A scan of their website reveals a variety of strains of pot and edibles, with their THC concentrations exactingly calculated. Many

Prepare to pay more for parking

Hamtramck will join other local communities in upgrading its parking meters.

Hamtramck is about to install high-tech meters much like the ones you see in Royal Oak and Birmingham that can take credit cards or be accessed by an application on your cell phone.

More importantly, they will actually work, unlike many of those currently remaining on Jos. Campau and in city parking lots, and will more effectively help enforcement,

In other words, get ready to shell out more money - or begin to walk or ride your bike more.

The new meters won't cost the city a dime.

The city is partnering with Municipal Parking Services of Detroit. The company will install the meters, and then maintain them, in exchange for 50 percent of the proceeds collected from fees and tickets.

City Manager Kathy Angerer said the five-year contract with the company is expected to generate \$180,000 for the city during that period.

Keeping the current meters, Angerer said, would lead to declining revenue each vear because more and more break down.

The city will still be in charge of enforcement.

While the deal with the company was touted as a way to increase revenue and make enforcement more efficient, according to Google re-

views of the company, no one appears to like the meters and especially Detroit's parking enforcement officers.



"Got a ticket for parking in a no standing zone. Submitted a photo of my car parking IN FRONT of a sign that says I am free to park. Denied my appeal."

There were 38 reviews of the company on Google - everyone of them a thumbs down.

Mr. Pettibone shared the history and traditions of the, Ho-Chunk nation, sometimes called Winnebago nation. He shared the story of how the Native Americans came to "Mother Earth" and how at one time 1,000 nations roamed the land.

Today there are 562 federally recognized Indian tribes, bands, nations, pueblos, Rancherias, communities and Native villages in the United States.

Approximately 229 of these are located in Alaska; the rest are located in 33 other states. Mr. Pettibone demonstrated "The Men's Traditional Dance" noting that it shows respect for fathers, grandfathers and the Circle of Life.

Mr. Pettibone 's wife and daughters demonstrated "The Women's Traditional Dance" showing respect to mothers and grandmothers. Mr. Pettibone said that when they dance one foot is always on the ground and they step first with the right foot to show their connection with Mother Earth.





Major League Baseball legend had roots in Hamtramck

Review Special Writer Last Wednesday, Jan. 15, marked 100 years

since the birth of Steve

Gromek in Hamtramck.

Gromek, a graduate of Ladislaus School, was one of the greatest baseball players to ever come out of Hamtramck. He even played a role in the integration of Major League Baseball.

2942 EVALINE

Gromek, who started out as an infielder in the Cleveland Indians organization, eventually became a pitcher in 1941. The dependable righthander pitched in the majors for 17 years, winning 123 games, tossing 17 shutouts, and completing

In 1945, Gromek won 19 games for Cleveland, despite missing

92 games.



Last week was the 100th birthday celebration for baseball legend and Hamtramck native Steve **Gromek. He played for the Cleveland Indians and also** the Detroit Tigers.

two weeks after injuring his knee while scoring the winning run in a game against Detroit. Gromek was named to the American League All-Star team that year, but the game was canceled due to travel restrictions during World War II.

Gromek would later be traded to his hometown Detroit Tigers, where he would win 18 games in 1954.

But Gromek's shining moment would come during the 1948 World Series. Player-manager Lou Boudreau made a surprising decision to start Gromek in Game 4 of the fall classic against the Boston Braves at Cleveland Stadium. The Ham-

tramck native would not

disappoint the Indians' skipper.

Gromek pitched a complete game, beating the Braves by a score of 2-1.

The other hero of the game for Cleveland was Larry Doby, whose thirdinning homer would prove to be the game-winning

Doby's blast was the first home run hit by a black player in World Series history. The Plain Dealer, the major newspaper in Cleveland, snapped a photo of Gromek and Doby celebrating in the locker room after the game.

The photo of them hugging each other became a signature moment in the integration of baseball. It was only a year earlier that Doby had become the first black player in the American League, just three Jackie months after Robinson broke the Major League Baseball color barrier with the National League's Brooklyn

Dodgers.

When Doby first joined the Indians, four of his teammates refused to shake his hand, and two turned their backs to

But the embrace Doby received from Hamtramck's own Steve Gromek was something the left-handed slugger would never forget. In his Hall of Fame acceptance speech in 1998, Doby reflected on the photo with Gromek.

"That was a feeling from within, the human side of two people, one black and one white," Doby said. "That made up for everything I went through. I would always relate back to that whenever I was insulted or rejected from hotels. I'd always think about that picture. It would take away all the negatives."

(Editor's note: Gromek died on March 12, 2002 in Clinton Twp.)






