

# Renovation work begins at Hamtramck's baseball stadium

Hamtramck's historic baseball stadium is about to undergo a historic change.

Last week, contractors began tearing out the old turf and infield to make way for a brand-new field.

Work will also begin on making repairs to the stadium.


By perhaps fall, it will be a reborn stadium.

The stadium is considered historic because it is only one of five stadiums built specifically for the old

Negro League Baseball.

It was built in 1930, and was home to the legendary Detroit Stars. This was at a time when African-Americans were not allowed to play in the whites-only Major League Baseball.

The color line, at least in modern times, was eventually broken in 1947 when the former Brooklyn Dodgers hired Jackie Robinson. The Boston Red Sox was the last team to integrate in 1959.

The history and significance of Hamtramck's stadium had been lost for decades. It wasn't until several years ago that its importance was discovered.

Up to that time, various city officials had called for tearing the stadium down because it was dilapidated and had become an eyesore. Once its historical background was discovered, it became a whole new ball game.

For the past few years, a volunteer group called the Stadium Hamtramck Ground Crew has been maintaining the field.

**Old-timey** baseball games – where the players play bare-handed – have been presented at the field. The stadium even received rock star attention last year, when Detroit rocker Jack White hosted a baseball game. He also donated \$10,000 toward the stadium's renovation.

In the meantime, the grant seeking has been paying off. Money from donations, from the state of Michigan, and from various organizations has been steadily coming in.

There is hope for the city to win a multi-million-dollar grant from the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation.

Tom Derry, who is part of the Ground Crew, summed up the expectations of many when he said on his Facebook page:

"Can't wait until we hear the umpire cry, 'Play ball!'"



Sausage Company on Jos. Campau, and recently opened a new market in Sterling Heights. Srodek also recently had a child.

At a special school board budget meeting on June 29, Srodek submitted her resignation, which became effective after that meeting.

She told the board that her decision didn't come easy.

"It pains me, but it is decision." right

Srodek said.

Srodek has seen the district through its most financially difficult times. At one point, the district struggled to address a \$5 million budget deficit.

Through a number of cuts - including privatizing some jobs - the district bounced back, and now has an \$11 million budget surplus.

Under Srodek, the district was also successful in getting voter approval for a bond to upgrade and repair schools.

The district is now also seeking another bond to continue with building improvements, as well as to build a new school.

Srodek had nothing but praise for the district, which has a student enrollment of over 3,000, and where over 20 languages and dialects are spoken. "It's a one-of-a-kind dis-


trict," she told her fellow boardmembers.

# Circle touring and quarantining on the road

Now going on 100 days of quarantine and social distancing, my restlessness and creativity have banded together in productive ways.

At roughly 60 days, I traveled with my Ohio-based companion Robin to her other home in California, with stops in the Grand Canyon, Joshua Tree, the beaches of the Pacific Ocean and Black Hills, South Dakota - where we saw Mt. Rushmore and the ongoing work to carve out a stone memorial to Native American icon Crazy Horse (begun by late Polish-American sculptor Korczak Ziolkowski, with continued progress on the project by his family).

In late June, we took a drive to see Robin's daughter, a JAG officer at the Great Lakes Naval Station on the north shore of metro Chicago.

Instead of heading there directly, we decided to do a circle tour of Lake Michigan, through the northwest side of the state across the bridge and into the Upper Peninsula, coming down the opposite shore in Wisconsin.

We stopped in Ludington the first night, then headed



north through Manistee to M-22, the famous Michigan 'beauty road' that connects lovely lakeside towns like Frankfort, Glen

Arbor, Leland, Northport

and Suttons Bay.

We stopped at Sleeping Bear Dunes National Seashore for a rigorous hike to sandy hilltops overlooking the water.

The destination that night was Petoskey, where we spent a night at the state campground, watching the sky turn varying shades of red, blue and grey during a spectacular sunset that lasted well beyond 10 p.m.

The next day we backtracked to Walloon Lake, where a young Ernest vacationed Hemingway with his family in the early years of the 20th century, tinued south to Green Bay we left to spend the night and explored the "Lord of for the night."

the Rings"-like Mushroom Houses of Charlevoix, begun in 1919 by selftaught builder Earl Young.

We continued north on another gorgeous road, M-119, through Harbor Springs and the "Tunnel of Trees" to Cross Village and Legs Inn, established around 100 years ago through the combined efforts of Polish immigrant Stanley Smolak and Native American builders from the Ottawa tribe.

The building is considered a marvel of outsider art and quirky architecture, drawing curious visitors from all over the world.

After dinner in the inn's garden patio on a bluff overlooking the big lake, we rolled north over the Mackinac Bridge into the UP and made it to Tahquamenon Falls by dusk.

We viewed the larger Upper Falls (and the equally exquisite Lower Falls the next morning at sunrise) before heading west toward the Wisconsin

We stopped for lunch at a park in Escanaba, on Little Bay de Noc, then con-

There, we took advantage of free bike rentals offered by our hotel (our only non-campground stay to this point) and cruised on the city's bike and walking trail that runs along the Fox River.

While on the trail I had thoughts about how Hamtramck can benefit from a network of interlaced trails, apart from the frustratingly delayed Joe Louis Greenway long earmarked for Jos. Campau. More on this in future columns.

We stopped in Sheboygan, a town on Lake Michigan, before landing in Lake Forest, where we spent the night at Robin's daughter's apartment.

We toured the naval base the next morning and afterwards walked in the commercial district of nearby Highland Park, III, where we found coffee and French pastry.

The last stop on our weeklong journey was back in Michigan, in Saugatuck, an arty resort town that was a bit too crowded for our comfort - we were masked in public throughout the seven-day trip - so

# Virus update: Governor considers walking back some openings

Well, that was fun - for some - while it lasted.

Gov. Gretchen Whitmer recently reversed her decision to allow people to go to bars.

That's because soon after things opened up a the coronavirus spiked up again. And no wonder. There were numerous reports of bar patrons standing shoulder-to-shoulder and not wearing masks.


Although you now once again can't drink inside bars, bars can serve you on outdoor patios and sidewalk cafes.

Indoor dining is still allowed, but Whitmer has said this week that, if the virus cases continue to increase, she may walk back some of the other businesses that were also allowed to open.

Whitmer addressed the issue in an interview with CNN.

"In so far that we have reengaged hair salons that's something that if we see some outbreaks, we may have to disengage on that front.

"I took a lot of heat. When we brought that



curve down, we saved thousands of lives. I'm prepared to take heat if that's what it's going to take to keep people safe.

"We're going to continue to monitor the numbers. If they keep moving up, we're going to dial back if we have to. And it's the last thing any of us wants."

Last week, Whitmer took further action to help bars. If you have a bar or restaurant that makes vour favorite drink, you can now get cocktails to

Cities can also create "social districts" where people can drink out in the open in designated

A group of bars and funding to reduce the cost

restaurants can now enjoy common outdoor area and sell drinks to folks.

Hamtramck could do this in any of the city parking lots. For example, part of the city parking lot between Polonia and Polish Village Café could be sectioned off.

Whitmer is also tapping into \$880 million in federal funding to help businesses, front line workers and other areas to survive financially during the pandemic.

The following is list of money designation, or actions taken:

- A \$2/hour increase for direct care workers;
- \$125 million in grant

of child care for families;

- · \$100 million for hazard pay for local first responders and \$200 million for local units of government;
- \$100 million in small business re-start grants;
- \$60 million in rental assistance and eviction diversion:
- \$25 million for wireless hotspots and enhanced connectivity;
- \$18 million for health and safety grants for schools;
- \$10 million MIOSHA grants for protections to keep workers safe on the job;
- and \$14 million for food banks and domestic violence shelters.

Statistic-wise, here are the latest numbers on COVID-19. the disease caused by the coronavirus, as of Thursday when The Review went to

Statewide, there have been 67,237 cases and 6,015 deaths from the disease.

In Hamtramck, there have been 195 cases, with 22 deaths.

#### A path to a new school vear

On June 30, Governor Whitmer's office put out a 63-page document detailing the phases of schools being reopened.

Entitled the MI Safe Schools Roadmap, it is broken down into Phases 1-6, and includes such considerations as athlet-

The Executive Summary of the document details the steps, either required or strongly recommended, "to keep school communities safe based on the status of the coronavirus."

The Return to School Advisory Council, a body assembled under direction of the governor and consisting of groups of educators and administrators, health professionals, elected officials and even some parents and students, produced the document.

A task force composed of persons from different areas of state government also offered support.

As with all decisions made by this administration, the latest science and data have been utilized in the decision-making process. Where the data was murky or unclear, recommendations were to err on the side of caution.

In this analysis, the council "compared various interventions including the

implementation of student cohorting, staggered schedules, face mask use, barrier screens, other personal protective equipment, changes to dining operations, and alterations to recess and athletic activities."


That's a lot of ground to cover in a short amount of time, daunting in terms of both the labor necessary to implement all of this across schools that sometimes house several thousand students, and of course the money involved.

In Phases 1-3, schools are unable to open yet, and schooling must continue remotely. In Phase 4, schools open, but with considerable amounts of restriction. In Phase 5, there are considerably less of these restrictions in place, and in Phase 6, there are virtually no restrictions.

We would seem to be a ways from a Phase 6 scenario yet, given the persistence and even rebounding of this pandemic in the country overall, the number of persons not taking it seriously enough, and the natural tendency of kids, especially young ones, to forget socially distancing.

The nature of the threats was not revealed, but the department said they were sent via text.


Officer spotted Talic driving in the city and attempted to pull him over. but ended up chasing him.

told police that she was sexually assaulted multiple times from June 30 through July 2 by a man she met on Facebook.



While conducting a search warrant there, officers arrested Justin Kaminski, 32, and Steven Dunaway, 33.

details of the case.

Kaminski, of Hamtramck, was arraigned in front of 31st District Court Judge Alexis G. Krot on charges of human trafficking, three counts of criminal sexual conduct, kidnapping, assault with intent to do great bodily harm, and interfering with electronic communication. His bond was set at \$500,000 cash.

Dunaway, of Pontiac, was arraigned in front of 31st District Court Judge Alexis Krot for possession methamphetamine. His bond was set at \$10,000 cash.

A police source said the human trafficking charge involves holding a person against their will and attempting to force them into prostitution.

# Governor proposes reforms for police officers

# **By Charles Sercombe**

If Gov. Gretchen Whitmer had her way, police officers would no longer be allowed to use choke holds.

Recently, Whitmer released a number of proposals for police reforms.

Her proposals will have to be voted on by the state legislature, which is now Republican-controlled.

Her proposals includes

- Further limit the use of no-knock warrants.
- Require "duty to intervene" policies.

- Classify false, raciallymotivated 911 calls as a hate crime.
- Require in-service training for all licensed law enforcement officers to maintain licensure.
- · Authorize the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) to do the following:
- Audit law enforcement agencies to ensure they are accurately reporting violations of law or improper use of force.
- Establish penalties agencies who don't comply with re-

porting.

· Direct the Michigan Department of Health and **Human Services Mental** Health Diversion Council to make recommendations on best practices and training for police departments when responding to situations involving persons with mental illnesses.

"All Michiganders, no matter their community or the color of their skin, deserve equal treatment under the law," Governor Whitmer said in a press release. "This proposal will help us ensure that law enforcement officials treat all Michiganders with humanity and respect, and will help us

keep our communities safe. I will continue working with leaders in law enforcement to make public safety more just and equitable in Michigan."

Whitmer also wants to take a few more steps in reforming policing and make departments "more empathetic."

- Provide incentive programs for law enforceagencies hire/retain officers who live where they work.
- · Require retention of disciplinary records resulting from violations of law or improper use of force.

In the past, the Hamtramck Police Department has come under criticism and even lawsuits accusing some officers of harassing minorities.

A few months ago, City Manager Kathy Angerer hired a liaison between the department and the public, former Police Chief Max Garbarino.

His new title is now Director of Community Safety and Services, Garbarino said he approved

of Whitmer's proposals.

"We are heading in a good direction as a state," Garbarino said. "I especially like that the governor is taking advice from both professional law enforcement and civil rights specialists. should provide a well-balanced direction for improvement."







