Matt Wyszczelski is Hamtramck's new fire chief. He rose up through the ranks, over the past two dozen years, to the position he now holds. In an email interview with The Review, Wyszczelski shared his thoughts about his new role.

The Review: Can you describe your road to the position of fire chief any prior experience outside of Hamtramck; how and when you first came to be with this unit; etc.

Wyszczelski: I started my firefighting career, in 1996, as a firefighter for the City of Atlanta. I was hired by the City of Hamtramck as a firefighter in 1998.

Since then, I was promoted to motor engineer is 2007, to lieutenant in 2012, to captain in 2019 and, most recently, to chief this May.

big thing I bring to the job as fire chief is that I came directly from the floor to the chief's office.

What this means is that, up until I became chief, I was a captain, riding the rig and responding to fires with the crews. This allows me to see things now from both perspectives: what is happening in the field, and with the administrative side of things.

The Review: What are

homes, language barriers? I'm guessing here.

Wyszczelski: Hamtramck's narrow streets and closely spaced houses offer many challenges when it comes to firefighting. We must use aggressive firefighting tactics, which we have developed and honed over the years, to prevent the fires from spreading between homes.

The Hamtramck Fire Department seeks to be proactive, and we take every opportunity to get out and do pre-incident surveys to learn the buildings, and what hazards they may pose within our community.

Some of our streets are narrow, but we have an extensive driver training program that our firefighters must pass in order to be certified to operate our rigs.

do the city's fire hydrants ratus. Our engines are get checked for functionality? How many does the city have, anyway? Wyszczelski: The city has approximately 500 fire hydrants. The fire

department checks all hydrants annually, in the fall, and makes sure that they are dry so as to prevent freezing. Throughout the year, we work closely with the DPS to make sure that any damaged or out-of-service hydrants are repaired or replaced.

The **Review:** What would be on your wish list for the department if money were no object?

Wyszczelski: If money were no object, I would ask for increased manpower. Most studies conducted point to the fact that the more manpower you have on scene early in the fire, the better the outcome.

This is due to the fact that more fireground operations, like extinguishment, ventilation and search and rescue, can occur simultaneously.

Secondly, I would like The Review: How often to update our fire appaaging, and in need of replacement, (so new engines) would reduce our overall repair bills and out-of-service time.

at housing projects

Hamtramck police are seeking information about a double homicide that was discovered on Tuesday.

According to the department, a 25-year-old Hamtramck man and a 24-year-old Detroit woman were found dead from a shooting at the Hamtramck Housing Commission at about 9 p.m.

Multiple shell casings were found at the site, suggesting the weapon used was an automatic gun.

The commission is located off the southbound service drive of I-75. The shooting occurred in the back of the housing complex on Oklahoma St.

Police are seeking two black male suspects who fled in a silver or gray newer model Dodge Durango. The housing commission has numerous security cameras. Police declined to comment on a possible motive for the shootings, and stress that this is an ongoing investigation. "At this time, police believe this was not a random incident," said Police chief Anne Moise in a press release. Anyone with information about the matter is asked to call (313) 800-5280. The deaths mark the first two homicides of the year in Hamtramck. The city averages anywhere from two to four homicides each year. In 2020, there were two separate homicides at the Col. Hamtramck Housing project.

The theme of the event, Blasey said, was a celebration of LGBTO rights.

Also in June, a picnic will be held in the Sarah Garrett Park in honor of Juneteenth.

Greg Kirchner gave an update on a community television program that is in the works. He said some technical issues have been worked on, and that a production studio is built.

The station will be at the Hamtramck Public Library.

"The library is becoming a central hub of info," he said.

Wyszczelski Matthew was appointed as the city's new fire chief. He has been with the Hamtramck Fire Department since 1998.

Wyszczelski said his job will be "to lead the department into the future."

The council approved accepting a state grant for \$100,000 for training firefighters and police officers.

Hamtramck was among over 400 statewide municipalities that received this award.

The council approved a development agreement with Abubakr Abbas, who is going to build a housing unit at 2442 Andrus St.

Abbas is purchasing a city-owned lot for the project.

The purchase price for city lots is \$10,500. In a note to council, it was said:

"This sale is part of the City of Hamtramck Vacant Lot program and, if approved, this is the seventh lot sold this spring. This reflects a significant amount of funds going to our pension obligation."

In another housing development deal, it was announced that Wayne County has agreed to fund the building of three houses.

That deal will finally close a housing lawsuit filed against the city in the 1970s. In a note to council, it was said: "The City Manager has

requested funding from Wayne County for the completion of the last three homes for the Sarah Garrett lawsuit.

"Previously, Wayne County agreed to allocate funding, however the funding would not be enough to complete all three homes. The NSP subrecipient agreement identified three lots (12085 Gallagher, 5048 Prescott, and 5191 Yemans) for the construction of homes for sale or rental to low-to-moderate income families.

"All three lots were acquired from the Michigan Land Bank Authority. This amendment adds additional funding from Wayne County NSP, to bring total funding to \$950,000, which will cover the cost of constructing the three houses by December 31, 2023. The City of Hamtramck must expend 50% of these funds by July 1, 2023, and 100% by December 31, 2023, with all work completed by that date."

City Manager Kathy Angerer said "This will be a point of celebration."

Make it two exiting City hall

City Manager Kathy Angerer isn't the only leaving city hall.

City Attorney James Allen announced last week that he is also resigning.

Allen is part of the lawfirm Allen Brothers law firm.

He has been city attorney for several years. In his resignation letter, Allen cited a number of reasons for his departure – primarily, blaming the coarse nature of local and state politics.

"The absolutely nasty political climate that certain loud, uninformed and uneducable 'professional citizens' and activists have made public service already a thankless task miserable," Allen said.

"It seems that the general cultural and political malaise of our time has had a particularly adverse impact on local politics."

Allen also lashed out at critics of both the ad-

ministration and himself of who use social media to spread falsehoods.

"For years we've grown accustomed to being beaten up at public meetings where people had to at least put in the effort to appear and speak their crazy conspiracies where they could be addressed," he said.

"In the age of social media, they can spread lies and half-truths from the comfort of their recliners – all with impunity and at the cost of our reputations and the esteem of

f our peers.

"At some point, the cumulative effect of that sort of nasty behavior has made it impossible to enjoy any form of job satisfaction or work-life balance."

Allen also lashed out at the courts for their role in making it more difficult for local government bodies to operate.

"As I have stated on numerous occasions, much of the public frustration with government's general inability to solve problems is focused on local government because local government has the lowest barrier to participation," Allen said.

"Instead of raising those barriers to an appropriate level so that government can function, our judicial system has treated local units of government in a punitive fashion."

The hostile environment, he said, has made him decide to resign from public service.

"I will leave to the next generation of public servants the difficult responsibilities of responsible local governance. Perhaps those entering this brave new world will be better equipped than me to navigate through the shark-infested waters of public life," Allen said. For years, some city officials and residents have claimed that the city's legal fees are inflated, and that the city should instead hire a full-time inhouse city attorney.

But years ago, when the city had two attorneys on staff, many of the legal matters were still hired out to private firms.


Allen has defended his fees in the past, and blamed rising costs for the city on so many people filing lawsuits – which require the city to respond.

A few months ago, Allen came under criticism for his handling of a handicapped man who had been filing a series of Freedom of Information Act requests, and making accusations.

In a series of email exchanges Allen made fun of the man's handicap. Allen later apologized for his language. That matter quickly faded, but it appeared to have affected Allen.

City Manager Angerer's last day is July 15. Allen said he is leaving in August.

It will now be up to the interim city manager and the city council to find new legal services.



The Review: Some residents may not realize that your duties often go beyond just putting out fires. Can you describe some of your other duties?

Wyszczelski: The Hamtramck Fire Department does more than just put out fires; our daily schedule includes truck and equipment maintenance, daily training, house chores, fire prevention activities, and community events, in addition to responding to emergencies.

The Review: Have you ever been involved in any memorable incidents here in the city that you'd care to recount?

Wyszczelski: I have worked most of the largescale fires that have occurred in our city during my career. Some stand out, like the Mother Waddles fire in 2005, (in that case) due to the length we were on scene and the freezing temperatures.

There were also the fires at Sterling Services, Polish Market, and A&R packing, which required the majority of the department to respond, who were there for most of the day working to extinguish the fire.

The Review: How much do you have to be involved with other aspects of the department, such as the financial end, or the ceremonial part, for example?

Wyszczelski: The fire chief is involved with most aspects of the department's operation. I set policy and procedure, supervise department personnel, help establish and manage the department's budget, and act as the public face of the fire department, as well as respond to emergencies.

The Review: Feel free to mention anything else that you care to, at this point.

Wyszczelski: I feel that we have one of the best fire departments around, and my job as chief will be to pass on my knowledge and experience to the next generation of officers, and to keep the Hamtramck Fire Department on the path to continued success.

The Review: Thank you so much for taking time out of your day to enlighten us with these responses.

Covid: still 'shapeshifting' into new variants

By Charles Sercombe Some 20 new Covid-19 cases were reported last week in Hamtramck, according to Wayne County health officials.

That's down slightly from previous weeks, but there is no telling with this virus: the number of new cases can go down for a period of time, but then rise just as unexpectedly again over the next several weeks.

BBC Digital Health Editor Michelle Roberts described the virus this way: "Ever since it first emerged, Covid has been mutating or shape-shifting."

The newest variants – BA.4 and BA.5 – have health officials particularly concerned because they are even more infectious than previous ones.

The total number of covid cases reported in Hamtramck for the past two years, since the pandemic started, is now 5,142, with the total number of deaths remaining steady at 74.

That number of local cases represents 17 percent of the city's population of almost 30,000 people.

Health officials still recommend masking up in public, keeping a distance from others and washing your hands often. As mentioned here previously, those recommendations have been largely ignored in the metro area where people congregate in large numbers at entertainment and sports venues.

Vaccinations and boosters are also recommended, and vaccinations are now available for youngsters 6 months old and up.


