#### City council wrestles with a tax abatement proposal for Missant site

City council appears to be stumped on whether to grant tax abatement to a company that wants to develop the former Missant site.

The owner of the site, 8801 Conant Holdings, LCC, is seeking a 10-year tax abatement for the Conant property, which is located just north of the county jail.

The abatement is asking for a property tax freeze, as opposed to the usual 50-percent reduction in taxes. Currently, the company pays \$60,000 a year in property taxes, of which

41-minute mark.

At last week's council meeting, during public comment, Latrello Sephers, an African-American, took issue with comments by the mayor and also by community activist Bill Meyer, who both said the next city manager does not have to be a white person.

"To flat out to say you won't hire a white person, or say a black, or whatever, that is racist," Sephers

Neither the mayor nor the city council said they "won't" hire a white city manager candidate.

Sephers also admonished the council, saying that they should be "ashamed" if they agree with the statements by Ghalib and Meyer.

The mayor defended his comment, saying that The Review got the story wrong.

Ghalib said, at the last council meeting, that his comment was in regard to "Some people here suggested that to maintain diversity, we should hire a white city manager."

He declined to identify who said that to him.

That explanation came after the Aug. 19 Review article in question was published.

Also, that explanation was not given at the June 28 council meeting when he made the quote in question.

He further criticized The Review, calling it "not authentic" and "fake news." He also said that he does not read The Review.

The Review asked Ghalib to show where in the June 28 meeting he had provided that context or that specific question. explanation for his com-

He did not provide that information, but in an email response to The Review asking for clarification, he at first questioned whether he had made the comment in the center of this controversy.

Here is his full response: "And where did I say that he cannot be white?! Where did you get that from?

(Editor's note: The Review did not report that the mayor said the next city manager "cannot be white.")

"When Mr. Choudhury was reading the qualifications of the city manager from the charter, I believe during his report, I said to him, it didn't say that the city manager has to be white?

"I was being sarcastic to send a message to the ones who suggested that he/she must be white? And they got my message, and I don't want to mention no names here.

"It's obvious that I was referring to the fact that the city manager can be anything, white, black, Arab, Bangali, as long as he/she is qualified, and that he doesn't have to be white.

"I do believe that you owe me an apology! And it should be on the first

"It's unethical to deliver the wrong message to the community for the sake of dividing and destabilizing it! There is still a chance for fixing the problem."

The Review has continued to ask the mayor to show where he had provided context to his comment in that June 28 meeting.



During the past week (as of Monday), there were 44 new covid cases in Hamtramck, according to Wayne County health officials.

The number of new covid cases for the past weeks have several ranged between 30-50. The total number of Hamtramck cases for the past two years, since when the pandemic started, now total, 5,431.

That represents about 18 percent of the city's total population.

While there appears to be hope that the trend of decreasing cases will continue, health officials still advise people to mask up while out in public.





Despite objections, Refai's proposal to reduce the abatement period down to six years was approved by two other councilmembers Adam Albarmaki.

Jaczkowski and Choudhury were in opposition.

City Attorney James Allen, who has since resigned from that position, said that approving the original abatement request "sends a signal" to other developers to invest in the city.

He reminded the council that past city officials were under pressure from the community to seek development to expand the city's tax base.

Allen said the company had already negotiated terms with the city but to now, all of a sudden, change those terms "is not a good message to send."

He also warned that once the proposal was made public, "Facebook warriors" went to work to disparage the deal.

One of the leading critics of the development is Nasr Hussain, the owner of a print shop in Hamtramck.

He said that, instead of allowing a tax break, the city could market the site to a housing developer. He said the site is a good

location, and that the city should not let the develop-

ers "scare you." Allen pointed out that this site has serious envi-

ronmental issues. The Olsonite Company once manufactured plastic toilet seats and other plastic parts for the automotive indsutry at this site. There is evidence that there is ground contamination in parts of the site.

Refai justified his proposal by saying that, if the developer backs out, the city can still collect the current property taxes.

So where does the issue

At last week's city council meeting, the agenda included the original 10year abatement proposal as well as Refai's modified proposal.

Councilmembers Jaczkowski and Albarmaki were absent. The councilmembers in attendance decided to remove the item from the agenda without comment as to why.

The matter will be on the agenda for the next city council meeting, which will be Sept. 13.
