Sure enough, Monday's downpour caused numerous floods in basements. Over three inches fell in a short period that also caused street flooding.

On Wednesday another downpour caused more flooding.

The lore of Hamtramck ...

Arthur Rooks and the Boys' Athletic Club


In the sports arena, Hamtramck has had much to be proud of.

Plenty of professional athletes came from Hamtramck. Jean Hoxie's tennis program, in fact, was world famous and pro-Wimbledon duced champs Peaches Bartkowicz and Fred Kovaleski. Others have gone on to play pro baseball, basketball, football and other sports.

But at least one of Hamtramck's greatest sports star spent most of his life in the court of law, not the basketball court. Arthur Rooks carved out a special place in Hamtramck's history for his many accomplishments and his career as an attorney and judge.

But his heart was firmly linked to the sports world. Rooks played sports in school and went on the help start the Hamtramck Recreation Department in the 1920s. High on his list of achievements was the establishment of the Hamtramck Boys' Athletic Club in 1937. (Yes, girls did play sports back then, but the focus was still mainly on the males.)

The club was open to youths age 12 to 25 years old and provided recreational opportunities to them including playing baseball, soft-

ball, ping pong and weight lifting and participating in such activities as marathon walking. Initially players paid 5 cents a month for membership but that was dropped when the club turned to contributions for support.

Among those early supporters, interestingly, were inmates of Jackson Prison who raised \$500 to donate to the Boys' Club after the prison newspaper, The Spectator, reprinted a Detroit Times story about Boys' Club's efforts to help first-time offenders stay out of trouble.

The club helped out in other ways. During World War II the club allowed headquarters at 2954 Caniff to be used

by the Red Cross for its offices and as a place for air raid warden training. The club also worked with the Boy Scouts and participated in war efforts when bond drives and paper and scrap metal drives were common.

By the 1940s the Boys' Athletic Club had 800 members, through its existence thousands of Hamtramckans took part in it. Many prominent Hamtramckans were members. There aren't many records left of the club and it isn't clear when it faded away. Rooks was respected as one of Hamtramck's most accomplished citizens throughout his life. He died in the 1970s.

But the club - and the memory of him - still stand as proud reminders of Hamtramck's great past.



Two Yemeni-American brothers have filed a complaint with the Michigan Department of Civil Rights that charges the Hamtramck Police Department with harassment.

The complaint is thought to be a prelude to a lawsuit.

According to the combrothers Mohamed Wasel and Omar Wassel (who spells his last name differently) say

that last March officers ficers treated them rudely ticketed them for having an expired license plate on their ice cream truck. The truck was also impounded.

Things took a dramatic twist when the brothers went to the police station to offer a new plate and proof of insurance. They say the officer at the front desk didn't believe the insurance was legitimate and then threw them into jail. They were released

Before the regular meeting the council met in a work session. During that meeting Councilmember Anam Miah questioned a contract for a cement company. He asked if the city attorney reviewed it. The city attorney, Travis Mihelick said he only provided the template for the contract, not the specifications.

Mihelick said the city manager and the city's engineering consultant provided the specifications.

Kathy Angerer, the Director of Community & Economic Development,

talked about the summer work program for young people she has been overseeing. She said the city's workforce is comprised of a cross section of the city's ethnic population.

"The cool part is these kids are fantastic," she said.

She said the workforce has so far cleaned up several streets, the city parking lot on Yemans and Pope Park.

During the regular meeting, State Rep. Rose Mary Robinson talked of unfair property tax assessments. She said people will abandon the city, just like in Detroit, if the city insists on raising assessments to the point where homeowners can't afford to live here.










cords from their homes forcers. to the trucks to keep their battery charged overnight.

And then there are complaints that trucks are in poor, dirty condition and should be banned from city streets.

Ice cream truck operators have also long complained of harassment by officers and code en-

The complaint comes at a time when the department has been hit with three lawsuits regarding an undercover operation by auto theft investigators who targeted a local tire shop.

The tire shop owner and others say the officers confiscated money and property from them.

An informant working for the investigators also claims he was not paid for his work and was forced to illegally dispose of used tires in a neighborhood near tramck.

The informant also said the investigators used racist language directed at blacks and Arabs.

The Hamtramck Police

Department is comprised mostly of white males. There are no Bangladeshi or Arab officers in the department, although the department has in the past encouraged residents of those ethnic communities to get training and apply for a position in the department.


