium as part of an effort to get kids more physically active.

Councilmember Anam Miah asked for an update on street sweeping. Public Works Director Rodney Johnson said sweeping has started on the city's emergency routes and would soon begin on residential

Wayne County performs two sweepings per year on Jos. Campau and Conant since they are county-owned streets. Miah seemed surprised.

"What, did they just do the center strip?" he

Angerer said there is a problem with people parking their cars on streets that are designated for sweeping. She said the council could decide to begin towing cars that violate the no parking signs on street sweeping day.

Councilmember Saad Almasmari noted that recently 100 businesses closed in protest of President Trump's travel ban policy.

During public comment in the regular meeting, Susan Dunn said the city needs to bring back a chore program to help seniors with minor repair projects.

Finance Director Susan Hendricks said the city managed to erase a \$300,000 deficit through savings, revenue creases, and not filling empty positions in the administration.
