million. But that total covers an exhaustive wish list of improvements at the stadium site. renovations are broken up into three "phases," according to a study performed for the city by SmithGroup JJR.

The plan was unveiled a few weeks ago at a city council meeting. Renovations would include creating not only a baseball field, but also one for softball, cricket and soccer.

Gary Gillette, the president of the Friends of Historic Hamtramck Stadium, said he initially thought the cost to fix the dilapidated stadium would only be a "few million dollars."

"Now we know how to do it, and the price for it," he said.

City Councilmember Ian Perrotta, who co-founded the Friends of Historic Hamtramck Stadium, praised the proposal and was confident private foundation funding will come through to pay for

City officials have teamed up with school officials to seek a grant from the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation to renovate the stadium. The Foundation's goal is to promote programs that get kids more physically active.

Cost to renovate historic baseball

It is hoped that the Foundation will give the city and schools a multimillion dollar grant that could be used to renovate the stadium.

The city already won a federal \$50,000 grant to fund the renovation study.

For years the grandstands have been an eyesore, falling apart and being torn up by vandals. All that while city and school officials debated what to do with it: tear it down or build it back up.





times the stories find me); or, finally, I just start writing and begin a journey without a map, giving memories, dreams and recent experiences the freedom to find their own words to tell a story.

mental interference, trusting that it will all come together in a coherent and hopefully - entertaining

Much of this trust comes from the fact that I identify as a Hamtramck I just let it go, without writer. My subjects are

simple: people and place, histories and geographies. This is a city where we have those things in abundance.

Not history in a conventional sense. I could never do what Greg Kowalski and the Hamtramck Historical Commission so expertly does. That takes a skill for organizing content, data and display that I don't have.

Not geography in a conventional sense either. My thing is about drifting through environments, not measuring or analyzing them. The more life I experience the less I need to know about it.

I don't mean to say knowledge isn't useful. I value education, how I learned to learn something new every day.

But only knowing doesn't equal being fully alive. That comes from participating in the present, in what is happening now. In Hamtramck it could be as simple going for a walk, joining the world at your doorstep.

My old heroes were the invisible ones, the shabby spectators who sat in the corner of the cafe, sipping absinthe or espresso, apparently lost in their own heads. But surprise! They were actually paying rapt attention to all the life going on around them, totally present and aware.

I'm not that romanticized invisible spectator, admirable as he or she may be. I choose to participate in my own stories, though not in a leading

Recently, I walked to Keyworth Stadium for the Detroit City Football Club's game with a team from Mexico.

The night was beautiful: July heat during the day made way for a comfortable evening cooldown. The sky was clear and blue with only a few wispy clouds passing overhead.

The DCFC has a strong history of hosting international friendlies: earlier this season Le Rouge played a club from Germany and later this month will face a team from Italy. The world always manages to find its way to Hamtramck. Being connected to the international football scene is one way this happens.

When I got there an hour before kickoff fans were streaming in from the west (Roosevelt and Jacob streets) and east (Conant) sides of Keyworth. Mexico and DCFC shirts were visible on the streets and in the food court, where I met some friends from Windsor who were attending the match.

Lines were already long for food. I got the footlong all-beef hot dog with sauerkraut, mustard and horseradish from Srodek's.

It was a toss-up between that and the kielbasa on a bun, which I have had before, the last time in an unlikely time and place: around midnight leaving an Ann Arbor Film Festival after party. I had to ask his sausage and he said, close, to home.

unsurprisingly, it Srodek's Hamin tramck.

My friends took seats and I found an opening at the fence behind the goal. "Why stand?" I was asked by one of the visitors from Windsor. I had a simple answer ready: because it's a way to participate in the flow of the experience, like at a dance, where everyone can find a piece of the floor and move as they like.

It's ideal for watching people and picture-taking, which I did when pointing my camera to the action on the pitch and in the opposite direction toward the food court.

I walked around the back of the east wall of the stadium, saw a freight train bumping along the tracks as it headed toward deliveries and pickups in Detroit, or Macomb and St. Clair counties beyond. I took pictures of people at the top of the grandstand, between the light towers and DCFC and other flags. This is the turf of the Northern Guard, the raucous fan base of the club.

Club Nexaca, the talented young Mexican side, took a 2-0 lead before Le Rouge scored late and kept the pressure on until the final whistle. It ended 2-1, but the fans still cheered, set off plumes of smoke, chanted and sang as they left the stadium.

The announced attendance was just over 7,400, one of the largest crowds of the team's brief history at Keyworth.

A loss was also a victory for community life. The game was competitive and exciting but being there really being there - was easily the most vital thing. It was experience telling its own story, simple as

Schools superintendent spent a life dedicated to Hamtramck

In a surprise move, Hamtramck Public Schools Superintendent Tom Niczay announced last week that he will retire at the end of the upcoming school year.

Niczay was appointed to his position 10 years ago after the district went through several rocky years with one failed superintendent after another.

Niczay brought political stability, and later when faced with a huge financial crisis, he and his administration - as well as a unified school board - rose to the challenge.

> The team has spent a huge amount of money to renovate the stadium, which was built during the 1930s by the Works Progress Administration.

> That 1930s program, created under the Roosevelt administration during the Great Depression, put thousands of desperately unemployed folks to work in an effort to kick-start the national economy.

The Football Club has had a similar effect here. Home games attract about 7,000 fans

who after the games spread out to our local bars and restaurants and give them a financial boost.

Niczay has also networked with the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation, which has contributed millions dollars to communities to get kids to become more physically active.

It is very likely that Hamtramck will be the recipient of a generous grant, thanks to Niczay's work and his teaming up with city officials to present a united community.

We wish Niczay will reconsider stepping down in the coming year. He is turning 65 this year, and yes, it's an age when many do retire. He deserves a long, healthy retirement.

Hamtramck, though, may never be the same again.

Thanks, Tom, for your service and dedication.

Hamtramck is home to a growing Yemeni community. Former Detroit City Councilmember Joanne Watson


called for unity.







Here is what's happening in Detroit and on the state level:

Marijuana has been in the news a lot in Michigan lately.

In Detroit, the City Council is expected to take up a medical marijuana ordinance that could include a community benefits package. The ordinance, which was proposed by Councilmember James Tate, would regulate dispensaries city-wide and establish rules for where certain kinds of marijuana-related operations, like growing and distribution, could take place.

Last year, Detroiters

passed a ballot measure easing restrictions on opening dispensaries, but which lacked clarity about some of these issues. If the ordinance is passed, the total number that could operate in the city would be capped at

The ordinance also includes a provision that would "invite prospective owners of medical marijuana facilities to offer community benefits as part of their application for approval," according to a city press release.


"Approving this ordinance would finally bring some closure to this issue and chart the path to the future of this industry in the City of Detroit and the State of Michigan," said Councilman Tate. "The goal has always been to ensure that we have an industry that is respectful of the neighborhoods, the communities it is located in, but also considerate to individuals seeking safe access to alternative medication."

At the state level. Michigan voters will consider whether to allow legal use of recreational marijuana this November. Both advocates and opponents are gearing up for the vote.

It is generally agreed that tax revenue from the sale of legal marijuana will generate millions of dollars for the state and communities.

One thing to note, however, is that Michigan's law still will not allow for public consumption of marijuana.


