



AV ballots are ready for primary

Politics is everywhere these days. You'd think these folks have big egos or something.

In any case, Michigan's Presidential Primary Election is coming up fast on March 10 - and the new relaxed rules for voting by absentee ballot give you even less excuse to not do your civic duty and vote, vote, vote.

Not that we're suggesting that you vote three times...

You can find an application for an absentee ballot online by going to the Secretary of State's web-

You can also get an application at the City Clerk's Office in city hall, or at any Secretary of State office.

Be aware that this is not the ballot itself, but rather an application for a ballot, which will then be mailed to your listed address.

Among the notable things about the simple one-page application is the fact that there is a box you can check that will ensure that you are henceforth on the mailing list to receive all your ballots as absentee, without having to reapply before each election.





City Hall Insider ...

What is our City Council up to these days? We have the highlights of the latest council meeting.

By Charles Sercombe

The city council met on Jan. 14, and all councilmembers, except Fadel Al-Marsoumi, were present.

Included in the council's information packet was a notice about the Census 2020.

The notice reminded the public that the information provided will remain private and will not be shared with other government agencies.

The more people who are counted in Hamtramck will also mean more revenue sources will be allocated here for such programs as housing, transportation, road repairs, emergency servschool meal programs, and health clinics – to name just several services.

City Manager Kathy Angerer said there is an organized effort to make sure Hamtramck gets an accurate count of how many people live here.

"We'll be reaching out in the coming months," she

Mayor Karen Majewski added that, for those who are not citizens, their information will not be leaked to any other agency, nor used against them.

The council approved a resolution honoring International Mother Language Day, which will be celebrated starting on Feb. 20-21.

In Hamtramck, people will gather at Zussman Park at 10 p.m. on Feb.

In the resolution, some background was given about the celebration:

"The date represents the day in 1952 when students demonstrating for recognition of their language, Bangla, as one of the two national languages of then Pakistan. were shot and killed by police in Dhaka, the capital of what is now Bangladesh."

The resolution went on to further say:

"WHEREAS, the City of Hamtramck with its rich tradition of cultural diversity agrees with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cul-Organization tural (UNESCO) that languages are the most powerful instruments of preserving and developing our tangible and intangible heritage. All moves to promote the dissemination of native languages will serve not only to encourage linguistic diversity and multilingual education but also to develop fuller awareness of linguistic and cultural traditions throughout the world and to inspire solidarity based on understanding, tolerance and dialogue."

A presentation was made about the activities of the Plan Commission during 2019.

The commission met seven times during the year, and approved nine site plans, among other activities.

The commission is a volunteer organization.

Mayor Majewski read out loud a proclamation honoring former Hamtramck Mayor Raymond Wojtowicz, who died on Jan. 8.

A resolution was approved for the Designaof a Ukrainian tion Heritage Neighborhood, which will include the area between Jos. Campau to Conant and Carpenter to Casmere. Additionally, Commor Street will have the unofficial designation of Shevchenko Street.

The resolution explained the matter:

"The Ukrainian American community has a long history of contribution to the Hamtramck community and their influence continues today. The Ukrainian American community seeks recognition of both their history and present impact with the designation of a Ukrainian Heritage Neighborhood. The designation would include the neighborhoods bounded by Joseph Campau to Conant and Carpenter to Casmere.

"Historically, Ukrainian immigrants settled in this area and continue living there today. Important Ukrainian sites are located in this area, includ-Immaculate ing the Conception Ukrainian Catholic Church, Buhay Funeral Chapel, and the Ukrainian Selfreliance Federal Credit Union.

"The area includes former locations of the Ukrainian American Archives and Museum, Ukrainian American Center, and both Immaculate Conception Ukrainian American Elementary and High Schools.

"The Ukrainian American community wishes to unofficially rename Commor Street in this area to Shevchenko Street. The name is in honor of Ukrainian national hero Taras Shevchenko, a poet from the 19th Century."

The Ukrainian Selfreliance Federal Credit Union will pay for the cost and installation of the honorific street sign.

The Ukrainian community in Hamtramck is over 100 years old.

Councilmember Nayeem Chowdhury said the honor underscores Hamtramck's ethnic "diver-

A public hearing on the street naming will be held at the next city council meeting (Jan. 28).

The council approved a memorandum of understanding with the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM) and Command Officers Association of Michigan (COAM).

According to City Manager Angerer, this resolution will approve a decision by the previous city manager to offer the officers and their spouses and dependents to be a part of the city's health insurance policy.

The previous city manager did not seek council approval for the benefit package.

Angerer said the agreement is needed because: "(The) City of Hamtramck, like many local units of government in the region, has had difficulty retaining trained and experienced law enforcement officers in what is a competitive market for their services. The loss of officers to other departments and professions has had a detrimental impact that the City wishes to rectify and avoid in the future."

Councilmember hammed Hassan was the sole member to object to the agreement. He did not offer an explanation for his vote.

A stand-alone ATM unit was approved to be built in the Hamtramck Town Center parking lot.

The council agreed to hire a contractor to per-


Barbara Czarnecki (nee chocki), 78, died January 30, 2020.

the Holbrook repaving project, which will go from Jos. Campau to Lumpkin. This is the second phase of the project, which began with rebuilding the street, and its infrastructure, from Jos. Campau to Conant last year.

The project is being overseen by the Michigan Department of Transportation, and will cost \$2.6 million, of which about half is being paid by the federal government.

Councilmember Andrea Karpinski said she is concerned that the repair work will not repeat the creation of sloping sidewalks, which she called "sledding hills."

Angerer said that situation is being addressed with MDOT.

In another resolution, the council OK'd the use of council chambers by the non-profit organization Wayne Metro Community Action Agency, to provide free income tax preparation services for residents.

That free service will happen on Feb. 3, 10 and 24, as well as March 2 and 9. The hours for the service will be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The council also approved a resolution of support for State Rep. Isaac Robinson's appeal to the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy to Halt the Expansion of US Ecology Facility, which is located about a mile east of Hamtramck.

Robinson is seeking to prevent the plant from processing toxic materials including radioactive material. Environmental activists say the materials pose a threat to the

health of those living near

the plant, including in Hamtramck.

In the council's last resolution, approval was given to set a date to officially name a new city pocket park at 2134 Trowbridge St.

The owner of the land donated it to the city, and

recommended that the name be "Salam Peace Park."

The council will entertain the resolution to name the park at its Feb. 11 regular meeting.

"Salam" is an Arabic word that means peace.
