New election law expands voters' rights

Michigan voters now have expanded rights and services, thanks to a package of legislative bills signed into law this week.

On Tuesday, Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's office announced a number of changes into election law, and they include:

Creating a website to track voter ballots. It will ensure voters are notified when their vote is received and counted, and inform them if there are any errors and, if there are, offer a solution to remedy them.

There is now at least nine days of early voting before each statewide and federal election, so people can find a convenient time to vote that works for them without facing lines on Election Day. This also authorizes pre-processing and early tabulation of absentee ballots, ensuring a timely result after polls close on Election Day.

Voters can now fix clerical errors with their ballots. This also requires prepaid postage for all absentee ballot applications and envelopes, saving voters time and trips to the Post Office.

For now, Jos. Campau flagpoles will only fly the American flag

Not only has the city removed a pride flag – along with two other flags – from the Jos. Campau flagpoles, now all of the international flags have been replaced.

Instead of seeing all the flags that represent the many countries from where residents come from, there is only one kind now: the American flag.

This is the latest chapter in an ongoing debate on what flags are appropriate to display on the city's 18 Jos. Campau flagpoles and on public property.

A huge flap arose when a pride flag was raised on one pole last year, and the mayor and city council recently took action to prevent that from happening.

They were prompted by some in the community who were offended by the pride flag – an issue that has polarized a number of communities.

Hamtramck's population majority is now made up of socially conservative Muslims, who view the flag as promoting values

they consider sinful.

The pride flag represents the LGBTQ community, and those in favor of it say it represents acceptance and recognition of a segment of the community.

The issue resulted in the council passing a resolution banning all flags being displayed on public property except: the American, state, city, and prisoner of war flags, along with flags that represent

countries where the city's immigrants come from.

The council took this action, they said, in order to remain "neutral" and not have to be forced to display flags such as ones for the confederacy or the Nazis.

That action resulted in an immediate backlash from critics, and also attracted state, national and international media attention that is still ongoing.

Michigan Attorney Gen-

eral Dana Nessel even weighed in, saying the city's ban on pride flags made the city a "national embarrassment."

Nessel, who is openly gay, implored the city to rescind its resolution.

Others say that, by claiming to be neutral, it only leads to discrimination.

At a recent pro-pride rally held in Hamtramck, the Rev. Roland Stringfellow

State Rep. says big bucks coming to city

For the past few weeks, State Rep. Abraham Aiyash (D-Hamtramck) has hinted at a financial windfall coming to Hamtramck.

And by big, he said state funding will be to the tune of millions of dollars.

In a June 29 posting on Facebook, he said that day was a "historic" moment for Detroit and Hamtramck, as the state legislature was wrapping up a budget.

"We secured tens of millions of dollars in funding for our schools, infrastructure, for revenue sharing and this will be a very historic budget that the governor will be signing soon," he said.

In about a two-minute message he recorded while in a budget session in Lansing, he added:

"Hamtramck and Detroit are set to get a whole lot of money to start fixing the problems that have plagued (these) communities for so long."

Hamtramck has no shortage of needs, with the greatest being then updating of its sewer service. The city has suffered from widespread flooding in basements because of the current sewer system configuration.

The estimated cost to fix the flooding problem (caused by the sewer system being over loaded during heavy rains) is about \$50 million. Hamtramck has already taken some initial steps toward fixing the problem, thanks to various grants.

The city is under a court settlement agreement to fix the problem, but there has been no funding source offered.

Aiyash addressed the big news again on July 14 with another Facebook posting, saying:

"I am proud to have lead

(who also said that he, too, is gay), said: “That’s not ‘neutral,’ that’s taking sides, and it gives people a license to be hateful towards other folks.” The issue took another turn a couple of weeks ago, when the chairman of the city’s Human Relations Commission, Russ Gordon, raised a pride flag on a Jos. Campau flagpole in defiance of the city council’s resolution banning such flags. That flag was subsequently removed within two-and-a-half-hours, and Gordon was later fired from the commission by the city council. Also at that flag raising was Human Relations Commission member Catrina Stackpoole, who was also removed from the commission. Removed along with the pride flag were the Cherokee Nation flag and the

Pan-African flag.

As for why the international flags were taken down this week, City Manager Max Garbarino said that they belong to Gordon, and that the mayor and council “just want the American (flag) for now. ... (It) seemed like an easy temporary solution.” Garbarino said the city purchased the American flags.

the negotiation to secure one of the largest infrastructure investments in Hamtramck’s history.” Aiyash went to say that this is the first time in 40 years “Michigan’s budget finally addresses some of the state’s biggest challenges caused by decades of detrimental under-funding.” The 40-year reference is to this being the first time in 40 years that Democrats control both the legislature and occupy the governor’s office. Aiyash ended that Facebook post with the tease: “Stay tuned for more announcements in the coming weeks,” Aiyash is the city’s first Yemeni-American voted into the legislature, and is the state’s first Arab-American to be appointed as Majority Floor Leader. The Review reached out for more details, and Aiyash said he would get back. As of Thursday, the day The Review went to press, there had been no follow-up. In the meantime, not everyone welcomed the good news. Aiyash has been getting backlash from some in the local Yemeni community for co-sponsoring a bill to include LGBTQ civil rights protection in the state’s Elliot-Larson Civil Rights Act. Commenting on Aiyash’s recent Facebook posts about the financial news, a person who goes by the name of Fares Al-halemi said: “He thinks that he can buy our votes and trust by getting more infrastructure budget for the city, but he forgot that humanity comes first. Nothing worth risking our kids future.” He added: “I can’t vote for him again and trust him for our kids future.” Stephanie Butler of Dearborn, who has been leading a crusade against LGBTQ literature in schools, and is an opponent to having a pride flag on city flagpoles, also weighed in: “Once a traitor, always a traitor!!!” Aiyash has not spoken publicly about the mayor and city council banning the display of pride flags on city property. In the meantime, Aiyash is hosting a “coffee hour” this Saturday, July 22, at Kitab Café (2727 Holbrook) this Saturday, July 22 from 9 to 11 a.m. The event is open to the public.

City council committee formed to look into property tax hike

City officials have heard your concerns and complaints about the recent property tax bills.

This summer's tax bills include a court-ordered judgment for three legal issues that add on another 4.5 tax mills.

For some, that one-time hit could cost homeowners a few hundred to a few thousand extra this summer.

At last week's city council meeting, a few residents spoke out in frustration.

"This is not stable, not normal," said Michelle Cameron about her \$300 increase.

Cameron is a plaintiff in a housing discrimination lawsuit filed against the city decades ago, and she was able to purchase one of the 200 housing units built to settle the issue.

She questioned whether the plaintiffs were being singled out with the tax increase.

"Are all the homeowners getting the same treatment, or are there any differences ... with the plaintiffs in the Gar-

rett case? Are we getting hit harder?" Cameron questioned.

Cameron was referring to the housing discrimination named after its lead plaintiff, Sarah Sims Garrett.

The court judgment is for the following:

- Legal fees for the Sarah Garrett housing discrimination lawsuit.
- Settlement in a lawsuit over sewer flooding that caused home damages.
- Settlement for a police brutality case.

Cameron also had another question:

"Why do the taxes go up every year when the values of our houses are going down?"

By state law, Michigan property taxes can go up either by 5 percent or the rate of inflation, whichever is less.

As for her claim that housing values are going down, Hamtramck's values actually continue to increase wildly – according to yearly sales reports.

An unidentified man, who said he spoke for several others as well as

for himself, said there is "no reason" for the tax increase because the roads are in bad shape and "not enough money is going into our schools, many of alleys are disgusting and scary and unpaved, and there's still lead issues in our water. ..."

Ultimately, he said, the city is "chasing out" homeowners.

But Konrad Maziarz, the city's Assistant Assessor, said the city has to follow state law in updating housing values and passing on yearly tax increases.

"We have to follow state rules, and that's what we're doing," he said.

Maziarz noted that housing values increased greatly in the last 5-6 years, with houses that cost \$60,000 back then now going for \$180,000.

And, for houses that cost \$90,000 to \$100,000 five or six years ago, he said, those houses now sell for over \$300,000.

When new owners purchase a house, their taxes are then based on 50-percent of the cash value of that house, according to state law.

"Those numbers are what is causing us to raise the assessments," Maziarz said.

And if the city refuses

to make that adjustment, Maziarz said the county or the state would step in and do it, and that that action "would threaten my license" as well as the ability of the Assessor's Office "to do our job."

Maziarz also pointed out that the average taxable value for a house in Hamtramck is about \$30,000. But if you purchased a house for \$300,000, which some Hamtramck properties are now fetching, your tax bill is going to be much bigger than a lot of other homeowners.

Still, having heard that explanation, Councilmember Nayeem Choudhury, who is seeking re-election, insisted that "there's got to be something done, they (homeowners) can't afford it. The city is poor."

Mayor Amer Ghalib also said he is frustrated by the increases.

"We noticed there is an issue, and we have to figure out what it is," he said.

The council then agreed to form a sub-committee, with Councilmembers Choudhury, Khalil Refai and Mohammed Hassan as members, to look into the matter.

US passport, tribal photo ID card, military ID card, or student ID to identify yourself when you show up to vote. There will now be at least one secure drop box for every municipality, or at least one drop box for every 15,000 registered voters in municipalities with more than that many regis-

tered voters. These drop boxes will be used to return absentee ballots safely and securely, and must be accessible 24-hours-a-day 40 days before an election and until 8 p.m. on Election Day. There is now an increase in the maximum size of an election precinct, from 2,999 active registered electors to 5,000, lowering costs for local governments.

Hamtramck’s ongoing culture war is taking a toll on the city

It’s pretty obvious that Hamtramck is in a culture war – a war that has been brewing for months.

First, it was about whether the city should allow marijuana dispensaries, or the slaughter of animals in public, and now it’s about LGBTQ rights. These disputes pit the city’s socially conservative Muslim population against politically progressive-minded residents and their supporters.

This division has attracted the attention of local, state, national and international media – and, mostly, not in a good way. That is to say: Hamtramck looks like a bigoted, backwater town.

It doesn’t help that we have a mayor claiming that former city officials on the other side of the issue have the power to bring in the state attorney general to weigh in on the pride flag matter, and also influence other state officials.

Mayor Amer Ghalib is calling them a “militia,” which usually refers to a civilian armed military force that, in some instances, engages in rebellion or even terrorism.

That is some serious paranoid thinking

Attorney General Dana Nessel, who is gay, was offended when the city council voted to ban the display of pride flags on public property. She spoke at a price rally in Hamtramck recently, and called the city a “national embarrassment.”

Does the mayor seriously think that Nessel was prompted by former local officials to attend a pro-LGBTQ rally? The city council’s action on pride flags, with the mayor’s blessing, outraged many folks both in and out of the LGBTQ community.

Hamtramck does not exist in a vacuum.

Way to go, Hamtramck. The actions of local elected officials will only serve to alienate influential state government officials.

It appears to us that Hamtramck is trying to retreat from the modern world.

Hamtramck has long enjoyed a reputation of being a fun, culturally diverse city in the state – a microcosm of the world at large. It is now increasingly becoming a laughing stock.

We wish folks could take a breather and step back, but it appears the culture war here is only going to get worse – and Hamtramck residents will end up paying for it in one way or another.

Crime Watch... When it comes to bicycles, lock’em up right

Bike theft isn’t the biggest crime trend in Hamtramck, but there is always an uptick in warmer months.

And, depending on the bike, it can be a costly loss. Some bikes carry a price tag of several hundred dollars and up. For some people, pedal power is their main – or only – mode of transportation.

According to recent surveys by the U.S. Department of Transportation, bicycling in the U.S. has become increasingly popular, with many cities, including Hamtramck, creating bike lanes on their busy roads to accommodate the demand for safer streets for bikes.

Still, not everyone in Hamtramck is pleased with sharing the road with bicyclists, and if some city council candidates had their way, the bike lanes would be gone or moved to side streets.

Last week, there were several bike thefts reported. Fortunately, there are ways to lessen the chance of having your bike stolen. The folks at the University of Ottawa offer these suggestions:

Always lock your bike with two quality locks; use a U-lock and a cable lock.

Using the U-lock, lock the frame of your bike to the bicycle rack and then, with a long cable lock, intertwine the cable lock around the bike frame, wheels and bike rack.

By using more than one style of lock, it will take thieves two types of tools and twice as much time to steal your bike.

If possible, also remove the seat of your bike. Without a bike seat, thieves won’t be able to make a quick escape and ride away on your bike.

Remove all quick release items and bring them with you.

As proof of purchase in case of theft, save your receipt and serial number; also, take a picture of your bike. If your bike

What is a Sinking Fund?

- 

A Sinking Fund is a savings account into which a local school district can deposit voter-approved local millage revenue to pay cash for projects or building repairs.
- 

A Sinking Fund millage is a limited property tax, considered a “pay-as-you-go” method for funding building maintenance and infrastructure projects. No debt or interest expense is incurred with a Sinking Fund.

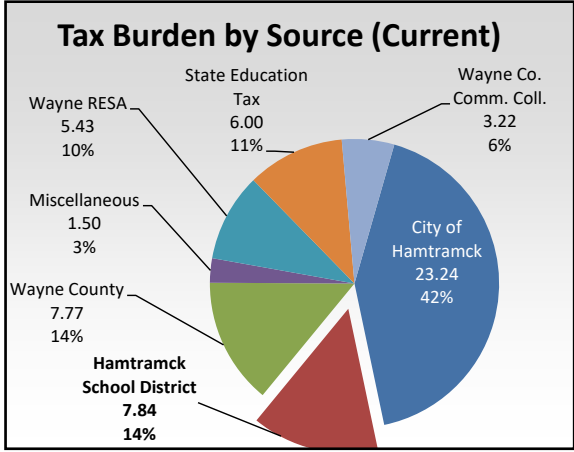

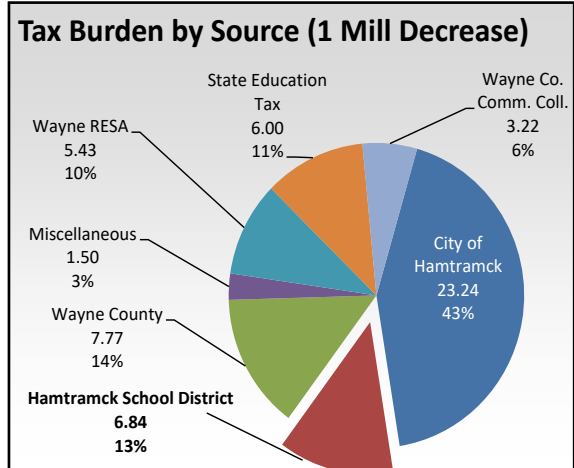

is stolen and then recovered, the process of returning it to you will be easier.

Personalize your bike (with stickers, for example) so it's less attractive to thieves.

Keep an eye out for suspicious or unusual activity, and call 911 if you see it.


Never leave your bike unlocked or unattended, even for "just a minute." It only takes a minute to steal a locked bike; unlocked bikes are irresistible to opportunistic thieves.

Never lock your bike by the front wheel only. It will be too easy to steal.
