This Saturday, Sept. 9, at 7 p.m. the Yemeni community is inviting everyone to meet up at city hall.

The gathering is a call for peace in Yemen, which is being torn apart by a civil war and outside factions. So far over 7,000 people have been killed, and about 50,000 injured.

Worse, there are now about 17 million people who are in dire need of food and water. The situation is poised to turn into a full-blown humanitarian crisis. Yemen is one of the poorest Arab countries and does not have the resources to handle the needs of those trapped in this war.

The demonstration will go until 8:30 p.m. Come out and show your support for those caught up in this increasingly out-of-control situation.

Labor Day Festival celebrates Hamtramck and an end of summer

This year's annual Labor Day Festival was going swimmingly all weekend, until Monday afternoon.

That's when a heavy rain stormed into the metro area and made it possible to hold a real canoe race on Jos. Campau.

Needless to say, the party was over by 6 p.m., meaning food vendors were left holding pounds of unsold food.

It also meant that finances could be off by about \$10,000, said festival organizer Shannon Lowell.

"The rain did us a pretty good death blow," Lowell said.

But, on the other hand, the weather was perfect for all of Saturday and Sunday and right up to Monday evening: sunny, with a cool breeze and

mild, mid-70s temperatures.

Attendance seemed to be up, and the number of vendors increased by 10 percent from last year.

There were, as usual, a few incidents of fights, but not nearly on a level experienced years ago during the 1990s.

The "canoe" race on Monday also drew a larger than usual number of spectators to the point where next year will require more crowd control.

Sunday evening once again served as a reunion for many former Hamtramckans who

Fire Department to host 9/11 remembrance ceremony

Hamtramck Fire Chief Dan Hagen wants Hamtramck to remember.

On Monday, the Fire Department will host a memorial service for the victims who died on September 11, 2001, when America came under attack.

This is the 16th anniversary of that nightmarish day. Monday's event at the fire station, located at Caniff and Mackay, starts promptly at 8:38 a.m. and runs for 20 minutes.

The public is invited to arrive at 8:20 a.m.

Hagen said the reason for the odd start time is to allow for a moment of silence at the exact time when the first hijacked plane struck the World Trade Center in New York City.

Alley repairs to begin

Hamtramck's alley repair program is expected to begin next week.

The program was supposed to kick off in mid-July but the construction company hired to do the job has been behind on other projects.

This is the first step in what will eventually be the repaving of all city alleys.

The project this year will include a total repaving, with concrete, of:

- The westside alley of Jos. Campau from Yemans to Evaline
- Eastside alley of Jos. Campau from Caniff to Belmont
- Westside alley of Conant from Evaline to Norwalk

The cost of the project is \$204,000. Each alley portion will take about two weeks to finish. In total it will take about six weeks to complete this year's entire project.

The alley project coincides with another year's worth of street resurfacing. The street repair does not involve a total repaving, but only a milling down of the road and resurfacing with asphalt.

The following streets are slated for resurfacing this year:

- Charest from Holbrook to Evaline (full width)
- Lehman from Conant to Jos. Campau (center portion only)
- Lumpkin from Caniff to Commor (center portion only)

A little over 400 police officers and fire fighters died that day when both towers collapsed. Most of those who died – 343 – were firefighters. In all, over 3,000 people died that day from the multiple attacks.

Hagen said he will be talking about the events of 9/11 and the role of first responders.

“It will be a short talk just so people can re-

member,” he said.

It’s also a reminder to the public that the job of firefighters and officers can turn tragic at any moment.

“Bad things can happen, but that doesn’t stop us from doing our job,” Hagen said.

Hagen said he hosted similar 9/11 remembrances while he was the chief of the East-pointe Fire Department.

Hagen, who had been retired, was hired as Hamtramck’s new fire chief several months ago.

He said many people have questioned why New York City firefighters placed themselves in such danger when the Twin Towers were burning and there appeared to be little anyone could do to stop the fires.

There were still thousands of people trapped in both buildings, and Hagen said firefighters are trained to put out fires as well as rescue folks.

“It’s what we took an oath to do,” he said. “Bad things can happen but that doesn’t stop us.”

• Pulaski from Jos. Campau to Mackay (full width)

The cost of this project is \$470,000. Work has already begun.

Next year the city plans on repaving Holbrook from Jos. Campau to Co-

nant. Almost 90 percent of the \$1 million cost is being covered by the federal government. The remaining balance will be paid through a yearly state road repair grant.

The city had to put the brakes on a proposed repair of Lumpkin (from Poland to Caniff) in order to save up more money in the city’s Water Department fund.

No matter what, Hamtramck's Labor Day Festival is still the best way to say goodbye to summer, and a reluctant hello to fall.



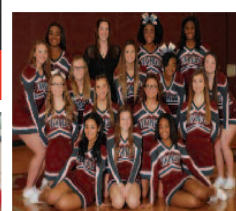
