A little over 400 police officers and fire fighters died that day when both towers collapsed. Most of those who died - 343 - were firefighters. In all, over 3,000 people died that day from the multiple attacks.

Hagen said he will be talking about the events of 9/11 and the role of first responders.

"It will be a short talk just so people can remember," he said.

It's also a reminder to the public that the job of firefighters and officers can turn tragic at any moment.

"Bad things can happen, but that doesn't stop us from doing our job," Hagen said.

Hagen said he hosted similar 9/11 remembrances while he was the chief of the Eastpointe Fire Department.




The festival has a small-town charm to it, and thankfully is more welcoming and fun than that pesky Arts, Beats and Eats held during the same weekend in Royal Oak.
