For some Campau businesses, new sewer line is an economic stinker

Ali Mohammed wants to work.

The Yemeni barber sits

in his shop on Joseph Campau and Council Street for hours, waiting for customers. He cleans obsessively - the mirrors, the floor, the chairs — then sits back down to stare out the window.

Sometimes he falls asleep, wakes up, realizes it doesn't matter one way or the other whether he's awake: no one comes in anymore.

It's the construction, Mohammed says, that keeps clients away. Since April 18, Hennessey Engineers has overseen a joint project by Dan's Ex-

cavating Inc. Liquiforce to upgrade the sewer line along Joseph Campau, from Goodson to the north and Denton to the south.

The cost of this project is \$3.5 million, which came from a state loan.

That section of road was completely inaccessible to cars until last week, a half mile of cracked cement and orange traffic drums sendcustomers elsewhere. One lane is finally open, but the efof the project fects

Incumbents are the winners in primary election

Two city councilmembers' hopes to climb the political ladder dashed on Tuesday's Primary Election.

Both Councilmember Miah and Anam hammed Hassan poorly in their attempts to knock out their incumbent office holders.

They didn't even do well among Hamtramck voters.

Like many other communities, Tuesday was not a good day to count on voters to participate in voting. Hamtramck's turnout was a little less than 1,000 which is not even 10 percent of the total number of registered voters here.

Miah had the hardest challenge in trying to unseat Wayne County Commissioner Martha Scott. Scott has been in one elected office or another since the 1980s, making her one of the most entrenched politicians in Wayne County.

Miah garnered a total of 460 votes throughout the district, of which a little over 200 came from Hamtramck voters. He finished last in third place.

Scott even beat out Miah here in Hamtramck with 527 votes.

Miah blamed the lack of a local election issue on the ballot for the low turnout.

tramck residents have been subject to during heavy rainstorms.

Mark Ragsdale, the Director of Public Services for Hamtramck, points out the need for an upgrade. The city's combined sewer system is primarily designed to handle sewage, not rainwater, and the discussion of whether or not to improve the lines was brought up as early as the 1950s.

Now, he says, it's not a question of whether or not it would be nice to improve the lines - it's a necessity.

For many local stores, however, the project has been an economic catastrophe. When asked about the effects of construction on their businesses. owners Mohammed give hard numbers.

Where the Yemen Barber Shop used to make \$900 - \$1,000 per week, he says it now barely breaks \$250.

Mohamed Isaa of Zaid Travel Inc. says that where the business once took in \$1,000 a week, it now collects closer to \$100.

Thabit Al-Murisa, owner of Al Amal Supermarket, speaks of the hours lost in picking up products, of having to make four or five-hour trips to buy milk, bread, and chips inlivered straight to his door.

Mutea Mozeb, butcher at Hamtramck City Market, talks of half the shop's orders not arriving at all.

Not every business owner has been affected to the same degree. Businesses on the edge of the construction, like Restaurant. Sheeba seem to have hardly been touched, and shops that have had years to build a customer base have plodded on.

Nomran Alhaleni of Habbibi Services says his store is one such success story, and although he admitted he has lost some money, he believes the project is in the general interest of the city. But his positive outlook is rare.

For Mohammed, the project may spell the end of his practice. The 13year resident of Hamtramck shakes his head. uncertain, when asked whether the Yeman Barber Shop will survive.

"We had just two customers today," he sighs. "I can't even make the rent. I have a family."

Mohammed gestures to a fellow barber, "He

stead of having them de- has a family. I have responsibilities."

> He points to a license on the far wall. "I can't even renew my license, my taxes - I can't even do that," Mohammed said.

> Meanwhile, the construction lingers. The last few weeks have seen the work come to a halt as construction workers wait for the concrete on a new underground storage tank to cure.

"Both lanes are on track to open by the time school starts," Ragsdale, "even if it's just temporary pavement at first."

The project should be entirely completed, he said, by early September. For now, however, Mohammed and others like him are forced to keep waiting.

"It had nothing to do with the city at all," he said. "If we had a millage or something it would have helped."

Scott left all of her challengers in the dust, finishing with over 4,000 votes. The second-place finisher was R.L. Lemmons who received 705 votes.

Hassan finished fourth out of seventh place in his bid to unseat State Rep. Rose Mary Robinson, who also easily beat her challengers with 3,249 votes. Hassan received 319 votes.

Hassan said he wasn't surprised by the result because he did not campaign.

"But people still voted for me," he said.

As for his future plans, he said he is staying local. "My focus is on the Hamtramck city mayor," he said. "The people told me to do it, to focus on Hamtramck."

Next year's city election will feature the mayor's race and the city council seats for Hassan, Andrea Karpinski and Ian Perrotta.

Hamtramck voters also agreed with county voters in passing two millages extensions, one for the Detroit Zoo and another for county parks.

In the school board election taking place in the November General Election, Boardmember Salah Hadwan won't have any competition.

That's because Joseph Wylie, the only other candidate to seek the seat with four years remaining in its term, dropped out of the race last Friday.

Hadwan was appointed to fill the seat of former Boardmember Mohammad Huda who was kicked off the board after it was determined he was not a resident.

Boardmembers Hedy Shulgon and Jackie Starr will be facing challengers Jeff Salazar, Moortadha Obaid, Renee Savage, Lamont Stinson and Showkat Chowdhury.



versation between Mayor Karen Majewski and journalist Walter Wasacz with an interactive discussion with the audience.


Majewski and Wasacz met Disneyland artist Dmytro Szylak in the early 1990s and followed the progress of the piece until his death last year at age






